THE INDIAN TELEGRAPH ACT, 1885.

Rules.

THE TELEGRAPH RULES, No. 2, of 1922.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Telegraph Rules, No. 2, of 1922", and shall come into force on the 1st of January, 1923.
- The charges for Radio Telegrams tendered for transmission in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya shall be as follows:—
 - Rate per word. (i) To ships at sea from all S. C. Telegraph Offices except Kismayu transmitted via Mombasa Radio ... 10 (ii) To ships at sea from Kismayu 25transmitted via Kismayu Radio ... (iii) To ships at sea from all Telegraph Offices except Kismayu transmitted via Kismayu Radio and 75 from Kismayu via Mombasa Radio (iv) To or from Kismayu from or to all Telegraph Offices in Kenya and Uganda (Plain language) 35 (Code)
- The charge for cablegrams tendered transmission at Kismayu shall be the ordinary public charge for the country of destination, plus a supplementary charge of S. 1 C. 20 per word (Coast Charges).
- 4. The Postmaster General may make such supplementary charge as he may consider sufficient to cover any additional payment, over and above the ordinary tariff per word, to any Ship Station requiring payment of a minimum amount in respect of each Radio Telegram transmitted to such
