## THE EAST AFRICA POLICE ORDINANCE, 1911.

#### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 79 of the East Africa Police Ordinance, 1911, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation apply the aforesaid section to any place.

Now therefore, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor's Deputy, Colony and Protectorate of Kenys, do hereby order and proclaim that the aforesaid section shall apply to and have effect within the limits of an area comprised within a circle having a radius of one mile with the office of the Railway Magistrate at Sabatia, Ravine District as centre.

### THE GAME ORDINANCE, 1921.

### PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by Section 7 of the Game Ordinance, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council hereby declares that on and after this date the number of Buffalo in the Third Schedule of the said Ordinance shall be limited to 10 Buffalo (Males) except in the following areas that is to say:—

(a) The rectangular area bounded by Lake Baringo, Lake Solai and the top of the Laikipia Escarpment and more particularly described as follows:—

'Commencing at the Trigonometrical Beacon A2 Laikipia; thence bounded by the top of the Laikipia Escarpment to the Trigonometrical Beacon Matmanet; thence by the Eastern top of that Escarpment through the points 8140, 7775, 6566 across the Ol Arabel River to the Trigonometrical Beacon Ngelesha South (7457); thence by the top of the Escarpment Northerly to the Ol Mukatan River; thence by a straight line due West to the shore of Baringo Lake; thence by that shore Southerly to the Ol Arabel River; thence by that River up-stream to its intersection with the Baringo Road; thence by that Road Southerly to Lake Hannington; thence by the Eastern shore of that Lake to its most Southerly point; thence by a straight line Southerly to the most Northerly point of Lake Solai; thence by a straight line Easterly to the point of commencement.'' (Reference E.A.P. Map "Baringo" North A/87/S.).

(b) The area bounded by the Fort Hall Road, Maragua, Tana and Thika Rivers and more particularly described as follows:—

"Commencing at the intersection of the Thika River with the Fort Hall Road; thence bounded by that Road Northerly to its intersection with the Maragua River; thence by that River down-stream to its junction with the Tana River; thence by that River down-stream to its junction with the Thika River; thence by the latter River up-stream to the point of commencement."

## THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

#### RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Eldama Ravine Township (Vehicles) Rules, 1922."

#### DEFINITIONS.

2. For the purposes of these Rules the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them:—

"Vehicle" shall mean any conveyance, for the carriage of persons or goods, however drawn, propelled, or kept or set in motion but shall not include a cycle.

"Cycle" shall mean any bicycle or tricycle but shall not include motor cycles.

#### LAMPS.

- 3. After the hour of 6-15 p.m. and until 6 a.m., Railway time, every vehicle standing in or proceeding along a public road, public place or thoroughfare, and every cycle ridden along a public road, public place or thoroughfare, shall be provided with a lighted lamp or lamps so placed as to throw the light in the direction in which the vehicle or cycle is proceeding and giving a light equal to not less than one candle power per lamp. Such lamp or one of such lamps shall be held or fixed and kept upon the off or right-hand side of such vehicle except in the case of a cycle.
- 4. Every vehicle used for freight or merchandise or for carrying timber shall be provided with a tail lamp in addition to a lamp in front, and so placed as to throw the light backwards.
- 5. Every person being in charge of a vehicle or cycle or being conveyed in or on any vehicle not provided with a lamp or on which a lamp shall not be held or fixed and kept as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence.

### Driving.

- 6. An owner of a vehicle whether drawn by animals or propelled by hand or by machinery shall not suffer the same to be in use within the Township otherwise than in charge of a proper and responsible person or persons.
- 7. Every person driving or being in charge of any vehicle or cycle proceeding along any public road shall, when practicable, keep such vehicle or cycle to the left or near side of the road, and shall when passing any vehicle or cycle going in the same direction, cause the vehicle or cycle which he is driving or of which he is in charge to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle or cycle he is passing, and shall permit a vehicle or cycle going in the opposite direction to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle or cycle of which he is in charge.
- 8. When loading or unloading a vehicle in a street the person in charge of such vehicle shall rest it parallel with the footpath and immediately on the edge of the carriage way or, if there is no footpath then parallel with and on the extreme edge of the street.
- 9. The use of nose ropes and nose rings for oxen and the beating of oxen otherwise than with whips or thongs made of leather and not exceeding one inch in width is prohibited.

The owner and person or persons in charge of any ox found fitted with a nose rope or being beaten otherwise than with a whip or thong as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence. 10. Vehicles drawn by two or more oxen shall be in charge of two persons one of whom shall lead the oxen from the front of the leading ox or oxen. The owner and the person or persons in charge of any vehicle found driven otherwise than in accordance with the terms of this rule shall each severally be guilty of an offence.

11. The driver or person in charge of any animal or animals, or of any vehicle shall not permit such animal, animals or vehicle to collide with or damage any drain, culvert, bridge, fence, gate, lamp post or any other property of the Government and in every case where any such damages shall have been done or any such collision shall have occurred the driver or person in charge of the animal, animals or vehicle shall be guilty of an offence, and the owner of the animal, animals or vehicle by which any such imposed damage as aforesaid shall have been done shall, in addition to any fine imposed, pay to the District Commissioner the amount of the damage.

12. No person shall lead, ride or drive any horse or mule, donkey or ox or allow any such animal to remain on any pathway, public place or thoroughfare that shall have been reserved by the Governor for the use of foot passengers only, and no person shall drive or propel any vehicle or allow any such vehicle to remain on any pathway, public place or thoroughfare so reserved.

13. The driver or person in charge of any vehicle shall not drive or propel such vehicle over any stone drain except over a proper bridge or culvert.

#### PENALTIES.

14. Any person who shall contravene or fail to comply with any of the provisions of or shall be guilty of an offence against any of these Rules shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Sh 400/- and in default of payment to imprisonment of either kind for a period not exceeding two months.

15. Offences against any of the following Rules, viz: -3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 shall be cognizable by the Police.
