THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898,

AND

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCES OF 1919 AND 1921.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and the Post Office (Amendment) Ordinances, 1919 and 1921, and all other powers him thereunto enabling, the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Money Order and Postal Order Rules (No. 2), 1922," and shall be read as one with "The Foreign Postal and Money Order Rules (No. 2), 1920," hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules" and shall come into effect on the 1st day of January, 1923.

2. The suspension prescribed by Rule 2 of the Principal Rules, published in the Special "Official Gazette" of February 21st, 1920, is hereby raised in respect of the Belgian Congo, and all Rules heretofore made pursuant to the provisions of the said Act and Ordinance, or howsoever otherwise, so far as applicable, relating to the issue by the Post Office of Foreign Money Orders shall be in full force and operation in respect of such Territory as from the aforementioned date.

THE INDIAN TELEGRAPH ACT, 1885.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Telegraph Act, 1885, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Telegraph Rules (No. 3), 1922," and shall come into force on the 1st of January, 1923.

2. Reuter's News Telegrams forwarded by Reuter's Agency at Mombasa to Reuter's Agency and Newspapers and Clubs at Nairobi, or at any other place served by the Inland Telegraph system to which Reuter's News service may be extended with the consent of the Postmaster General, shall be transmitted at the rate of three shillings for the first hundred words or part thereof and seventy-five cents for each additional twenty-five words, or part thereof, for every copy delivered: Provided that where more than one copy of the same telegram is delivered from the same Telegraph Office either to Reuter's Agency or to a Newspaper or Newspapers or to a Club or Clubs the charge shall be at the rate of seventy-five cents per hundred words, or part thereof, for every copy beyond the first.

3. The Telegraph Rules, 1916, dated the 15th February, 1916, are hereby cancelled.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS
ORDINANCE, 1909.

BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have made the following Bye-laws:—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Nairobi (Trade Licence Fees) Bye-laws, 1923," and shall come into force on 1st January, 1923, and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Township Rules, 1917, (hereinafter called "the Principal Bye-laws)."

2. Bye-law 341 of the Principal Bye-laws, as amended by the Nairobi (Verandah Trading) Bye-laws, 1922, is hereby further amended by substituting the word "shillings" for the word "rupees" wherever it occurs and further by adding thereto the following clause:—

"Provided further that the fee in respect of a licence for a shop or duka occupied by a native shall be Shs. 2 cents 50 per annum. For the purposes of this Bye-law "Native" means a native of Africa not being of European or Asiatic origin and includes Somalis, Swahilis and Arabs."

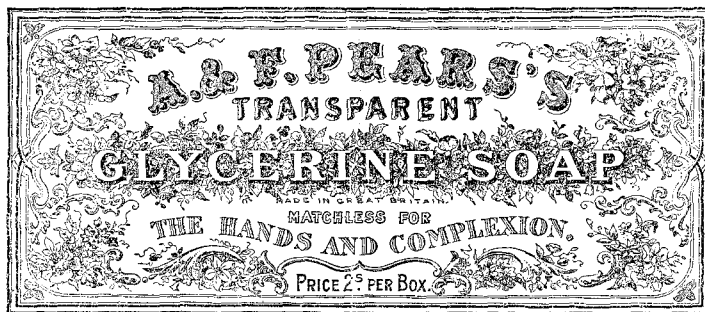
