## BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have made the following Bye-laws:—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi (Burial Grounds) Bye-laws, 1923," and shall be read as one with Nairobi Township Rules of 1917.

2. No person shall dig any grave or cause or permit any interment to take place in any grave in any area of ground reserved for purposes of a burial ground otherwise than in accordance with any plan for the layout of graves in such burial ground which may be prescribed by the Municipal Council as the approved plan of such burial ground. The Municipal Council may enter upon any burial ground and mark off areas for graves in accordance with any plan so prescribed, and no person shall interfere with or remove any marks so placed.

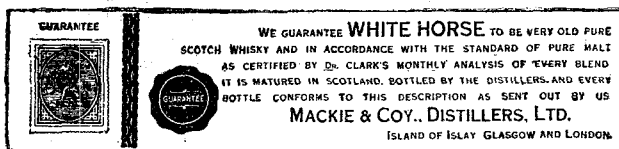
