THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.

RULES.

**MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS
ORDINANCE, 1922.**

BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor-in-Council have made the following Bye-laws.

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi Township (Fire Brigade) Bye-laws, 1923," and shall be read together with Nairobi Township Rules of 1917.
2. There shall be established a Fire Brigade in Nairobi, for the prevention and extinction of fires in the Township, under the control of the Municipal Council which shall have power to delegate its authority under these Bye-laws to any committee of its own members duly appointed.
3. The Brigade shall consist of an establishment of two officers, viz: Firemaster and Deputy Firemaster, who shall be appointed and be subject to dismissal by the Municipal Council and who shall bear authority in the order stated, and such number of Firemen as the Municipal Council may from time to time determine. The appointment and dismissal of Firemen shall be in the hands of the Firemaster.
4. The Firemaster or Deputy Firemaster, or any European Police Officer in the absence of the Firemaster and Deputy Firemaster, may break into or enter any premises in the Township being or appearing to be on fire, or any premises or lands adjoining or near thereto, without the consent of any person whatsoever, and may do all such acts or things as they may deem necessary for extinguishing fire in any such premises or for protecting the same or rescuing any person or property therein from fire.
5. Neither the Municipal Council nor any of the members of the Fire Brigade shall be liable to the public for any act or thing done or omitted to be done in exercise of the powers hereinbefore conferred.
6. Subject to the provisions of Bye-law 4 hereof, no person shall at any fire break into or enter or attempt to break into or enter any premises for the purpose of salving property, without the authority of a European Police Officer. Offences against this rule shall be cognisable by the Police.
7. No person shall leave or place or cause or suffer to be left or placed any straw, wood, paper or other things of an inflammable nature, for which he is responsible, in such a position as to cause danger from fire to any adjoining property.
8. The Municipal Council shall have power to affix to any building, post, structure or tree in the town any plate which it may consider necessary for indicating the proximity of a hydrant.
9. Nairobi Township (Fire Brigade) Bye-laws, 1921, are hereby repealed.

UGANDA RAILWAY.

TENDERS FOR THE SUPPLY OF CAMPHOR LOGS.

1. TENDERS are invited for the supply of 300 tons of camphor logs, f.o.r. at any Uganda Railway Station.
2. Tenders for part, or the whole, of the above quantity will be considered.
3. Delivery to be at the rate of 50 tons per month, and tenders must state within what period first delivery would be made.
4. The price must be f.o.r. per ton of 50 cubic feet.
5. Logs to be measured by the quarter girth system under the bark.
6. Logs generally to be not less than 18 feet in length with a girth of not less than 64 inches in any part of the log. Exceptions would be made when a log is of exceptional girth and not less than 12 feet in length. The average girth of logs supplied must not be under 80 inches.
7. Logs to be straight, free from twisted growth and forks, also free from large dead or loose knots, shakes, and decay.
8. Logs will be inspected by the Railway before loading into trucks, and payment will be made on receipt of logs in the Railway Workshops, Nairobi.
9. Sealed tenders, marked "Tenders for Logs" should reach the Chief Storekeeper, Uganda Railway, Nairobi (P.O. Box 40), on or before 13th April, 1923, after which date no tenders will be considered.
