The following Bill is published for general information and criticism:—

A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to amend the law relating to the Sale of Wines, Spirits and Malt Liquors.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Liquor Amendment Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Liquor Ordinance, 1909, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance." Short title.
- 5 2. In the Principal Ordinance, unless a contrary intention appears:— Interpretation of terms.
 - "Province" shall mean District.
 - "Provincial Commissioner" shall mean District or Resident Commissioner.
- 10 3. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "tembo or other liquors habitually drawn or manufactured by natives" and by the substitution therefor of the words "native intoxicating liquor as defined in the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1921." Amendment of Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.
- 15 4. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby further amended by the addition of the following definitions:— Further amendment of Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.
 - "Retail" means liquor in quantities of not more than two gallons if in cask, or twelve reputed quarts or twenty-four reputed pints if in bottles.
 - 20 "Habitual drunkard" means any person convicted under this Ordinance or under any other local law of being drunk and disorderly or drunk and incapable who has been so convicted on three other occasions within twelve months immediately preceding such conviction.
 - 25 "Area" means a district or group of districts as notified by the Governor in the Gazette for the purposes of this Ordinance.
- 30 5. Clause 10 (1) (a) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "of one description" between the words "liquor" and "in quantities" where those words appear together. Amendment of Clause 10 (1) (a) of the Principal Ordinance.
- 35 6. Sub-Section 10 (5) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "in its original state of importation." Amendment of Sub-Section 10 (5) of the Principal Ordinance.
- 40 7. Sub-Section 10 (9) of Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "hours" and by the substitution therefor of the words "time between the hours of 2 p.m. and midnight." Amendment of Sub-Section 10 (9) of the Principal Ordinance.
- 45 8. Section 11 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following Section substituted therefor:— Amendment of Section 11 of the Principal Ordinance.
 - "11. (1) A Court for the consideration and determination of applications for or relating to the granting, renewal or transfer of licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor and for the manufacture of malt liquor is hereby constituted and shall be held in each area.
 - (2) Such Court shall consist of not more than seven and not less than three persons, and shall be composed of such officials and non-officials residing in such area as the Governor may appoint by notice in the Gazette."
- 50 9. Sub-Section 12 (2) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following words thereto:— Amendment of Sub-Section 12 (2) of the Principal Ordinance.
 - "Provided that no official shall be disqualified for appointment as a member of a Licencing Court by reason only of his holding any share in the Civil Service (B.E.A.) Co-operative Society Limited."

10. Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor:—

“17. The Governor shall appoint, by notice in the Gazette, a person who shall preside at every meeting of a Licensing Court for each area. In the absence of any such presiding officer the members present shall elect one of their number to preside. The decision of the majority of members present shall be decision of the Court, and the person presiding shall, in the case of an equality of votes, have a casting in addition to a deliberate vote.”

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“57. The licence authorising the sale of intoxicating liquors shall be displayed in a prominent place on the premises where such liquors are sold, and it shall be lawful for any Magistrate or European Police Officer to enter in or upon such premises to inspect such licence. Any holder of a licence failing so to display such licence or refusing permission or failing to allow such Magistrate or European Police Officer to inspect such licence shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £15 and in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding one month, or to such imprisonment without the option of a fine.”

**THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS
ORDINANCE, 1903.**

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Mombasa Township Vehicle (Amendment) Rules, 1923," and shall be read as one with "The Mombasa Township Vehicle Rules, 1923," hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."

2. Sub-rule 2 (a) of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following Sub-rule is substituted therefor:—

"2. (a) The word 'vehicle' shall include any motor-car, motor-bicycle and side-car, motor-bicycle, bicycle, tricycle, carriage, cart, lorry, buggy, rickshaw, or hamali cart."

3. Rule 7 of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

"7. Every bicycle or tricycle, which has been registered under the preceding Rule, shall carry a metal ticket which shall be attached thereto, so as to be wholly visible, at such place thereon as may be approved by the Resident Commissioner. Such metal ticket shall exhibit thereon the registration number of such cycle in figures not less than two inches in height and also thereunder the year of registration in figures not more than three-quarters of an inch in height, and on the reverse side thereof there shall be stamped into the metal the trade number of such cycle. The Resident Commissioner shall issue such ticket to the person registering such cycle who shall pay the fee prescribed in Schedule 3 hereto in respect thereof."

4. Rule 9 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the substitution of the following paragraph for the first paragraph therein appearing:—

"All vehicles, other than bicycles and tricycles and vehicles (not being Public Motor Vehicles) which require to be licensed under the Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1915, shall be licensed."

5. Rule 13 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "or under the Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1915."

6. Rule 27 of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following Rule is substituted therefor:—

"27. Every vehicle, other than a motor-bicycle, bicycle, tricycle, or hamali cart, when in or upon a public street or thoroughfare between the hours of 6-15 p.m. and 5-45 a.m., shall carry and exhibit in a conspicuous position two properly lighted lamps, one lamp to be on each side of such vehicle. In the case of a motor-bicycle, bicycle or tricycle, one such lamp in front thereof shall be so carried and exhibited. In the case of a hamali cart, one such lamp shall be carried and exhibited thereon in the most conspicuous place."

7. No driver of a public vehicle shall accept an additional passenger or additional passengers en route without the permission of the other passenger or passengers already in or upon such vehicle.

8. Schedules 1 and 2 of the Principal Rules are hereby cancelled and the Schedules 1 and 2 hereinbelow appearing are substituted therefor.

9. Schedule 3 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the deletion of the figures 30 as the fee for Taxi motor-cars and by the substitution therefor of the figure 5.

Shs. 12/- for the first hour or part thereof, irrespective of the number of passengers.

Shs. 3/- per quarter of an hour or part thereof thereafter, irrespective of the number of passengers.
