THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE, 1921.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Companies Ordinance, 1921, Section 151 (4) His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Companies Rules, 1923."

2. In these Rules,

(1) The "Colony" means the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya:

(2) The "Ordinance" means the Companies Ordinance, 1921:

(3) The "Schedule" means the schedule hereto annexed:

(4) The decision of the Registrar as to the meaning of the words "responsible officer" shall be final.

3. Copies of contract required to be filed with the Registrar under Section 104 of the Ordinance shall be deemed to be duly verified if they are,

(1) Certified copies as defined in Section 76 of the Indian Evidence Act (1 of 1872); or any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same; or

(2) Certified by an affidavit of some responsible officer of the company to be true copies.

4. A copy of an instrument by which a mortgage or charge is created or evidenced delivered to the Registrar for filing under Section 109 of the Ordinance, or a copy of a deed so delivered under Section 110 of the Ordinance, shall be deemed to be verified in the prescribed manner if it is,

(1) A certified copy as defined in Section 76 of the Indian Evidence Act; or any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same; or

(2) Certified by an affidavit of some responsible officer of the company to be a true copy.

Provided that a copy of such an instrument or deed where the mortgage or charge comprises solely property situate outside the Colony shall be deemed to be so verified if it is certified to be a true copy under the seal of the company or under the hand of some person interested therein otherwise than on behalf of the company.

5. If any portion of any document required to be filed under the Ordinance other than Section 277 thereof is not in the English language, a translation thereof, certified by a responsible officer of the company to be correct, shall be furnished along with each copy deposited with the Registrar.

6. The following fees shall be payable for the registration of mortgages and charges, namely:—

(1) For registering under Section 109 any mortgage or charge created by a company, where the amount of the mortgage or charge does not exceed Shs. 4,000 ... 10 Shs.

Where it exceeds Shs. 4,000 ... 20

(2) For registering under Section 110 of the Ordinance of a series of debentures, where the total amount secured by the whole series does not exceed Shs. 4,000 ... 10

Where it exceeds Shs. 4,000 ... 20

(3) For inspection under Section 112 (3) of the register of mortgages and charges ... 1

(4) For registration under Section 118 the appointment of a Receiver or Manager ... 5

7. A copy of a document required to be filed with the Registrar under Section 277 of the Ordinance shall be deemed to be certified in the prescribed manner:—

A. In the case of a company incorporated in a foreign country, if

(1) Duly certified as a true copy by an official of the Government to whose custody the original is committed, the signature or seal of such official being authenticated by any of the British officials mentioned in Section 6 of the Commissioners of Oaths Act, 1889, 52 and 53 Vict., c. 10 or in any Act amending the same, or

(2) Duly certified as a true copy by a Notary of such foreign country, the certificate of the Notary being authenticated by any of the British officials mentioned in Section 6 of the said Act or in any Act amending the same, or

(3) Duly certified as a true copy on oath by some officer of the company before a person having authority to administer an oath as provided by Section 3 of the said Act, the status of the person administering the oath being authenticated by any of the British officials mentioned in Section 6 of the said Act or in any Act amending the same.

B. In the case of a company incorporated in any part of His Majesty's dominions if it is,

(1) Duly certified as a true copy by an official of the Government to whose custody the original is committed, or

(2) Duly certified as a true copy by a Notary Public of such place, or

(3) Duly certified as a true copy on oath by some officer of the company before some person having authority to administer an oath in such place.

8. Translations of documents required to be filed with the Registrar under Section 277 of the Ordinance shall be deemed to be certified as correct translation if certified to be correct translations.

A. Where such translation is made out of the Colony by

(1) An official having custody of the original, or

(2) A Notary Public for the country or place where the company is incorporated:

Provided that where the company is incorporated in a foreign country, the signature or seal of the person so certifying shall be authenticated in either case by any of the British officials mentioned in Section 6 of the Commissioners of Oaths Act, 1889, 52 and 53 Vict., c. 10 or in any Act, amending the same.

B. Where such translation is made within the Colony.

(1) By an Advocate, Attorney or Pleader entitled to appear before the Supreme Court, or

(2) By an affidavit of some person having in the opinion of the Registrar, a competent knowledge of the language of the original and of English.

9. The Governor-in-Council may in any particular case if he thinks fit and upon such conditions as he may prescribe, permit certified copies or transactions

though not certified in accordance with Rules 7 and 8 to be filed with the Registrar.

10. Notice of any alteration which is required by Section 277 (1) of the Ordinance to be filed with the Registrar shall be so filed within one month after the date on which particulars of the alteration could in due course of post, and if despatched with due diligence have been received by the Registrar from the place where the company is incorporated.

11. The Governor-in-Council further prescribes and directs that the forms in the schedule or forms as near thereto as circumstances admit shall be used in all matters to which these forms relate.

The British War Pensions Act, 1921 (Section 4), declares certain awards made *before the 19th August, 1921*, to be *final awards* in respect of the disablement due to Great War Service, provided that they have not since that date been varied by the Ministry of Pensions. The Act provides for a right of appeal to an independent Tribunal against a final award; and the Tribunal has the power to confirm, increase, decrease or set aside such final awards. The right of appeal must be exercised within certain specified

time-limits which are indicated below. In the absence of a successful appeal to the Tribunal a final award cannot subsequently be altered.

For the purposes of the Act, and the Regulations made under it, a final award is a decision, declared to be final, as to the rate of disablement (if any) and also in the case of a final weekly allowance as to the period to which the rate of disablement applies, or as to the Gratuity (if any) granted.

The awards now declared by the Statute to be final are of the following classes:—

(1) Awards of *permanent retired pay or pension*.

(2) Awards of "*nil disablement*."

(3) Awards where the rate of disablement is certified to be *less than 1 per cent*.

(4) *Final weekly allowances and gratuities* (awarded before the 1st April, 1919).

(5) *Final weekly allowances and gratuities* (awarded between the 1st April, 1919, and the 19th August, 1921).

In the case of awards falling within classes (1), (2), (3) and (4) above, the latest date on which notice of appeal can be given by officers and men overseas is *30th June, 1923*; in the case of awards in class (5) the latest date (for officers and men whether resident overseas or not) is *6th February, 1924*.

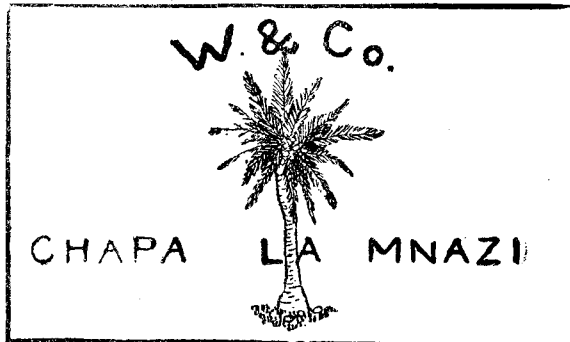

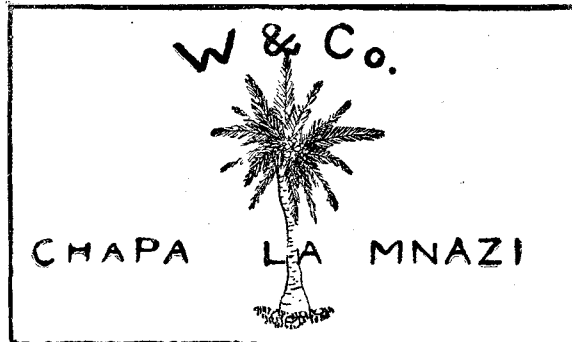
