An Ordinance to amend the Revised Edition of the Laws Ordinance, 1921.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Revised Edition of the Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Revised Edition of the Laws Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance. Short title.
- 5 2. Section 7 sub-section (2) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of the figures 1922 for the figures 1921. The year 1922 substituted for the year 1921.
- 10 3. Section 9 subsection (1) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of the figures 1922 for the figures 1921. Consequential amendment of Section 9.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1922.

PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, having taken the advice of my Executive Council, do hereby declare that Proclamation No. 12, dated 3rd February, 1920, is hereby amended by deleting the boundaries of the Township of Nairobi therein set out and substituting therefor the boundaries set out in the schedule annexed hereto.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NAIROBI.

Commencing at the North-easterly corner of L.O. No. 1870 (Upper Parklands Estate); thence bounded by the Mathari River down-stream to the North-westerly corner of L.O. No. 36 (Egerton Estate) where it joins the Westerly boundary of that estate; thence by the Westerly boundary of that estate to Nairobi River; thence onward to a point

where a line produced along the South-easterly boundary of the proposed Native Location (now cancelled as shown on Nairobi Township Map) would intersect; thence by that line South-westerly to where it intersects the Ngong River; thence by that river up-stream to the North-easterly corner of L.O. No. 37; thence by the Northerly boundary of that L.O. number to its North-westerly corner; thence by a line to the most Southerly corner of the King's African Rifles lines; thence by the generally Westerly boundary of King's African Rifles lines to the westernmost point thereof; thence by a straight line to the South-eastern corner of the plot now described as L.O. No. 4232; thence along the Southern boundary thereof to its South-western corner; thence by a straight line to the South-eastern corner of subdivision No. 1 of Plot No. 393; thence along the Southern boundaries of Plots 393 and 394 to the South-western corner of Plot 394; thence along the Western boundary of Plot 394 to its Northwestern corner; thence by a straight line to the South-easterly corner of L.O. No. 1 (Upper Hill Estate); thence by the Easterly boundary of that estate to its North-westerly corner on Kirichwa Kubwa or Gara River; thence by that river down-stream to its junction with Kirichwa Dego or Gara River; thence in a Northerly direction by the Easterly boundaries of L.O. No. 207/1 and L.O. No. 208/1 to Nairobi River; thence by that river up-stream to the South-westerly corner of L.O. No. 209/345; thence by the Westerly boundary of that L.O. number to its most Northerly corner and continued where it meets Salisbury Road; thence South-easterly by that road to the most Westerly corner of L.O. No. 209/76; thence in a generally Northerly direction by the generally Easterly boundary of L.O. No. 1870 (Upper Parklands Estate) to the point of commencement including that area L.O. No. 1870 originally L.O. No. 209/79.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Forest Ordinance, 1911, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Forest (Amendment) Rules, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Forest (Amendment) Rules, 1915, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."

2. The First Schedule to the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following protected trees:—

3. The Third Schedule to the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the addition of the following provision to Clause (1) Timber:—

There shall be paid a royalty of 60 cents (Sh. 0-60) per cubic foot for fallen and dead Muzariti (*Ocotes usambarensis*) and a royalty of 40 cents (Sh. 0-40) for fallen and dead Muhugu (*Brachylsenia Hutchinsii*).

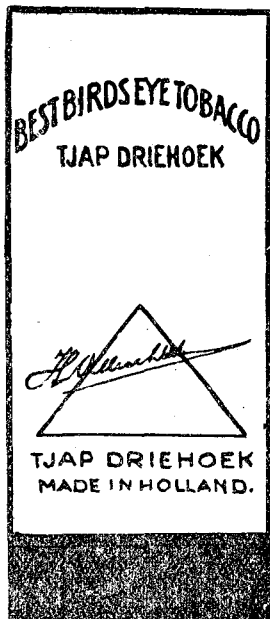

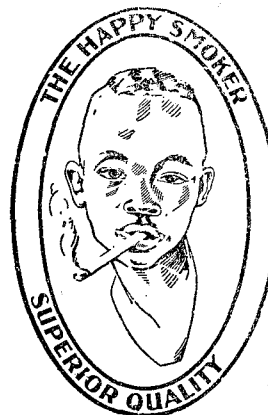
