SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Naivasha Township.

Commencing at the north-east corner of L.O. No. 395, thence bounded by the northern boundary of that portion to the Lake edge;

thence by that Lake edge in a generally northern direction to its intersection with the south-eastern boundary of L.O. No. 1145, or with that boundary line extended to the Lake edge;

thence by that boundary (or extended line) northeasterly to its intersection with the western 100-foot zone of the Uganda Railway;

thence by that 100-foot zone up-line to its intersection with the Karathi River;

thence by the centre of that river's course upstream to its intersection with the western boundary of the Forest Reserve (L.O. No. 1300);

thence by that Forest Reserve Boundary on a true bearing of 166° 40′ 30" for about 70 yards to a beacon;

thence in a generally southerly direction by the western boundary of the Forest Reserve (which consists of a circular area with a radius of 2 miles with the Government flag-staff as centre) to the point of commencement.

The above described area is shewn edged yellow on the Land Surveys Key Plan of Naivasha Township (1 in 10,000 scale), deposited at the Land Survey Office, Nairobi; a copy of which is on record at the Office of the Resident Commissioner, Naivasha.

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Pencil (Cedar Timber Rebate of Royalty) Amendment Rules, 1923' and shall be read as one with "The Pencil (Cedar Timber Rebate of Royalty) Rules, 1922" hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules.
- 2. Rule 2 of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following Rule substituted therefor:-
- Any person who after the date of these Rules has paid or shall pay Royalty to the Government in respect of cedar timber shall be entitled to a rebate of such Royalty on all slats and billets exported and sold to Pencil Manufacturers at the rate of twelve and one half cubic feet for each case containing 4,800 six-ply slats or a proportionate number of billets and at the same rate of Royalty as shall have been paid at the time of purchasing the timber.
