## A Bill

#### Intituled

## An Ordinance Further to Amend the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Native Hut and Short title. Poll Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with "The Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910," hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended Amendment of by the deletion of the words "1st April to the 31st March" and Section 2 of the Principal by substitution therefor of the words "1st January to the 31st Ordinance.

(1) Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of 10 repealed and the following Section is substituted therefor:-

the Principal

"7. (1) The tax payable by every Native for any year shall be paid by him between the first and thirty-first day of January of such year.

Provided, however, that any Native who is not residing in 15 the Colony or Protectorate on the first day of January, or although residing in the Colony or Protectorate on such date leaves the Colony or Protectorate during the month of January without having paid the tax payable by him for that year, shall pay such tax within one month of his coming or returning to the 20 Colony or Protectorate as the case may be.

And provided, further, that any Native who shall come to the Colony or Protectorate after the thirtieth day of June in any year, and who shall not have previously resided in the Colony or Protectorate in the same year, shall pay half the tax otherwise payable by him.

(2) If any Native, without lawful excuse, fails or makes default in payment of the tax payable by him as hereinbefore provided, any Magistrate, having jurisdiction in the district or place in which such Native is staying or residing for the time being, may on conviction, sentence such Native:-

To pay such tax, together with a sum not exceeding ten Shillings for Court costs as such Magistrate in his discretion may determine.

(b) To pay a fine, not exceeding double the amount of such tax, and

(c) In default of payment, as provided in clauses (a) and (b) hereof, to imprisonment of either description until such payment is made, provided that such period of imprisonment shall not exceed three months.

(3) Fine or imprisonment under this Section shall not operate as a satisfaction or extinguishment of the tax payable by such Native.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained any tax payable by a Native or any fine or costs imposed on him 45 under this Section shall be recoverable by distress on the property of such Native."

4. Section 2 of the Native Hut and Poll Tax Amendment Repeal. Ordinance, 1912, is hereby repealed.

## A Bill

#### Intituled

## An Ordinance to make provision for the Control of Sugar and Sugar Juices.

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited a "The Sugar Ordinance, 1923."

Application of Ordinance.

2. The Governor-in-Council may from time to time apply this Ordinance to any area in the Colony or Protectorate.

3. For the purposes of this Ordinance:

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Definitions.

"Prohibited area" shall mean any area to which this Ordinance has been applied under the provisions of Section 2.

"Sugar" shall mean any form of sugar or any crystallised form of the juice of the sugar cane, and shall include all kinds of sugar commonly known as jaggery.

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"Sugar juice" shall mean the liquid product of any sugar producing plant.

"Controller" shall mean the District Commissioner of the District within which the prohibited area lies.

Restriction on importation of sugar or sugar juices into prohibited area. 4. No person shall import or cause to be imported any 15 sugar or sugar juice into any prohibited area without a permit in writing from the Controller.

Restrictions on possession of sugar or sugar juice in any prohibited area.

5. No person shall possess any sugar or the juice of any sugar cane in any prohibited area without a permit in writing from the Controller.

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**6.** No person shall erect possess or use a mill for the purpose of crushing sugar cane in a prohibited area without a permit from the Controller.

Discretionary power of Controller in granting permits.

- 7. (1) A permit issued under the provisions of this Ordinance may specify any conditions to be observed by the 25 holder thereof, provided that such conditions are designed for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance.
- (2) The issue of any permit under this Ordinance shall be in the absolute discretion of the Controller and he may refuse to issue any such permit without giving any reason for such refusal.

Penalty.

**8.** Any person contravening any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Shillings 1,000 or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months or to both.

Offence cognizable to Police. 9. Any offence against the provisions of this Ordinance 35 shall be cognizable to the Police.

Power to make Rules.

10. The Governor-in-Council may from time to time make Rules for the better carrying into effect of the purposes of this Ordinance.

Repeal.

11. The Wakamba (Prevention of Drunkenness) Ordinance, 40 1919, is hereby repealed.

### THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE, 1921.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Public Health (Rat Virus) Regulations, 1923."
- 2. The importation into the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya or the manufacture or use therein of any living bacterial preparations for the destruction of rats is hereby prohibited, except under a permit from the Principal Medical Officer and subject to such conditions as the Principal Medical Officer may specify.

#### NOTICE.

IT is notified for general information that it has been brought to notice that a quantity of contraband Rhino Horn is being experted on the grounds that it was obtained from animals killed prior to 1922.

Anyone possessing Rhino Horn shot on a licence previous to the publication of the Game Ordinance, 1021, should at once obtain a "Certificate of Legal Possession" from the nearest District Commissioner. On and after 15th July, 1923, any person wishing to obtain a permit for the export of Rhino Horn must produce for the inspection of the permit issuer either the Special Licence under which the rhino was shot or else the above-mentioned "Certificate of Legal Possession." In default of the production of such documents no permit will be issued and the Rhino Horn may be confiscated.
