THE FISH PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1908.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Fish Protection Ordinance, 1908, the Deputy to His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:-

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Trout Protection Rules, 1923."
- (1) No person shall fish for, capture or kill any trout except he be licensed for such purpose.
- (2) No person shall sell or expose for sale any trout except under special permit granted by the Governor or other person authorized by him in that behalf.
- The following licenses may be granted, at his discretion by a Senior Commissioner or District Commissioner or by any other person as may be authorized in that behalf by the Governor, on payment of the following fees:
 - (1) For a year S. 40
 - (2) For a fortnight S. 15

A yearly licence shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year in which it is granted.

- 4. The Governor may in his discretion remit the fee payable in respect of any licence as aforesaid.
- Every licence shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) That the holder thereof shall not fish for, capture and kill trout otherwise than with rod and line.
 - That the number and size of trout which may be so fished for, captured and killed and the fly or bait which may be employed for such purpose in any particular water shall be as prescribed by Notice in that behalf in the Gazette.
 - That any trout which may be so fished for and captured, and which shall not be of the prescribed standard or condition as provided in the preceding clause, shall not be killed but shall be returned to the water with as little delay and damage to such fish as possible.
- 6. Any licence holder who shall commit any breach of or fail to comply with any of the conditions of his licence shall be guilty of an offence against these Rules.

- 7. (1) Any Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Forest Officer, Game Warden, Police Officer, or other person authorised in that behalf by the Governor, may require any person suspected of or found fishing for, capturing and killing trout, or in possession of trout, to produce for inspection his licence and any fish in his possession.
- (2) Any person who, having been required as aforesaid to produce his licence or any fish in his possession, shall without lawful reason or excuse refuse or neglect to produce his licence or any fish in his possession, shall be guilty of an offence against these Rules.
- 8. (1) Any Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Forest Officer, Game Warden, Police Officer, or other person authorized in that behalf by the Governor, may seize any rod, tackle, net, machine, instrument or other appliance which he may have reason to believe is being or has been used in contravention of any of these Rules.
- (2) Any rod, tackle, machine, instrument or other appliance so seized shall be sent without undue delay to the Magistrate having jurisdiction to try the person suspected.
- (3) In the event of such person being convicted of such offence the rod, tackle, net, machine, instrument or other appliance may, at the discretion of the Magistrate, be forfeited to Government.
- 9. Any Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Forest Officer, Game Warden, Police Officer or other person authorised in that behalf by the Governor may enter upon any land for the purpose of preventing or detecting offences against these Rules.
- 10. Any person who shall commit any offence against these Rules shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Thirty Pounds and in default of payment thereof to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months. If the person convicted be the holder of a licence he shall be liable also on conviction to the cancellation of his licence.
- 11. No person whose licence has been cancelled as aforesaid shall be granted another licence without the consent of the Game Warden.
- 12. The Trout Protection Rules, 1913, are hereby cancelled.

"For any journey by distance wholly or partly, outside the township but within a radius of 5 miles from the junction of Government Road and Sixth Avenue, the fares for so much if any of the journey as is within the township shall be as above, and the fare for so much of the journey as is outside the township shall be double the above fares."
