An Ordinance to Amend the Estate Duty Ordinance, 1918.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Estate Duty Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with "The Estate Duty Ordinance, 1918" (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance") and "The Estate Duty (Amendment) 5 Ordinance, 1921." Short title.

Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, Repeal of following Section is substituted therefor:— Section 7 of and the following Section is substituted therefor:-

the Principal Ordinance and re-enactment amendments.

"7. The Commissioners shall, subject to the approval of the Governor-in-Council, by writing under their hands, or the hands of the major part of them, appoint proper persons to act as Assistant Commissioners in such areas as occasion shall require to assess the duties hereby imposed, to see that the same are duly paid into the Treasury and to furnish monthly returns of all such assessments to the head office of the Commis-15sioners, and subject to the like approval the Commissioner shall appoint and assign to every Assistant Commissioner appointed under this Ordinance, if occasion shall require, such clerical staff, as to the Commissioners may appear necessary for the purposes of this Ordinance.

3. Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, Repeal of 20and the following Section is substituted therefor:-

the Principal Ordinance

"9. The Treasurer shall submit to the Commissioners a Treasurer to monthly return of all duties received by him.

4. Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, 25 and the following Section is substituted therefor:-

Repeal of the Principal Ordinance and re-enactment amendments.

All money from time to time collected or received on account of duties imposed by this Ordinance shall form part of the general revenue of the Colony and Protectorate.

All duties. collected to form part of the general

(1) Where the Commissioners are satisfied, that in the Exception as 30 United Kingdom or in a British Possession to which this Section applies, duty is payable by reason of a death on any property situate in the United Kingdom or in such Possession and passing on such death, they shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the Estate duty payable in respect of 35 that property on the same death.

to property in United Kingdom and British Possessions.

(2) The Governor-in-Council may by Proclamation in the Gazette apply this Section to any British Possession, Protectorate or Mandated Territory where he is satisfied that, by the law of such Possession, Protectorate or Mandated Territory, either no

duty is leviable in respect of property situate in the Colony or Protectorate of Kenya when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the foregoing provision of this Section.

Property in a foreign country.

6. Where any property passing on the death of a deceased is situate in a foreign country, and the Commissioners are satisfied that by reason of such death any duty is payable in that foreign country in respect of that property, they shall make an allowance of the amount of that duty from the value of the property.

No probate or iters of administration to be granted except on production of certificate from Assistant Commissioner. 7. No probate or letters of administration shall be granted 10 by any Court, unless a certificate is produced to the Court from an Assistant Commissioner to the effect that the requirements of this Ordinance in regard to the payment of duty have been complied with.

Mode of determining situation of property in United Kingdom,

8. The local situation in the United Kingdom of any 15 property shall be determined in accordance with the law of England with regard to the local situation of property within the meaning of Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1894 (Imperial).

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. Only one plot at a time will be auctioned.
- 2. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser and if any dispute arise as to any bidding the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bid. The amount of the advance shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 3. A purchaser of a plot shall be entitled to acquire such additional plots as he may require each at the same price as that paid for the plot purchased, provided that such additional plots shall adjoin the plot purchased and each other. The purchaser shall declare to the auctioneer his intention of taking up such additional plots immediately on the fall of the hammer.
- 4. Each purchaser must pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer 25% of the purchase price of the plot or plots. In default of payment of such deposit the grant of the plot or plots may be re-offered for sale immediately and any subsequent bid made by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5. The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st December, next following, the prescribed survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant shall be paid to the Commissioner of Lands at the Land Office within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of the sale have been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the plot or plots, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Commissioner of Lands can present to the purchaser the grant of the plot or plots duly executed.

- 6. The grant shall commence on the 1st day of the month next following that in which the sale is held and rent shall be payable from that date.
- 7. Subject to the proviso contained therein if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition 5 is not paid to the Commissioner of Lands within seven

days from the date of the sale, the Commissioner of Lands may order that the deposit made by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the plot or plots.

- 8. Each purchaser shall erect a building or buildings upon his plot or plots within 2 years from the date of the grant, such buildings to be erected according to plans and specifications which must be approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands or such other official as he may appoint for the purpose.
- 9. If subsidiary sidings be required each purchaser shall be responsible for the cost thereof and shall make his own arrangements with the General Manager, Uganda Railway.
- 10. Each purchaser shall drain his plot or plots to the satisfaction of Government and shall connect such drainage with any main drainage system of the township of Nairobi as may hereafter be constructed.
- 11. Each purchaser shall keep his plot or plots in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of Government.
- 12. No plot or plots shall at any time during the term of the lease be used as a place of residence by any person or persons whatsoever.
- 13. Purchasers of more than one plot in accordance with No. 3 of these conditions are hereby notified that plots so purchased will be treated in the grant as one plot which must not be sub-divided without the consent of the Governor, but the rent payable in respect thereof will be the total rent of the number of plots purchased.
