Intituled

An Ordinance Further to Amend the Liwalis' Courts Ordinance, 1921.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Liwalis' Courts (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with "The Liwalis' Courts Ordinance, 1921," hereinafter called the "Principal Ordinance."

Short title.

5 2. Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following Section is substituted therefor:—

Amendment of Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance.

10 "3. The Governor may by notice in the Gazette appoint a Liwali for the Coast, and, in addition to his ordinary powers conferred by the Courts Ordinance, 1907, and the Criminal Procedure Ordinance, 1913, and any Ordinance or Ordinances in amendment thereof or in substitution therefor, such Liwali shall be invested with power to exercise jurisdiction in all districts in which Liwalis exercise jurisdiction under the said Ordinances, and shall also have power to inspect all books, records and 15 proceedings of all Liwalis', Cadis' and Mudirs' Courts, and to render reports to the Supreme Court relative to such inspections."

Intituled

An Ordinance to Amend the Fish Protection Ordinance, 1908.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Fish Protection (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Fish Protection Ordinance, 1908, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance."

Short title.

5 2. It shall be lawful for the Treasurer on the direction of the Governor to pay ninety per centum of the fees, collected for the period commencing on the 12th day of June and ending on the 31st December, 1923 and thereafter during each financial year in respect of licences issued pursuant to Rules under the 10 Principal Ordinance for the taking or killing of any species of fish, to the Kenya Angling Association quarterly for the more effectual protection and improvement of fish and the due administration of Rules made under the Principal Ordinance.

Disposal of licence fees.

15 3. The Kenya Angling Association shall if and when required by the Governor so to do submit to the Governor a statement shewing accurately and in detail an account of all expenditure of the money paid under this Ordinance and the balance on hand.

**THE PUBLIC TRAVEL AND ACCESS ROADS
ORDINANCE, 1920.**

**ESTABLISHMENT AND DEDICATION OF A LINE OF
PUBLIC TRAVEL.**

WHEREAS it has been made to appear that requirements exist for the establishment of a line of Public Travel, namely, from a point near Lukenya, situated on Farm 3619 and traversing Farms 3619, 350, 351, 352, 354, 1412, 1413, 357, 1416, 1419, 356, 1420, 1422/3, 1422/1, 1423/2, 1423/1 and thence on Crown Lands to a point of junction with the Road from Machakos to Donyo Sabuk, known as the District Commissioner's Road, His Excellency the Acting Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 8, sub-section (1) of the Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance, 1920, hereby establishes a line of Public Travel through the above-mentioned farms and dedicates it absolutely as a public road 200 feet in width, as shewn approximately on the plan marked P.W.D.
