ORDER IN COUNCIL.

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE,

The 30th day of July, 1923.

*Present,*THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY
IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council, bearing date the 14th day of July, 1921, and entitled the Eastern African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1921 (hereinafter called the Principal Order), provision was made for regulating appeals from His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa to His Majesty in Council:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing even date with this Order, and entitled the Eastern African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1923, provision has been made empowering the said Court of Appeal to hear and determine appeals from His Highness the Sultan's Court for Zanzibar (hereinafter referred to as "the Zanzibar Court"):

And whereas by a Decree, shortly entitled the Zanzibar Courts Decree, 1923, His Highness the Sultan of Zanzibar has enacted the following provisions relating to appeals to His Majesty in Council from the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa sitting in appeal from the Zanzibar Court:—

"21. Whenever under the provisions of the Eastern African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1921, or any amendment thereof or any Order in Council substituted therefor, an appeal shall lie as of right or at the discretion of the Court of Appeal from any judgment, whether final or interlocutory, of the Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council, an appeal shall to a like extent lie to His Majesty in Council from any judgment, whether final or interlocutory, of the Court of Appeal sitting in appeal from the Zanzibar Court.

"22. His Majesty in Council shall have jurisdiction to entertain, hear and determine such appeal, and to deal therewith in accordance with the provisions of the Eastern African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1921, or any amendment thereof or any Order in Council substituted therefor, and in accordance with such Rules and Regulations as may from time to time be prescribed by His Majesty in Council."

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for regulating such appeals as aforesaid from His Majesty's Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf in His Majesty vested and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the "Eastern African (Appeal to Privy Council) Order in Council, 1923," and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

2. Where an appeal shall have been made under the Eastern African Court of Appeal Order in Council, 1923, from the Zanzibar Court to the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa, an appeal shall lie from any Judgment, Decree or Order of the said Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council in such cases and subject to such conditions and regulations as are prescribed by the Principal Order with regard to other appeals from the said Court of

Appeal to His Majesty in Council, and the provisions of the said Principal Order shall apply and take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall commence and have effect forthwith.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE NATIVE REGISTRATION
ORDINANCE, 1921.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Governor-in-Council by the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rule.

This Rule may be cited as "The Native Registration Rule, 1923."

1. Every person employing a native registered under the provisions of the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, shall render to the Administrative Officer-in-Charge of the district in which the native is employed a Special Return after the 31st day of October, 1923, and before the 7th day of November, 1923. Such Special Return shall be made upon a form as set out in the schedule annexed to this Rule and shall include the following information:—

(a) Name of Employer (or Firm or Company) his Residential and Postal address, his Administrative District, the date on which the return is submitted.

(b) The registration number and name of any native in the employer's service on the 31st October, 1923, and the date of engagement of such native.

(c) The registration number and name of any native discharged or having deserted or died during the month of October, 1923, and the date on which such discharge, desertion or death took place.

(d) The registration number and name of any native who has been in the employer's service who having gone on leave or left such employer's service without being signed off and who has not returned and appears unlikely to return to such employer's service and who has not been reported by such employer on a previous Labour Return as having been discharged or as having left such employer's service; and the date of such native's departure from such employer's service.

IMPERIAL WAR GRAVES COMMISSION.

MEMORIALS TO THE MISSING IN FRANCE.

Preliminary Notice.

THE Imperial War Graves Commission invite Architects who served during the war as members of the Military, Naval or Air Forces raised in any part of the British Empire to send in their names for admission to a competition for the designing of the under-mentioned of the memorials to the Missing to be erected in France by the Imperial War Graves Commission.

The memorials to the missing proposed are to commemorate those who fell in the war in France and Belgium, but have no known grave, and will be in the neighbourhood of the following places, and will have inscribed on them the following number of names:—

At Bethune, 20,000 names; at Armentieres, 15,000 names; at Cambrai, 6,000; at Soissons, 5,000 names.

Applications for particulars of premiums and other regulations from those desiring to compete are to be addressed to The Secretary (Works Branch), Imperial War Graves Commission, 82, Baker Street, London, W.1., and must be received there not later than 1st January, 1924, and must be accompanied by a statement giving particulars of the war service and professional career of the applicant, and clearly stating which of the memorials it is desired to compete for.

A deposit of two guineas for each set of plans, regulations and other particulars applied for must accompany the application, and such deposit will be returned either on receipt of a *bona fide* design or on the return of the plans, regulations and particulars in good condition.

The Assessor appointed by the Imperial War Graves Commission to examine and report on the designs submitted is Sir Aston Webb, K.C.V.O., P.R.A.
