A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to Impose a Tax on Cotton.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Cotton (Tax) Ordinance, 1923." Short title.
2. In this Ordinance:— Interpretation.
- "Colony" means the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.
- 5 "Treasurer" means the Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.
- "To transport" means to remove ginned cotton from the premises where such cotton has been ginned.
- 10 3. A tax of 6 cents per pound shall be payable in respect of ginned cotton grown and produced from cotton seed sown in the Colony. Tax.
4. No ginned cotton shall be transported unless and until a licence has been obtained in that behalf. Ginned cotton not to be removed without a licence.
- 15 5. (1) Any person requiring ginned cotton to be transported shall apply in writing to the Treasurer for a licence for such purpose. Application for a licence, etc.
- (2) Such application shall be accompanied by a remittance of the tax payable thereon together with a certificate in which shall be truly set out the nett weight thereof.
- 20 6. A licence to transport ginned cotton shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto. Form of licence.
7. No ginned cotton shall be accepted for transport by any transporting agency unless and until the person requiring such cotton to be transported shall make over to such transporting agency the licence for such purpose. Licence to be made over to transporting agency.
- 25 8. All persons holding stocks of cotton on the 31st day of December in any year shall, within 30 days thereafter, submit to the Treasurer a certificate in which shall be truly set out the nett weight of the ginned and unginned cotton so held. Persons holding stocks of cotton to furnish Returns.
- 30 9. Any person rendering a false certificate or committing any other breach of the provisions of this Ordinance may be punished on conviction with a fine not exceeding £100 or with imprisonment of either description not exceeding six months or with both. Penalty.

An Ordinance to Supply a further Sum of Money for the Service of a period from January 1st, 1924 to 31st December, 1924.

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Supplementary Appropriation (Railway) Ordinance, 1923."

Public revenue charged.

2. The public revenue for the above period and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya are hereby charged towards the service of the period of twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four with a further sum of one million eight hundred and seventy-four thousand seven hundred and eighty-six pounds in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1923.

Application of money granted.

3. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes and services expressed in the schedule annexed hereto.

Treasurer's authority for payment.

4. The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate, for the several services specified in the schedule, the said sum of one million eight hundred and seventy-four thousand seven hundred and eighty-six pounds which will come in course of payment during the period of twelve months ending on the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four.

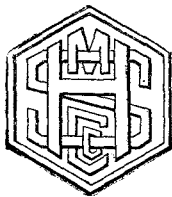
