AT the desire of His Majesty the King a Two Minutes Silence will be observed throughout the British Empire commencing at 11 a.m. on November the 11th, Armistice Day, in reverent remembrance of the glorious dead who fell during the Great War.

- Arrangements will be made locally throughout the Colony for a ceremony as near as possible on the following lines by the local authorities.
- 3. In Nairobi an enclosed Flagstaff and Platform will be erected at the junction of Sixth Avenue and Government Road. The 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles will form part of a hollow square and provide a Guard of Honour. Government Road and Sixth Avenue being closed at 10-30 a.m. by cordons of Police at convenient distances.
- 4. To the area thus enclosed the Chief Justice and Puisne Judges, Members of Executive and Legislative Councils, Mayor and Municipal Councillors, Robed Clergy and Soldiers and ex-Soldiers in uniform, Boy Scouts and Girl Guides will be admitted on presentation of a ticket. It is particularly desired that as many ex-soldiers as possible will attend. Space for the public will be found in Government Road on each side of the area and in Sixth Avenue facing the Flagstaff. Tickets will be issued by the Resident Commissioner. All persons wishing to lay wreaths should take their stand in front of and as near as possible to the cordon of Police on the western side of the area enclosed. Wreaths will be laid during the singing of the Hymn—See programme below.
- In obedience to His Majesty the King's express desire all present whether in uniform or mufti should wear the medals and decorations to which they are entitled.
- After His Excellency's departure the Police cordons will move towards the flagstaff enabling a queue to be formed of those desirous of viewing the wreaths laid in honour of the dead.
- A guard of K.A.R. will remain on duty at the flagstaff post throughout the day and until the wreaths are removed.
- At 5 p.m. the wreaths will be escorted by the K.A.R. Band and Police to the old Cemetery where they will be laid at the foot of the Memorial Cross.

9. Police Buglers will fall in at the Flagpost at 5-50 p.m. The Retreat will be sounded at 6 p.m. and the Flag formally lowered.
