## A Bill

### Intituled

#### An Ordinance further to Amend the Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1915.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Motor Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with The Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter called "the Principal Ordinance."

Short title.

2. Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance, as repealed and substituted by Section 5 of the Motor Traffic (Amendment) Ordinance, 1921, is hereby repealed, and the following section substituted therefor:—

Amendment of Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance.

3. The fees set forth in the fourth Schedule hereto annexed shall be payable in respect of any licence for a motor-car or carriage or in respect of any other matter or thing for which under this Ordinance fees are payable."

4. The burden of proving that a licence or a certificate has been issued under any provision of the Principal Ordinance shall lie on the person charged with contravening such provision.

## THE GAME ORDINANCE, 1921.

## PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Game Ordinance, 1921, Section 15, I, Edward Brandis Denham, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor's Deputy of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, do hereby prohibit the use of a motor vehicle for the purpose of pursuing or capturing game. And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that this prohibition shall not extend to the pursuing or capturing of game on any privately owned land in any case where the permission of the owner or his agent or the occupier of such land has been obtained in that behalf.

*Infected Areas (East Coast Fever).*

IN EXERCISE of the powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare that Proclamation No. 3 of 1922 be amended by revoking the description of the area therein defined and substituting therefore the following:—

(4) That portion of the Kenya Province bounded on the North and West by a line commencing at the Lorian Swamp; thence following the Uaso Nyiro River up-stream to Archer's Post; thence in a Southerly direction following the Archer's Post-Meru Road to its junction with the new Archer's Post-Isiolo Road; thence following the latter road in a Southerly direction to the North-eastern boundary of the grazing area demarcated for the use of the K.A.R. Supply and Transport Oxen; thence in a Southerly direction following the Easterly boundary of that area to the Meru-Nyeri Road; thence in a Westerly direction following the Meru-Nyeri Road to the Marania (Isiolo) River; thence following the Marania River up-stream to the South-eastern corner of Farm No. 2823; thence in a Westerly direction following the Southern boundaries of Farms Nos. 2823, 2821, 2820, 2817 and 2816 to the Ngare Ndare River; thence following the Ngare Ndare River up-stream to its source on the slopes of Mount Kenya; thence across Mount Kenya in a straight line to the source of the Nairobi River; thence following the Nairobi River down-stream to the North-east corner of Farm No. 1236; thence following the Northern boundaries of Farms Nos. 1236 and 1235 to the Northern corner of Farm No. 1235; thence by the Western boundary of that farm to the Rongai River; thence following that river down-stream to its junction with the Amboni River; thence following the Amboni River up-stream to its source in the Aberdare Mountains.

For each word in excess of 20	65 cts.

3. The text of such telegrams shall be in plain English or French.

4. Such telegrams may be "Reply Paid." Ordinary rates will be charged for such reply.

5. Such telegrams will be accepted for such transmission on any day, except Sunday, for normal delivery 48 hours after the time of such acceptance.

6. Subject to the conditions hereinbefore contained, the same Rules will be applied to such telegrams as are applied to "Deferred Telegrams."
