ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to Governor and Commander-in-Chief Colony of Kenya, in regard to the Legislative Council thereof.

Dated 25th October, 1923.

GEORGE, R.I.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Kenya, or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Recites Letters Patent Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date the Eleventh day of September 1920, We did constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Kenya (therein and hereinafter called the Colony):

of 11th September 1920.

And whereas We did thereby authorise, empower and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenour of Our said Letters Patent and of any Orders in Council relating to the territories formerly known as the East Africa Protectorate, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council might be repugnant to any of the provisions of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as might be issued to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such instructions as might from time to time be given to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the Colony:

And whereas certain Instructions bearing date the Recites Instructions of Eleventh day of September 1920 were issued under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance of the Governor or other Officer administering the Government of the Colony, and providing amongst other things for the constitution of the Legislative Council of the Colony:

And whereas by certain Additional Instructions bearing date the Eleventh day of February 1922 We did amend the Fifteenth, Nineteenth and Twentieth Clauses of the said Instructions of the Eleventh day of September 1920:

And whereas We are minded to make further and other provision in regard to the constitution of the said Legislative Council:

11th September

Revokes Clauses XV., XIX. and XX. of above-recited Instructions.

Constitution of the Legislative Council.

Indian and Arab Elected Members.

Nominated Indian Unofficial Members

Nominated Unofficial Member to represent African community.

Nominated Arab Unofficial Member. Now, therefore, We do, by these Our additional Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, revoke, as from the date of the receipt thereof by the Governor in the Colony, the aforesaid Instructions of the Eleventh day of February 1922 but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and instead thereof We do direct and enjoin and declare Our Will and pleasure that as from the date of such receipt the aforesaid Instructions of the Eleventh day of September 1920 shall be read and construed as if in place of the Fifteenth, Nineteenth and Twentieth Clauses thereof amended as aforesaid the following Clauses had been inserted therein:

"XV. The Legislative Council of the Colony shall consist of the Governor as President, ten ex officio Members, Nominated Official Members not exceeding ten in number, eleven European Elected Members, five Indian Elected Members, one Arab Elected Member and one Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the African community:

"Provided that until such Indian Elected Members have been elected there shall be four Nominated Indian Unofficial Members:

"Provided further that the appointment of a Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the African Community shall be discontinued in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State when it shall appear to Us that such appointment is unnecessary:

"Provided further that if one of the Nominated Official Members is not specially appointed to represent the interests of the Arab community there shall be a Nominated Unofficial Member to represent such interests."

The Indian and Arab Elected Members of the Legislative Council shall be such fit persons as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of any law enacted for the purpose by the Legislative Council of the The Nominated Indian Unofficial Members (if any) shall be such fit persons not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint by an Instrument under the Nominated Unofficial Member to The Public Seal. represent the interests of the African community shall be chosen from among the Christian Missionaries in Kenya and shall be appointed by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State. The Nominated Unofficial Member (if any) of the Council to represent the interests of the Arab community shall be such Arab or other person representing such interests and not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal. All such Nominated Unofficial Members shall hold their places in the Council during Our pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, but may be re-appointed."

The Members of the Legislative Council shall Precedence of Members. take precedence as We may specially assign and, in default thereof, first the ex officio Members in the order in which their respective offices are above mentioned; secondly, the Nominated Official Members according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same instrument according to the order in which they are named therein; thirdly, the European Elected Members in order of date of election, or if elected at the same general election according to the alphabetical order of their names; fourthly, the Indian Elected Members in order of date of election, or if elected at the same election according to the alphabetical order of their names; fifthly, the Arab Elected Member; sixthly, the Nominated Unofficial Member representing the interests of the African community and the Nominated Unofficial Member (if any) representing the interests of the Arab community according to the priority of their respective appointments:

"Provided that until such time as Indian Elected Members have been elected the Nominated Indian Unofficial Members shall take the precedence assigned to the Indian Elected Members and the said Nominated Indian Unofficial Members shall take precedence between themselves according to the priority of their respective appointments, or, if appointed by the same Instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein."

## A Bill

#### Intituled

## An Ordinance further to Amend the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinances

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Widows and Short title. Orphans Pension (Amendment) Ordinance, 1923," and shall be read as one with the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance," and 5 all amendments thereto.

2. Sub-section 3 (2) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of repealed and the following sub-section and clauses are substituted Sub-section 3 therefor:-

Principal

- (a) Subject to the same exceptions, every European Ordinance. Officer who was in, or selected for appointment to, the East African Service on the 1st of April, 1921, may, if at the time 10 of election he is in the Service of this Government, by a written notice addressed to the Crown Agents and received by them before the 1st October, 1922, elect to become a contributor; and
- if he so elect, he shall contribute as from the first day of the 15 month after that in which his notice was received by the Crown
- (b) Subject to the same exceptions, any European officer in the Service of the Government, who was in. or selected for appointment to the East African Service on the 1st of April. 20 1921, and who has not since become a contributor may apply

to this Government for special permission to become contributor, and if, after the examination of the officer by a Government Medical Board, the Governor in his discretion decides that such permission should be granted, the officer shall contribute as from the first day of the month next after that in which the Governor's decision is notified to him.

Amendment of Clause 4 (1) (b) of the Principal

Clause 4 (1) (b) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following clause is substituted therefor:

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the active list of the Navy, the Regular Army, or the Royal 10 Air Force temporarily employed by an East African Government in either a military or civil capacity, and all Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers of the King's African Rifles, except those holding pensionable posts under the Government.

Amendment of Sub-section 4
(1) of the Principal Ordinance.

Ordinance.

4. Sub-section 4 (1) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby 15 amended by the addition of the following clauses:—

(e) Persons whose engagement is for a specified period which is less than twenty months.

(f) Persons who are unmarried and are at the time of employment under the age of twenty-one; provided that if they are otherwise liable to contribute under the terms of this Ordinance, they shall, on becoming married or on reaching the age of twenty-one, forthwith become contributors.

Amendment of Clause 5 (1) (b) of the Principal Ordinance.

5. Clause 5 (1) (b) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the words "after medical examination" and by the substitution therefor of the words "after examination by a Government Medical Board."

Amendment of Sub-section 5
(1) of the Principal Ordinance.

6. Sub-section 5 (1) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition of the following clause:

(d) No officer shall, after attaining the age of 49, 30 contribute at a higher rate than that at which he was contributing before attaining that age.

This clause shall have effect from the 1st of April, 1921.

Amendment of marginal note to Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance.

7. The marginal note to Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "contribution" and by the substitution therefore of the word "contributors."

Amendment of Section 14 (1) of the Principal Ordinance.

8. Sub-section 14 (1) of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the deletion of the figures II (2) and by the substitution therefor of the figures 11 (2).

Amendment of Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance.

9. Section 21 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended 40 by the deletion of the words "ceases to assist" and by the substitution therefor of the words "does not assist or."

### THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.

#### Proclamation.

IN EXERCISE of the powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following areas to be infected areas (Trypanosomiasis) for the purposes of the aforesaid Ordinance.

(1) An area in the Fort Hall District bounded by a line commencing at a point on the Thara River where the Western boundary of Farm No. 324 intersects the said river; thence in a Southerly direction, following the Western boundaries of Farms Nos. 324 and 1979/3 to the Southerly corner of Farm 1979/3; thence in an Easterly and Northerly direction following the Southerly and Easterly boundaries of Farm No. 1979/3 to the Southerly boundary of Farm No. 324; thence in an Easterly direction following the Southerly boundary of Farm No. 324 and the Northern boundaries of Farms Nos. 1979/4/R and 4466 to the Eastern corner

of Farm 4466; thence in a South-westerly direction following the South-eastern boundaries of Farms Nos. 4466, 1979/4/R and 1979/1 to the Southern corner of Farm No. 1979/1; thence in a South-easterly direction following the North-eastern boundaries of Farms Nos. 316/2, 316/2/1, 316/1/2, 4519, 4520 and 316/3; to the Easterly corner of Farm No. 316/3; thence in a South-westerly direction following the top of the Kakuzi Hills to a point on Farm No. 1544 where the Kakuzi Hills end; thence in an Easterly direction in a straight line through a portion of Farms Nos. 1544 and 4607 to the South-west corner of Farm No. 2307; thence in a South-easterly direction following the Northern boundaries of Farms Nos. 4607, 2287, 3581, 2289, 2290 and 3582 to the Northeastern corner of Farm No. 3582; thence in a Southerly direction following the Easterly boundary of Farm No. 3582 to the Thika River; thence in an Easterly and Northerly direction following the Thika River down-stream to its junction with the Tana or Kiloluma River; thence in a Westerly direction following the Tana or Kiloluma River up-stream to its junction with the Thaba River; thence in a Westerly direction following the Thaba River up-stream to its junction with the Thara River; thence in a Southerly direction following the Thara River up-stream to where the Western boundary of Farm No. 324 intersects the said river, the point of commencement.

(2) An area on either side of the Thika River including all points within a distance of 400 yards of any point on that river commencing at the intersection of the North-west boundary of Farm No. 4607 of the said river and ending at the intersection of the South-east boundary of Farm No. 3582 and the river.

## TRADING WITH TURKEY.

#### GENERAL LICENCE.

WHEREAS by Proclamation, dated the 5th day of November, 1914 (published as Proclamation No. 33 in the Official Gazette, dated the 30th day of December, 1914), it was declared that the Proclamations and Orders-in-Council then in force issued with reference to the state of war with the Emperor of Germany and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, should be extended to the war with Turkey subject to the exception in such Proclamation mentioned:

And whereas the Proclamation so extended to the war with Turkey included the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2, dated the 9th day of September, 1914 (published as Government Notice No. 203 in the Official Gazette, dated the 16th day of September, 1914), and the Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy, dated the 8th day of October, 1914 (published as Government Notice No. 232 in the Official Gazette, dated the 21st day of October, 1914):

And whereas by Proclamations, dated the 7th day of January, 1915 (published as Proclamation No. 9 in the Official Gazette, dated the 17th day of March, 1915), and the 14th day of September, 1915 (published as Proclamation No. 52 in the Official Gazette, dated the 10th day of November, 1915), the provisions of the aforesaid Proclamations were extended as therein more specifically set forth:

And whereas it was declared by the said Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2 as follows:—

"Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by our licence, or by the licence given on our behalf by a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, whether such licences be especially granted to individuals, or be announced as applying to classes of persons."

And whereas it is desirable to grant the licence hereinafter appearing:

Now, Therefore, I Robert Thorne Coryndon, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, on behalf of His Majesty and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations and all other powers thereunto me enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons or bodies of persons resident, carrying on business or being in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya notwithstanding anything in the said Proclamations, to trade and have commercial and financial transactions (including the payment or delivery of any sum of money or property, which is or but for the war would have been due or deliverable in respect of a transaction entered into before the outbreak of war), with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in the territory defined as Enemy country in the Proclamation, dated the 5th day of November, 1914, providing for the state of war with Turkey.
