LOCUST REPORT, 4TH JANUARY, 1934.

Uganda.—Migratory locust. Reports indicate a general maturity of swarms in all districts; this is somewhat later than last year. A few large dense swarms have been recorded but swarms generally have been small. The swarms in the Madi moved north-east into the Sudan; in other districts direction has been very variable.

Practically no egg-laying has occurred in northern Uganda; elsewhere it has been sporadic and over small areas only.

Hoppers have occurred more commonly in the Masaka and Ankole districts than elsewhere, and although some hopper bands are stated to have covered several square miles, such bands consist of many isolated groups lacking cohesion.

Red locust. There is no further information regarding the red locust.

Tanganyika Territory.—Migratory locust. The movement of mature swarms is taking place over the Uganda-Bukoba border. Egg-laying has been reported but not confirmed.

Red locust. Extensive invasion by red locusts is taking place across the southern border from Portuguese territory and accelerated northerly movement took place at the end of December, the swarms by then having reached the Central Railway. Laying has taken place in the southern part of the Territory.

Kenya.—Migratory locust. A small swarm of mating locusts was observed flying last between Busia and Mumias in the middle of December, but no further news has been received thereof. The only positive report of hoppers received recently is from Sabatia where they are being dealt with by beating. The hoppers in Elgeyo, previously reported, have been completely destroyed by the same method.

General.—Attention is drawn to the northerly movement of red locust in Tanganyika Territory. In both 1932 and 1933, this locust reached as far north as Ruanda-Urundi; swarms even penetrated Uganda at Ankole, but nothing more was heard of them and the general sphere of infestation remained to the south of the Tanganyika Central Railway. Should the present northerly movement continue, swarms may be expected to cross the border into the southern part of this Colony in about a week's time.

AUCTION OF FARMS.

4. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer, and no bid shall be retracted.
5. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10 per cent of his purchase money, and should the same be tendered by cheque, such cheque must be accompanied by a banker's guarantee. In default of such payment, the farm may be immediately re-offered for sale, and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
6. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full to the Land Assistant, Nairobi, on or

before the 1st February, 1934, or shall be paid in nine equal annual instalments, payable on the 1st day of January in each year, the first instalment being payable on the 1st January, 1935, and the purchaser shall inform the Land Assistant, Nairobi, on or before the 1st February, 1934, which method of payment he desires to adopt.
