THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ORDINANCES, 1919-1924.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Legislative Council Ordinance, 1919, and all amendments thereof (in these Rules referred to as "the Principal Ordinance") His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Legislative Council (Amendment) Rules, 1924."
- 2. There shall be added to Schedule II of the Principal Ordinance the following:—

"Rules for the preparation of Voters for the Indian and Arab communities."

- 3. All persons, not disqualified under the Principal Ordinance desirous of having their names entered in the Registers of Voters for the Indian and Arab Electoral Area described in Schedule I, Part B, of the Principal Ordinance shall forward their claims to the nearest Resident or District Commissioner (in these Rules referred to as "the Local Registering Officer" hereby appointed as such under Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance) on or before the 31st day of January, 1924: Provided that all claims forwarded to the Local Registering Officer pursuant to Government Notices, numbered respectively 438 and 7 and published in the Official Gazettes, dated respectively the 12th day of December, 1923, and the 5th day of January, 1924, shall for all purposes, if not disqualified under the Principal Ordinance, be as valid as claims made under this Rule.
 - 4. Every claim shall be in Form A appended to these Rules.
- 5. Upon the expiration of the period limited by Rule 3, it shall be the duty of the Local Registering Officers to prepare separate lists of claims made by persons of the respective communities, in these Rules referred to as "Local Lists," which shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the offices of the Local Registering Officers.
- 6. In preparing local lists, the Local Registering Officer shall after such inquiry as may be necessary, on the application of any person made on behalf of a person who is absent from the Colony or Protectorate, include in the local lists the name of any such absent person whom the Local Registering Officer considers is duly qualified to be included as a voter.
- 7. Every person qualified to have his name entered on a local list whose name is omitted from such list, and who claims to have it inserted therein (in these Rules called the "Applicant") may apply on or before the 7th day of February, 1924, to the Local Registering Officer to have his name inserted therein, and the Local Registering Officer shall insert the name of every person whose claim has been proved to his satisfaction.
- 8. The lists prepared and amended, as the case may be, by the Local Registering Officer pursuant to Rules 5, 6 and 7 shall be published in the Official Gazette and shall, unless further amended pursuant to Rule 9, be the first official registers of voters for the purposes of the Principal Ordinance until revised registers have been prepared in accordance with the Rules of the Principal Ordinance.
 - 9. (a) Every person whose name appears in the first official registers and who objects to the name of any other person, or his name. appearing in such registers (in these Rules referred to as "the Objector") may apply on or before the 28th day of February, 1924, to the Revising Officer to have his name expunged therefrom.

Every such application shall be made in writing, or in person, and he shall state the grounds of his objections and give an address for the receipt of notices.

(b) The Revising Officer whose accision shall be final shall, in his discretion, determine all objections duly made at the time of application, or at such time as he may appoint not later than the 6th day of March and he shall amend the first official registers accordingly.

- (c) The Revising Officer shall retain in the first official registers the names of every person objected to, unless the objector appears, at the time of hearing mentioned in Clause (b) of this Rule by himself or by some person duly authorised by him in support of the objection. Where the objector so appears the Revising Officer may require proof of the qualification of the person objected to, and, if within such reasonable time as the Revising Officer fixes in this behalf, such person's qualification is not proved to the Revising Officer's satisfaction, he shall expunge his name from the first official registers.
- 16. All amendments, if any, made by the Revising Officer pursuant to the provisions of Rule 2 shall be published in the Official Gazette and form part of the official registers.
- 11. Rele 2, Schedule III, of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—

By adding to the Rule the words "who shall certify that in their opinion such candidate has such a knowledge of the English language as will enable him to take part in the proceedings of the Council."

12. Form B, Schedule III, of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding beneath the figure and words "6. Names of Supporters" the certificate following:—

"We the undersigned Proposer, Seconder and Supporters hereby certify that the above-named cand date has such a knowledge of the English language as will enable him to take part in the proceedings of the Council."
