DESCRIPTION OF THE BOUNDARIES OF LIMORU TOWNSHIP.

Commencing at a Beacon (IB3) on the Western 100 foot zone of the Uganda Railway in the vicinity of mile 350; thence bounded by that Railway zone Southerly to its intersection with the Northern boundary of the Limoru Station Reserve; thence Westerly by part of that station reserve boundary to its North-west corner; thence Southerly by the Western boundary of that station reserve to its South-west corner; thence Easterly by part of the Southern boundary of that station reserve to its intersection with the Eastern 100 foot zone of the Uganda Railway; thence Southerly by that railway zone to a Beacon (IB4) in the vicinity of mile 349; thence on a true bearing of 274° 24' 20" for a distance of 4824.6 feet to a Beacon (IB1); thence on a true bearing of 4° 24' 20" for a distance of 5509 feet to a Beacon (IB2); thence on a true bearing 94° 24' 20" for a distance of 5262.5 feet to the point of commencement.
