THE KENYA COLONY ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1921.

ARTICLE 9.

RULES.

RULES issued by the Supreme Court with the approval of the Governor under the Kenya Colony Order in Council, 1921, Article 9.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Rules of Court (Cost of Identification by the Finger Print System), 1924.

2. In all Court proceedings criminal as well as civil, in which the evidence of a representative of the Central Finger Print Bureau is required by any party to the proceedings other than the Crown for the purpose of identifying or distinguishing persons by the finger print system, the fees and charges set out in the Schedule hereto shall be allowed as costs in the cause.

3. All fees and charges paid to or recovered by the Central Finger Print Bureau under these Rules shall be paid into the General Revenue of the Colony.
