THE LAND TITLES ORDINANCE, 1908.

RULES.

PURSUANT to the powers conferred upon him by Section 52 of the Land Titles Ordinance, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Custody of Documents (Fees) Rules, 1924."

2. On and after the 1st day of December, 1924, a fee of two shillings per certificate per month or part of a month shall be charged for the custody by the Recorder of Titles of Certificates of Ownership which are ready for delivery on that date or thereafter; provided that the Recorder of Titles at his discretion shall have power to remit the whole or any portion of such fee in cases where it is shown to his satisfaction that good and sufficient reason exists for such remission or partial remission.

3. The fee prescribed in Rule No. 2 *supra* shall be in addition to, and not in substitution of, other fees payable on such certificates as prescribed under the Ordinance its Rules and Amendments.

4. These Rules shall apply to certificates relating to land situate on Mombasa Island only.
