THE EAST AFRICA FUGITIVE OFFENDERS ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, 1924.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Article 3 of the East Africa Fugitive Offenders Order-in-Council, 1924, it is provided that the Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, shall cause the aforesaid order to be proclaimed in the said Colony and Protectorate and that the said order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by such proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, Robert Thorne Coryndon, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, do hereby proclaim and publish the said Order-in-Council.

And I do further proclaim and declare that the said order shall come into operation in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya on the 1st day of January in the year of Our Lord, nineteen hundred and twenty-five.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the third day of December, 1920, and entitled "The East Africa Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1920" (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order) it is provided that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to the Colony of Kenya and the territories named in the first column of the Schedule of the said Order:

And whereas by certain Orders in Council mentioned in the second column of the said Schedule and respectively set opposite to the names of the said territories specified as aforesaid in the first column thereof the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, was applied to the said territories respectively as if each of them were a British Possession:

And whereas it is expedient to make further provision as to the exercise in the said territories (hereinafter referred to as the territories concerned) of the jurisdiction of a Magistrate under the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The East Africa Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1924" and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order.

- 2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Orders in Council mentioned in the second column of the Schedule to the Principal Order or any of them, in the application of the Fugitive Offenders Act. 1881, to each of the territories concerned there shall be substituted for a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace of a Colony or British Possession any such magistrate in that territory as may be duly appointed by the Governor in that behalf to exercise jurisdiction either under the whole of the said Act or under any Part thereof specified by the Governor.
- 3. The term "Governor" in this Order means in the case of Zanzibar the British Resident and includes in the case of each of the territories concerned the Officer for the time being administering the government thereof, and the Governor of each of the territories concerned shall cause this Order to be proclaimed therein, and this Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by such Proclamation.
- 4. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable James Henry Thomas, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903,

AND

THE TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1906.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, and by the Townships Ordinance, 1906, and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Mombasa Cemeteries (Amendment) Rules, 1924," and shall be read as one with the Mombasa Cemeteries Rules, 1919, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."
- 2. Rules 9 and 10 of the Principal Rules shall be re-numbered 11 and 12 respectively.
- 3. The Principal Rules are hereby further amended by the addition after Rule 8 of the following Rules:—
 - "9. The Trustees of any licensed cemetery shall keep a register of all burials which take place in that cemetery and shall produce such register for inspection when required by the Resident Commissioner or by the Police or by the Medical Officer of Health, or by the Superintendent of Conservancy.
 - 10. Any person applying to the Police or other appropriate Government authority for burial permits must state in what cemetery the body will be buried, and the name of the cemetery shall then be endorsed on the permit."

THE PASSPORT FEES ORDINANCE, 1904.

NOTICE.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Passport Fees Ordmance, 1904, notice is hereby given that the fees leviable in respect of passports issued in the Colony and Protectorate on and after the date hereof shall be Shs. 7/50 and that the fee leviable for each year for which a passport may be renewed shall be Sh. 1.

All previous notices issued under the aforesaid Ordinance are hereby revoked.

Conditions respecting the issue of Passports.

- 1. Applications for passports must be made in the form provided for that purpose, and inclosed in a cover addressed to "The Superintendent of Police, Nairobi." Forms may be obtained from the Superintendent of Police, Nairobi, or at the offices of the various Resident and District Commissioners.
- 2. The charge for a pasport is Shs. 7/50. Passports are issued by the Superintendent of Police, Nairobi, during office hours. Applicants who do not reside in Nairobi and are unable to attend at the office of the Superintendent of Police, Nairobi, in person may send their applications by post enclosing a remittance for the amount due. Passports so granted will be sent to them at the address given. The only postage stamps which will be accepted in payment of this fee are:—One of each of the following denominations of current stamps of Kenya in mint condition, Shs. 5, Shs. 2 and Cents 50.

No cheques will be accepted.

- (1) To natural-born British subjects;
- (2) To the wives and widows of such persons; and
- (3) To persons naturalized in the United Kingdom in the British Coloniés, or in India;
 - (4) To natives of British Protectorates.
 - A married woman is deemed to be a subject of the State of which her husband is for the time being a subject
 - The widow of an alien is deemed to be an alien.
 - The widow of a British subject is deemed to be a British subject.
- 4. Passports may be granted upon the production of a declaration by the applicant in the form provided for that purpose, verified by a declaration made by any Justice of the Peace, Banker, Minister of Religion, Doctor, Lawyer or Public Official of the Colony or Protectorate. The applicant's certificate of birth may also be required.
- 5. If the applicant for a passport be a naturalized British subject, the Certificate of Naturalization must be produced with the Declaration or Letter of Recommendation.

Naturalized British subjects and British protected persons will be described as such in their passports, which will be issued subject to the necessary qualifications.

- 6. Every application for a passport must be accompanied by a photograph in duplicate of the applicant, and of his wife, if the passport is to include her. The dimensions of the photographs should not exceed those of an ordinary postcard.
- 7. No member of the applicant's family or household whose age exceeds 16 years can be included in his passport, with the exception of his wife. In all other cases a separate passport is required.
- 8. All passports presented for renewal after the 1st January, 1925, the validity of which has already expired or will shortly expire, may be renewed from the date of expiration for any period from one to five years at the option of the holder; provided that in no case shall the validity of a passport be extended beyond ten years from the original date of issue. On the expiration of that period, or, if at any time the space provided for visas is covered and the holder wishes to travel to countries for which fresh visas are required, a new passport must be taken out.
- 9. The fee chargeable for the renewal of a passport under these regulations will be one shilling for each year for which it is renewed. No postage stamps of a lower denomination than Sh. 1 will be accepted for a renewal.
- 10. Holders of passports should before leaving Colony and Protectorate obtain the *visa* of the Consular representative of any foreign country they may intend to visit.
- 11. The Passport Regulations published at pages 505 and 561 of the Official Gazette for the year 1915 are hereby cancelled.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1922.

BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor-in-Council, have made the following Bye-laws:—

- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi (Water) Bye-laws, 1924," and shall be read as one with Nairobi Township Rules, 1917.
- 2. No pipes or fittings connecting with the Corporation water mains, whether situated inside or outside of the Township shall be laid, removed, altered or extended on the property of any consumers until full details of the proposed work and of the materials to be used thereon have been submitted to and approved by the Municipal Engineer, and the scheme for which such work shall have been authorised shall not be put into operation till a certificate of approval of the work has been granted by the Municipal Engineer.
- 3. No plumber who has not been enrolled by the Corporation as an "Authorised Waterworks Plumber" will be allowed to do any work connected with the supply of water from the Corporation's mains. All plumbers so enrolled must engage themselves to conform to and comply with the Corporation's regulations. Any person holding a plumber's certificate from any recognised Society or Association competent to grant such certificate shall be eligible for enrolment as an authorised waterworks plumber.

If at any time after enrolment, any such plumber wilfully infringes the said regulations, either by himself or his workmen, or refuses to communicate any needful and proper information required of him by the Corporation officials in regard to any work connected with the distribution of water supplied by the Corporation done by him or his workmen, or under his superintendence, or upon his responsibility, his name may be erased by the Corporation from the list of "Authorised Waterworks Plumbers."

All plumbers enrolled in accordance with the Bye-law will be considered as licensed to undertake any work connected with sewerage or drainage, and the terms of this Bye-law will apply equally to such work.

- 4. The charges for water in respect of standpipes installed outside houses after the date of these Bye-laws shall be 50% in excess of those specified in the Nairobi (Water Rates) Bye-laws, 1923.
 - 5. (a) All repairs to and renewals of pipes, taps, fittings or apparatus lying on the consumer's side of the Corporation stopcock; or, if there is no stop-cock, of the point where the service pipe crosses his plot boundary, shall be executed by and at the expense of the owner's or consumer's neglect to keep such pipes, taps, fittings or apparatus in repair, the Corporation will accept no responsibility for same.

Such repairs and renewals exclusive of those within the building may, at the request of the consumer or owner be executed by the Corporation, but all material and labour in connection with same must be paid for, in advance, by the consumer or owner.

The Corporation will not be responsible for water wasted or damage of any kind due to defects on the consumer's side of the stop-cock, or, if there is no stop-cock, of the plot boundary.

- (b) All repairs to and renewals of pipes, taps, fittings or apparatus lying between the Corporation main and the stopcock, or, if there is no stop-cock, the point where the service pipe crosses the plot boundary, shall be executed by and at the expense of the Corporation.
- 6. When any payment due to the Corporation under these Bye-laws is in arrear, the Corporation may disconnect the water supply from the premises in respect of which such default has occurred and may refuse to reconnect such supply until payment has been made of the amount so due together with a reconnection charge of Shs. 0.
