EAST AFRICAN CURRENCY BOARD.

THE following regulations are published for general information.

REGULATIONS DEFINING THE CONSTITUTION, DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE EAST AFRICAN CURRENCY BOARD.

1. The East African Currency Board will provide for and control the supply of currency to the Kenya Colony and Protectorate, the Uganda Protectorate, the Tanganyika Territory, and any other Dependencies in East Africa which may be added by the Secretary of State, to ensure that the currency is maintained in satisfactory condition, and generally to watch over the interests of the said Dependencies so far as currency is concerned.

2. The members of the Board and the Secretary are appointed by the Secretary of State.

3. The Board will have power to appoint officers for the discharge of such duties in connection with currency in the United Kingdom or in East Africa, and at such rates of salary as the Board may think fit, subject in each case to the approval of the Secretary of State.

4. The Board will, in accordance with Section 9 of the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) (No. 2) Order-in-Council, 1920, take over the powers, rights, duties, assets, and obligations of the Currency Board established for the purposes of the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order-in-Council, 1905.

5. The Board is authorised to incur expenditure necessary for the due performance of such duties as are now or may be hereafter assigned to them.

6. The Board will have authority to make all necessary arrangements for the minting of any special coins authorised for circulation in the said Dependencies and to comply with applications for the supply of any coins at the time being legally current in those Dependencies. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations and of any legislation from time to time in force in East Africa, they may provide, and may issue and re-issue in East Africa, notes hereinafter referred to as currency notes. They will arrange for the supply of currency in exchange for the coins and notes at present current in the Dependencies so long as these remain legal tender.

7. The Board may charge for coin or currency notes to be delivered in East Africa against prepayment in London such premium above the nominal value (at the rate of twenty shillings to the pound), not exceeding the actual cost of transporting specie (packing, carriage, insurance), as they may think fit, and may vary the charge from time to time within this limit. If coin or notes are delivered on telegraphic order to East Africa, the Board may increase the premium as they think fit.

8. The Board will, when required, arrange for the issue against silver or notes tendered in East Africa of drafts payable in sterling in London at a charge not exceeding the cost of transporting specie from East Africa to London, and may at their discretion issue telegraphic transfers on London on such terms as they may think fit.

9. Currency notes may be for such denominations as may be fixed by the Board.

10. The plates from which the currency notes are printed shall be of such designs and shall bear such devices as the Secretary of State shall approve, and shall be prepared by a person selected by the Board. The Board shall be responsible for their safe custody.

11. The currency notes shall be printed on such paper as may be approved by the Board, and shall be authenticated by facsimiles of the signatures of the members of the Board for the time being.

12. The Board shall make such arrangements as they may from time to time think necessary or proper for the cancellation of notes which have become unfit for further use, for the destruction of such cancelled notes, and for recording the issue and cancellation of notes.

13. Proceeds of the sale of coin and currency notes and all other revenue of the Board shall, after the necessary deductions have been made for all expenses and for any contributions made to the revenue of the East African Governments under Section 19 of these regulations, be credited to a fund hereinafter referred to as the Currency Reserve Fund. Any losses which may be incurred will be debited to the fund.

14. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 19 of these regulations, the Board may invest their funds in securities of the Government of any part of His Majesty's dominions, or in such other manner as the Secretary of State may approve. The extent to which investments may be made will be left to the discretion of the Board, whose duty it will be to hold, subject to any directions which may be received from the Secretary of State, a proportion of its reserve in a liquid form.

15. The Board shall submit half-yearly to the Secretary of State a statement of the position of the Currency Reserve Fund on the last day of the half-year, including a statement of securities.

16. The Board shall cause to be published half-yearly in the Kenya Government Gazette an abstract showing (a) the whole amount of the East African coinage and currency notes in circulation on the last day of the half-year; (b) the total amount of the Currency Reserve Fund on the said day; (c) the nominal value of, the price paid for, and the latest known market price of the securities forming the investment portion of the Reserve Fund.

17. The accounts of all the transactions of the Board will be audited by the Colonial Audit Department.

18. The Board will submit annually for the approval of the Secretary of State a statement of their transactions during the preceding year.

19. When the Board are satisfied that their reserves are more than sufficient for all the purposes for which such reserves may be required, they may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, pay over the whole or any part of the surplus amount in aid of the revenues of the Dependencies in East Africa in such proportions as may be hereafter determined.

20. These regulations shall be deemed to have been in force as from the 1st of July, 1923.

COMMISSIONS IN THE IMPERIAL
MILITARY FORCES.

THE following extract from a Colonial Office Circular Despatch, dated the 9th December, 1924, is published for general information:—

“Regarding the position in relation to the holding of Commissions in an Imperial Military Force of officers who are appointed to posts under a Colonial or Protectorate Government, I have the honour to inform you that, in view of certain changes both in status and nomenclature which some of these forces have undergone since the war, I think it desirable to set out clearly the position in this matter as it stands at present.

2. The Special Reserve of Officers has ceased to exist, and has given place to a new force of Militia, commissions in which may be held on the same conditions as commissions in the Special Reserve which it replaces.

3. The old Territorial Force and Territorial Force Reserve are now known as the Territorial Army and the Territorial Army Reserve. Officers holding commissions in the latter, unlike their predecessors in the Territorial Force Reserve, will be allowed to retain their commissions whilst in permanent Colonial, etc., employment. They will be transferred to Class 2 of the Reserve, and earmarked as not available on mobilisation, thus being placed in the same position as officers of the Regular Army Reserve of Officers.

4. There has also been instituted a Supplementary Reserve, but commissions in this force are not granted to persons residing outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

5. It follows therefore that—

(a) Officers of the Militia and those on the Active List of the Territorial Army may retain their commissions on appointment to military posts, or to probationary or temporary civil posts in a Colony, Protectorate or Mandated Territory, and will not be liable to be recalled for military training or military duty.

(b) Officers of the Regular Army Reserve of Officers and the Territorial Army Reserve of Officers, with the exception of those appointed to the General Reserve from the Officers Training Corps, may retain their commissions whilst in permanent, probationary or temporary employment in a Colony, Protectorate or Mandated Territory, whether civil or military, and will not be liable to recall to military duty or training of any description whilst so employed.

(c) Officers of the Supplementary Reserve and those of the General Reserve appointed thereto from the Officers Training Corps must resign their commissions on employment to a post under a Colonial, etc., Government.”

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1922.

BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by Section 48 of the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, the Nairobi Corporation have made the following Bye-laws which have been confirmed by the Central Board of Health and approved by the Governor in accordance with Section 16 of "The Public Health Ordinance, 1921."

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Nairobi (Buildings) Bye-laws, 1925," and shall be read as one with Nairobi Township Rules, 1917.

2. From the date hereof every building, subject to the exceptions stated hereinafter erected on any plot or sub-plot abutting on any of the streets named in the Schedule hereto shall be constructed as to the external walls thereof wholly of stone, brick or concrete:—

Exceptions:—

(1) Any building the plans for which were approved within the period of two years before the date hereof.

(2) Any building designed to be used exclusively as a conservatory or plant house.

(3) Any building designed to be used exclusively for a poultry house, garden tool house, cycle, rickshaw or motor shed or temporary clerk of works office.

(4) Any building designed to be used exclusively as a workshop, and not covering more than 600 square feet of surface, and not divided internally by partitions or walls.

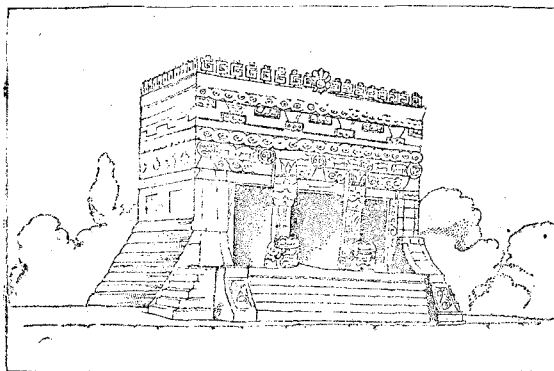

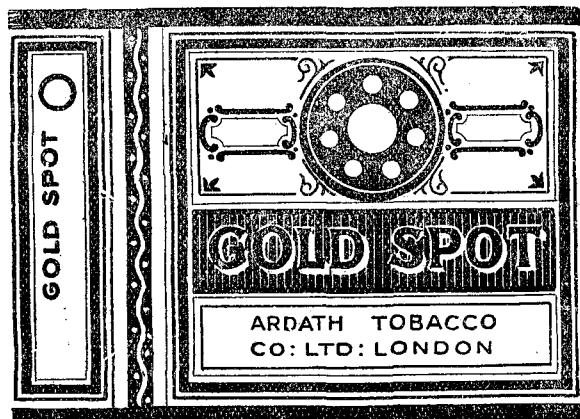

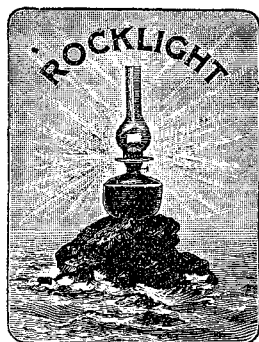
