## THE KENYA COLONY AND PROTECTORATE

(BOUNDARIES) ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, 1921.

PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by Article 3 (1) of the Kenya Colony and Protectorate (Boundaries) Order-in-Council, 1921, I, Edward Brandis Denham, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby declare that the boundary between the Districts of Digo and Malindi in the Coast Province shall be modified and that Schedule 2 of Proclamation 54, dated the 25th day of February, 1924, shall be and is amended as follows:—

(a) by the deletion, under the heading "Boundaries of Digo District" of the seventh paragraph from the end thereof, consisting of the words:—

"thence by the Southern and Eastern boundaries of that station reserve to the intersection of the latter with the Southern 100-foot zone of the Uganda Railway;"

and by the substitution therefor of the following paragraphs:—

"thence North-easterly by the straight line between that point and the intersection of the straight line between the summits of the Hills Maungu and Loga with the Galana (or Sabaki) River, as rar as its intersection with the parallel 3° 40′ South;

"thence by that parallel Eastwards to a point due North of a Cairn near the source of the Maji-ya-Chumvi River, and onwards by a straight line to that source;

"thence by that river down-stream to its intersection with the Southern 100-foot zone of the Uganda Railway;" and

(b) by the deletion, under the heading "Boundaries of Malindi District" of the three last paragraphs thereof and of the following words in the fourth paragraph from the end thereof:—

"to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of Mackinnon Road Station Reserve"

and by the substitution therefor in the fourth paragraph from the end thereof, of the words:—

"to its intersection with the Maji-ya-Chumvi River;" and of the following paragraphs thereafter:—

"thence by that river up-stream to its source marked by a Cairn, and onwards by a straight line to that Cairn;

"thence by a straight line due North to its intersection with the parallel  $3^{\circ}$  40' South;

"thence Westwards by that parallel to its intersection with the straight line between the South-west corner of Mackinnon Road Station Reserve and the intersection of the straight line between the summits of the Hills Maungu and Loga with the Galana (or Sabaki) River;

"thence by the former straight line North-easterly to the point of commencement."
