THE RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF JUDGMENTS ORDINANCE, 1922.

PROCLAMATION.

E. B. DENHAM.



BY His Excellency Edward Brandis Denham, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments Ordinance, 1922," it is enacted that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions (including countries under His Majesty's protection) outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's Dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of the Colony of Kenya the Governor in Council may by Proclamation in the Gazette declare that this Ordinance shall extend to judgments obtained in a Superior Court in that part of His Majesty's Dominions in like manner as it extends to judgments in a Superior Court in the United Kingdom and on any such Proclamation being made this Ordinance shall extend accordingly.

And whereas. I am satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of the Protectorate of British Somaliland for the enforcement within that territory of judgments made by the Supreme Court of this Colony.

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, having taken the advice of my Executive Council, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Ordinance are extended to judgments made by the Superior Courts of the Protectorate of British Somaliland.

This Proclamation shall take effect as from the 1st day of January, 1925.

Further I do hereby revoke Proclamation No. 15 published in the Official Gazette, 1925, page 129.

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

Township of Mombasa.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, and by the General Revision Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules.

EXPLOSIVE RULES.

- 1. These Rules shad apply to the Township of Mombasa and may be cited as "The Mombasa Explosive Rules, 1925."
- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Rules, dated the 20th day of March, 1915, issued under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, and published as Government Notice No. 60 in the Official Gazette for 1915, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to issue a licence or licences to any person or persons authorising the storage of any explosive or explosives within the Township of Mombasa.
- 3. Any licence issued under the last preceding Rule shall be subject to such terms and conditions as the Governor in Council may see fit to impose.
- 4. Any licencee who by himself, his servant or agent contravenes any term or condition upon which his licence was granted shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding £100.
- 5. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time without reason assigned, to make an order revoking any licence granted under these Rules and such revocation shall take effect from any date which may be specified in the order of revocation.
- 6. These Rules shall remain in force till the 1st day of November, 1925.
