PROCLAMATION.

BY His Excellency Edward Brandis Denham, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

WHEREAS by Section 10 of the Maintenance Orders Enforcement Ordinance, 1921, as amended by the Maintenance Orders Enforcement (Amedment) Ordinance, 1922, it is enacted that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of any British Possession or any Territory under His Majesty's protection for the enforcement within such possession or territory of maintenance orders made by the Courts in the Colony or Protectorate of Kenya, the Governor may by Proclamation extend this Ordinance to maintenance orders made by the Courts within such possession or territory and thereupon this Ordinance shall apply to such maintenance orders as if they had been made in England or in Ireland.

And whereas I am satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of the Colony of Mauritius for the enforcement within that Colony of maintenance orders made by the Courts of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

Now therefore, by virtue of the powers in me vested as aforesaid I do hereby proclaim and declare that the provisions of the said Ordinance are extended to maintenance orders made by the Courts in the Colony of Mauritius.

This Proclamation shall take effect as from the 31st day of January, 1925.
