EXEMPTION FROM CUSTOMS' DUTY OF METHYLATED SPIRITS USED SOLELY FOR THE DESTRUCTION OF INSECT PESTS ON TREES OR PLANTS.

IMPORTATION of methylated spirits intended solely for use in the destruction of insect pests on trees or plants will be allowed free admission under Table V (54) of the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1923, only on production of a certificate to that effect, duly recommended by the Hon. Director of Agriculture.

A refund of the Duty paid by methylated spirit dealers on methylated spirit imported by them, and subsequently disposed of for use solely in connection with the destruction of insect pests on trees and plants, will be made on submission of the requisite vouchers supported by certificates from purchasers in the prescribed form.

Certificate forms may be obtained on application from the office of the Department of Agriculture, Nairobi.
