THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

#### RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Mombasa Township Rules, 1925," and shall be read as one with the Rules, dated 13th day of June, 1912, published in the Gazette of 1912, page 442, hereinafter called "the Principal Rules" and all amendments thereto.
- 2. Rule 3 of the Principal Rules is amended by the addition of the following provise:—

"Provided that the Resident Commissioner may grant special free permits if he is satisfied that the animal is to be slaughtered for religious purposes only."

## THE NATIVE AUTHORITY (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1924.

#### Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Native Authority (Amendment) Ordinance, 1924, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Local Native Councils (Procedure) Rules, 1925.
- 2. Under these Rules the expressions "the President" and "the Chair" shall include any officer presiding at a meeting of a Local Native Council. "Council" means a Local Native Council.
- 3. The President of a Local Native Council shall, when practicable, cause notice of the date, hour and place of every session of the Council to be sent to each member so as to reach his ordinary place of residence at least one week before the date fixed for the meeting.

. 0

- 4. Any member of the Council who is unable to attend any meeting shall notify the President without delay of his inability to attend and of the reasons therefor. Such notification shall where possible be made in writing.
- 5. Any member who is absent from three consecutive meetings of the Council without adequate reason to the satisfaction of the President shall be deemed to have vacated his seat and a new member may be appointed in his place.
- 6. Not less than two-thirds of the duly appointed members of the Council shall form a quorum.
- 7. During the proceedings of the Council members shall occupy the seats allotted to them by the President.
- 8. The following shall be the order of business at Local Native Councils:—
  - 1. Confirmation of Minutes.
  - 2. Communications from the Chair.
  - 3. Petitions.
  - 4. Questions.
  - Motions.
- 9. A member of the Council may ask any other member who holds an official appointment any question relating to matters coming within the scope of the latter's duties.
- 10. The President may disallow any question or motion which is in his opinion undesirable in the public interest.
- 11. Every member other than the President shall stand in his place when speaking and shall address the Chair.
- 12. If more than one member rises to speak the President shall decide who shall speak first whereupon all others shall resume their seats.
- 13. The President shall at his discretion decide whether a member who has already spoken to a motion may speak again to the same motion, provided that the mover of a motion shall have the right of reply to the debate thereon.
- 14. When the question has been put from the Chair no member may speak again to the motion except to vote "aye" or "no." The question shall be decided on the majority of votes, the President having both a deliberative and a casting vote.
- 15. (i) No member shall interrupt any other member while speaking, or use any offensive expression or conduct himself in a disorderly or unseemly manner.
- (ii) Any member who persistently offends against the provisions of this rule or who is guilty of disrespect or disobedience to the Chair may be suspended by the President from the service of the Council and may be required to withdraw from the meeting.
- 16. The Chief Native Commissioner and the Senior Commissioner of the Province in which a Local Native Council is established shall have the right to attend and speak at any meeting of the Council. Save as aforesaid, no person who is not a member of the Council shall take part in any debate except by the express invitation of the President.
- 17. The public may at the discretion of the President be admitted to meetings of the Council. Any member of the public who interrupts the proceedings of the Council or behaves in a disorderly or objectionable manner may be ejected from the meeting by order of the President.

#### THE NATIVE REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1921.

#### Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules.

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Native Registration (Kyambu) Rules, 1925."
- 2. Every person resident in Kyambu District employing a native registered under the provisions of the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, shall render to the District Commissioner, Kyambu, a Special Return after the 1st day of June and before the 7th day of June, 1925. Such Special Return shall be made upon a form as set out in the Schedule annexed to this Rule and shall include the following information:—
  - (a) Name of employer (or firm or company) his residential and postal address, his administrative district, the date on which the return is submitted.
  - (b) The registration number and name of any native in the employer's service on the 1st June, 1925, and the date of engagement of such native.
  - (c) The registration number and name of any native discharged or having deserted or died during the month of May 1925, and the date on which such discharge, desertion, or death took place.
  - (d) The registration number and name of any native who has been in the employer's service who having gone on leave or left such employer's service without being signed off and who has not returned to such employer's service within the period of his contract, and who has not been reported by such employer on a previous Labour Return as having been discharged or as having left such employer's service and the date of such native's departure from such employer's service.
