MARRIAGE.

THE FOREIGN MARRIAGES ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1925.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of February, 1925.

PRESENT,

The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, (a) His Majesty the King in Council is authorised to make Regulations for the purposes therein specified:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, (b) have been complied with in respect of the Regulations hereinafter set forth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Foreign Marriage Act, 1892, or otherwise enabling Him in this behalf is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following articles are respectively substituted for Articles, 9 and 10 of "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913" (c):—

9. If the non-resident party has dwelt in a place in Great Britain or Northern Ireland, notice shall be given by that party in like manner and on payment of the like fee as if that party

were about to be married in that place, and in England, Wales or Northern Ireland shall be given to the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar, and in Scotland shall be given by proclamation of banns; and the Superintendent Registrar or Registrar shall deal with the notice and give a certificate for marriage in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district; and the Sessions Clerk of the parish in which the banns were proclaimed in Scotland shall, in like manner and on payment of the like fee as in the case of a marriage in his district, give a certificate of proclamation of such banns.

10. If the non-resident party has dwelt in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland, notice shall be given by that party—

- (a) in accordance with any law of that part of His Majesty's Dominions or, in the case of India, of the Governor-General of India in Council, as the case may be, giving effect to these Regulations, or to any repealed or future Order in Council under the Foreign Marriage Act; or
- (b) in like manner as if the party were about to be married in that place;

and a certificate by a marriage registrar or other like officer, of the giving of such notice, shall be obtained by such party, subject always to the law in force permitting of such notice being given and to the said officer being empowered to issue such certificate.

2. In Article 11 of "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," the words "any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland" are substituted for the words "any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the British Islands"; and in Article 22 of the said Order in Council the words "British Islands" are struck out.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 6th day of February, 1925.

4. (1) This Order may be cited as "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1925," and this Order and "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," may be cited together as "The Foreign Marriages Orders in Council, 1913 and 1925."

(2) All copies of "The Foreign Marriages Order in Council, 1913," which are printed after the coming into operation of this Order shall be printed with the amendments, whether by way of substitution, addition or omission, required by this Order.

And the Right Honourable Joseph Austen Chamberlain, the Right Honourable Leopold Charles Maurice Stennett Amery and the Right Honourable the Earl of Birkenhead, three of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

OIL PRODUCTION ORDINANCE, 1923.

REGULATIONS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Oil Production Ordinance, 1923, Section 7, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations.

Title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "the Oil Production Regulations, 1925."

Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these Regulations except where the subject matter or context requires a different construction, the terms to which special meanings are assigned by the Ordinance shall wherever they occur in these Regulations have the same meanings as are so assigned to them respectively.

PART I.

*Exploration Licences.**Exploration Licence.*

3. The Commissioner of Mines may, with the approval of the Governor, grant exploration licences to search for oil.

Method of Application.

4. Application for exploration licences shall be accompanied by the following particulars:—

(a) A sketch showing the area which it is desired to explore, and a description sufficient to identify the land, and its boundaries.

(b) Nationality and race of applicant.

(c) Proof of means to the extent of one hundred shillings for each square mile of the area under application.

(d) A fee of thirty shillings for each square mile applied for, provided that the Governor may reduce such fee at his sole discretion; or he may authorise the refund of a portion of such fee after the licence has been granted. If the application is refused the whole of the fee will be returned.

Terms and conditions.

5. An exploration licence shall be for such term and subject to such conditions as the Governor may direct, and shall be for a maximum term of one year renewable as hereinafter provided.

Surface Rights.

6. An exploration licence shall confer only such surface rights as are absolutely necessary for making an adequate geological examination of the area the subject of the licence, and the licensee shall not be permitted to dig and turn up the surface of the land to a depth exceeding 50 feet for such purpose.

Mineral Rights.

7. An exploration licence may confer the sole right of searching for oil, but shall not debar, or be construed as debarring licensees from entering the land to search for, to mine or to win minerals.

Survey.

8. The Commissioner of Mines may require the licensee to have the area the subject of his licence surveyed under the direction of the Director of Surveys, and to supply plans of the area, at the sole cost of the licensee.

Right of application for prospecting licences.

9. An exploration licence shall confer upon the licensee the preferential right, during the term of the licence, to apply for oil prospecting licences.

Transfer.

10. A licensee shall not assign his licence or any interest thereunder without the written consent of the Commissioner of Mines, for which consent a fee of ten shillings shall be paid by the licensee.

Notice in Gazette.

11. The Commissioner of Mines shall cause notice of every exploration licence granted to be published in the Gazette.

Compliance with conditions and reporting discoveries.

12. A licensee shall furnish the Commissioner of Mines, whenever required by him, with satisfactory evidence of compliance with the provisions of his licence; and shall report forthwith to the Commissioner of Mines the discovery of oil, or oil-bearing strata.

Extension of term.

13. The Commissioner of Mines may, with the approval of the Governor, and by proclamation in the Gazette, extend the term of any exploration licence, provided that a further fee as prescribed in Regulation 4 (d) hereof shall be payable on application for extension, and that no period of extension shall be for more than one year.

PART II.

*Oil Prospecting Licences.**Prospecting Licences.*

14. The Commissioner of Mines may, with the approval of the Governor, grant oil prospecting licences.

Method of application.

15. Application for oil prospecting licences shall be accompanied by the following particulars:—

- (a) A sketch showing the area over which it is desired to prospect and a description sufficient to identify the land and its boundaries.
- (b) Nationality and race of applicant.
- (c) Proof of means to the extent of twenty shillings for each acre of the area under application.
- (d) A fee of one shilling for each acre applied for.

16. Regulations 8, 10, 11 and 12 of these Regulations shall apply also to oil prospecting licences.

Mineral Rights.

17. An oil prospecting licence shall confer the sole right of prospecting for oil, but shall not debar, or be construed as debarring, licensees from entering the land the subject of the licence to prospect for, to mine or to win minerals.

Right of application for oil lease.

18. An oil prospecting licence shall confer upon the holder the right to undertake prospective drilling over the area the subject of the licence for which purpose the licensee may put down any number of experimental bore holes, and shall also confer a preferential right, during the term of the licence, to oil leases.

Right to use oil.

19. An oil prospecting licence shall confer upon the holder the right to remove and use not more than 100 tons of oil discovered for further oil prospecting or mining operations, but shall not confer the right to sell or export any oil from the area.

Right to sell oil.

20. The Governor may grant permission to the holder of an oil prospecting licence to sell or export oil from the area, subject to the payment of royalties as prescribed for oil obtained under leases.

Term.

21. An oil prospecting licence shall be for such term and subject to such conditions as the Governor may direct, but shall not be for a period more than three years, renewable as hereinafter provided.

Extension of term.

22. The Commissioner of Mines may with the approval of the Governor and by proclamation in the Gazette extend the term of any oil prospecting licence, provided that a further fee as prescribed in Regulation 15 (d) hereof shall be payable on application for extension, and that no period of extension shall be for more than one year.

Working conditions.

23. The Governor may declare working conditions to be observed by the holder of an oil prospecting licence.

PART III.

*Oil Leases.**Oil Leases.*

24. The Governor may grant oil leases to the holders of oil prospecting licences.

Method of application.

25. Application for leases shall be made to the Commissioner of Mines and shall be accompanied by:—

(a) A sketch of the area applied for and a description sufficient to identify the land and its boundaries.

(b) Proof of means to the extent of one hundred shillings for each acre of the area under application.

(c) If not already submitted, satisfactory evidence of compliance with the terms and conditions which attached to the oil prospecting licence.

(d) The first year's rent of two shillings per acre.

(e) A deposit of five hundred shillings for each lease applied for, towards the cost of preparation of the lease, stamp duty, and registration fees, etc.

Survey.

26. So soon as the applicant has been informed that a lease will be granted to him, he shall cause the land to be surveyed at his own cost, and shall furnish the Commissioner of Mines with suitable plans countersigned by the Director of Surveys for attaching to the lease.

Private land.

27. Before an oil lease is granted over private land, the applicant shall prove to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Mines that he has made satisfactory arrangements with the land owner with which all parties are agreed.

Terms.

28. An oil lease shall be for twenty-one years, subject to renewal for further periods of ten years each upon compliance with the terms and conditions of the lease.

Area.

29. The maximum area for each oil lease shall be 10 square miles, but the Governor may at his discretion grant such further leases to the same lessees.

Rights of lessee.

30. A lease shall confer upon the lessee *inter alia* the following rights:—

(a) Such surface rights only as are absolutely necessary for the effective winning and disposal of oil both by searching and obtaining and by the manufacture and refining of the crude product.

(b) The right to search, get, win, obtain, possess, make merchantable, sell, use and export oil or its products found within the area the subject of the lease.

Covenants by lessee.

31. A lessee shall be bound *inter alia* by the following covenants:—

(a) To pay the annual rent on the first of January in each year.

(b) To pay royalty as and when it becomes due.

(c) Not to use the land leased for purposes other than mining or treating oil as authorised by law.

(d) To comply with the working conditions as prescribed from time to time by regulation.

(c) To furnish the Commissioner of Mines as prescribed by regulation with full and true returns of all oil won and treated.

Refinery.

32. No person shall erect an oil refinery in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya without the sanction of the Governor.

Fees.

33. The fees prescribed in the Schedule hereto shall be levied in respect of the several matters therein mentioned.

KENYA PRISONS.

GENERAL ORDER AS TO PRISONS IN WHICH PRISONERS
ARE TO BE CONFINED.

Section 45 of the Prisons Ordinance, 1914.

1. Every prisoner sentenced to over 12 months imprisonment in any part of the Kerio, Kikuyu, Masai, Northern Frontier and Ukamba Provinces (excluding the Taita District), or in the extra Provincial Districts of Turkana, Trans-Nzoia, Uasin Gishu, Nakuru, Naivasha and Laikipia, will be sent as soon as his sentence has been confirmed, to the First Class Prison at Nairobi.

2. Every prisoner sentenced to over 12 months imprisonment in any part of the Coast and Jubaland Provinces, in the extra Provincial District of Mombasa, or in the Taita District, will be sent as soon as his sentence has been confirmed, to the First Class Prison at Mombasa.

3. Every prisoner sentenced to over 12 months imprisonment in any part of the Nyanza Province, will be sent as soon as his sentence has been confirmed, to the First Class Prison at Kisumu.

4. Every prisoner sentenced to over 6 months but not exceeding 12 months imprisonment, will be sent to one or other of the three Second Class Prisons at Lamu, Nakuru and Nyeri, or to the nearest First Class Prison if more convenient.

5. Short term prisoners, *i.e.*, those whose sentence do not exceed 6 months, will be retained at the Third Class Prison nearest to the place where sentence is passed, provided that, if overcrowding of the prison is thereby caused, prisoners undergoing sentences of over 3 months shall be transferred to the nearest First Class or Second Class Prison.

6. Female prisoners sentenced to over 3 months imprisonment will be transferred to the nearest First Class Prison. Long term female convicts will be transferred to Mombasa Prison.

7. The classification of prisons in Kenya is as shown in Government Notice No. 168 appearing in the Official Gazette of 20th May, 1925.
