RESIDENT NATIVE LABOURERS' ORDINANCE, 1925.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on him by the Resident Native Labourers' Ordinance, 1925, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Resident Native Labourers (Registers) Rules, 1925."
- 2. The Registers required to be kept by an occupier under Sections 7 and 8 of the Resident Native Labourers Ordinance, 1925, shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto and shall be respectively referred to as the "Register of Natives" and the "Register of Stock."
- 3. When a contract has been entered into under Section 4 of the Resident Native Labourers Ordinance, 1925, the employer shall, at the conclusion of each day on which the person employed has worked thereunder, enter or cause to be entered in writing the letter "W" in the Register of Natives against the name of and in the column corresponding to the date on which the person employed has so worked. The amounts paid to each native and the date of payment shall be entered in the proper column.
- 4. Every occupier shall forthwith enter or cause to be entered in writing in the Register of Stock the particulars of stock belonging to natives lawfully residing on his farm, which may from time to time be brought to or born on or removed from or die on such farm. Any increase or decrease of such stock shall be shown as a resultant total or balance as the case may be, and shall be dated accordingly in the columns provided for those purposes in the said Register.
- 5. When a native may no longer lawfully reside on a farm under Section 3 of the Resident Native Labourers Ordinance, 1925, the occupier of such farm shall forthwith enter or cause to be entered in writing the reason thereof in the Remarks Column of the Register of Natives, and in the Register of Stock. All such entries shall be dated accordingly.

THE WITCHCRAFT BILL, 1925.

(Vide Official Gazette of 13th May, 1925).

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill repeals and replaces the existing law dealing with witchcraft.

It has been devised to give greater assistance in the stamping out of the practice of witchcraft and the evils ensuing therefrom.

Increased penalties are imposed.

Provisions are inserted which it is hoped will prevent the practice of accusing others to be witches but which will at the same time encourage people to report freely to Government officials any instances of the practice of witchcraft.

Power is given to enable District Officers to order persons practising witchcraft to reside in certain specified places.

After conviction for witchcraft the Judge may recommend that the convicted person be deported and he will then be dealt with under the provisions of the Deportation Ordinance.

THE REFORMATORY SCHOOLS AMENDMENT BILL, 1925.

(Vide Official Gazette of 25th March, 1925).

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is to enable boys up to the age of sixteen instead of fifteen years only, to be sent to Reformatory School and there to be detained for a minimum of three instead of two years.

THE VAGRANCY AMENDMENT BILL, 1925.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill amends the Principal Ordinance so as to give the Police powers to deal with itinerant fortune tellers as vagrants.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill has been drafted at the instance of the Secretary of State.

It provides that officers who were in the Service when the Scheme was initiated and who became contributors but did not make lump sum contribution may now do so, if passed as first class lives and that any officer who made a lump sum contribution not equal to the maximum may now increase it to the maximum.

THE PRISONS AMENDMENT BILL, 1925.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The principal object of this Bill is to repeal in the Principal Ordinance the sections concerning the enlistment and conditions of service of subordinate staff which are better dealt with by Rules.

The opportunity has been taken to effect alterations in the designations of officials.

Sections 5 and 6 of the Bill are intended to allow of the introduction of new Rules with regard to civil debtors.

THE BANKRUPTCY BILL.

(Vide Supplement No. 2 to Official Gazette of 10th June, 1925).

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to provide that the bankruptcy law of the Colony shall be identical, as far as possible, with the bankruptcy law of England.

To suit local conditions various modifications of the English law are necessary and effect has been given to these in the draft Bill.

The functions of the Board of Trade under the English Act are divided between the Supreme Court and the Official Receiver. The other duties of the Official Receiver are comparable with those of the Official Receiver in England.

Provision has been made for the enforcement by the Supreme Court of orders in bankruptcy made by the Courts of the other East African Dependencies.

It is anticipated that this will lead to the enactment of similar reciprocal provisions by the other dependencies.

THE SHOP HOURS BILL.

(Vide Official Gazette of 1st July, 1925).

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

This Bill is intended to regulate the conditions of employment of shop-assistants. In its main principles it follows the corresponding law which has worked successfully in England. Provision is made for weekly half holidays and an annual holiday; Sunday closing is made compulsory, hours of employment are controlled and intervals for meals are insisted upon. Exemptions for special trades and provisions for various contingencies are provided which will it is considered prevent the Bill being harsh in its incidence.

Provision is made for the application of the Ordinance to particular townships and other areas.


