# THE COLONIAL AUXILIARY FORCES OFFICERS' DECORATION.

### GEORGE R.I.

George the Fifth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King Defender of the Faith Emperor of India to all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual dated the ninth day of June one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one we were graciously pleased to make ordain and establish Rules and Ordinances for the government of The Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration reserving to Ourself Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling altering abrogating augmenting interpreting or dispensing with those regulations or any part thereof by a notification under Our Royal Sign Manual:

And whereas We are desirous that those upon whom the said Decoration has been or may be conferred shall be entitled to the addition after their names of the letters V.D.:

Now therefore We do by these Presents for Us Our Heirs and Successors make ordain and establish the following additional Rule and Ordinance:—

It is ordained that the Colonial Auxiliary Forces Officers' Decoration shall not confer any individual precedence but shall entitle the recipient to the addition after his name of the letters V.D.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this ninth day of May one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five in the sixteenth year of Our Reign.

#### NOTICE.

SAFARI VIA FORT PORTAL TO RUWENZORI AND THE BELGIAN CONGO.

IT is notified for general information that the Uganda Government do not supply porters to tourists visiting Fort Portal with a view to safari either on the Ruwenzori Range, to the Belgian Congo, or elsewhere.

- 2. A trading firm of Fort Portal, Messrs. J. Braganza and Company, Limited, will endeavour to provide porters, if notified of requirements not less than one month in advance, but no guarantee that they will be obtainable can be given. Fourists are strongly recommended to ascertain that the porters they require can be supplied before proceeding to Fort Portal. Arrangements for the supply of porters must include arrangements for feeding them, as on certain routes food is not obtainable at the camping places. A caravan cannot be permitted to leave the station unless the District Commissioner is satisfied that suitable arrangements for feeding the porters have been made. All inquiries and correspondence concerning porters and their rationing should be addressed to the above-named firm or to some other local agent, and not to the District Commissioner.
- 3. It is further notified that there is no hotel at Fort Portal, and that the sole accommodation available is afforded by a Royal East Africa Automobile Association Rest House, capable of housing four persons. Tourists should ascertain in advance whether accommodation in this Rest House will be available at the date on which they propose to reach Fort Portal. This information may be obtained by reply paid telegram to the District Commissioner, Fort Portal.
- 4. The following additional information is of importance to intending visitors:—

#### (1) SAFARI IN THE TORO DISTRICT.

Certain portions of the District are "Infected Areas' under the Sleeping Sickness Ordinance. The extent and position of these areas may be ascertained by inquiry from the Land Office, Entebbe, the Medical Office, Entebbe, or the District Commissioner's Office, Fort Portal. Entry into these areas is permitted in very special circumstances only, and permission will not be granted purely for purposes of sport. When entry into such areas is allowed, a Permit under the When entry Sleeping Sickness Rules must first be obtained from the District Commissioner. A Permit can only be issued on a Medical Certificate that all persons (including African boys, gun bearers, porters, etc.) accompanying the caravan have no symptoms of trypanosomiasis. Such persons will be examined by the District Medical Officer at a fee of Shs. 10/50 for an European or Asiatic and Sh. 1 for an African. All persons who have entered a Sleeping Sickness Infected Area may also be required, under the Ordinance, to submit themselves again to medical examination on leaving the area. No fee will be charged for this second examination.

- (2) SAFARI INTO THE BELGIAN CONGO.
- (a) All natives of the Protectorate accompanying the caravan must be registered with the District Commissioner and attested on a Foreign Contract of Service under the Master and Servants Ordinance, at a fee of Shs. 2 a head.
- (b) The Belgian Government require that a permit to enter a Sleeping Sickness Area should be obtained as in (1) above.
- (c) The Belgian Government further require that the leader of any caravan shall provide himself, before entering the Congo, with a Medical Certificate to the effect that none of the persons accompanying the caravan are suffering from active tuberculosis.
- 5. Intending tourists are strongly advised to pay close attention to the information given in this notice, particularly in paragraphs 2 and 3 thereof. Otherwise they may find that there is no accommodation for them on arrival at Fort Portal, or that, after a long and vexatious wait at Fort Portal, their proposed safari has to be abandoned.
