HIS Excellency the Governor regrets to announce the death at Nairobi of Mr. Frederick Strawbridge, Chief Sanitary Inspector, in the Medical Department on 29th November, 1925.

Mr. Strawbridge entered the service of this Colony on the 20th May, 1914. He was appointed on first arrival to the Health Office at Mombasa and after the outbreak of the War rendered valuable service as Officer in Charge of a large carrier collecting camp in South Kavirondo. Mr. Strawbridge was promoted Senior Sanitary Inspector in January, 1922 and Chief Sanitary Inspector in January, 1924. His work was always of the highest order and the services which he rendered as Secretary to the Central Board of Health were specially noteworthy.

THE following instructions from the Secretary of State for the Colonies are published for the information of those concerned and will come into force forthwith.

FIELD SERVICE DRESS: Pattern will be as follows :—

(a) Khaki tunic, military pattern, without shoulder straps, of drill or serge, with turndown collar and four large brass buttons having the Badge of the Colony thereon: and one small brass button of the above-mentioned design on each of the breast pockets, side pockets, and cuffs. No belt, but fitting at waist; slit at back from waist.

(b) Khaki shirts with two pockets and small buttons as described above may be worn when on tour, in place of a tunic.

(c) Khaki drill or serge breeches or trousers. Shorts may be worn on tour only.

(d) Khaki puttees, or leggings of brown leather.

(e) Brown boots.

(f) White shirt and black tie, or khaki shirt and khaki tie.

(g) Khaki helmet with khaki puggaree and badge of the Colony.

(h) White may be substituted for khaki use at Coast stations if so desired.

2. This dress will be worn by the following officers when on duty in native reserves :—

All veterinary officers and veterinary research officers.

All executive engineers and assistant executive engineers, Public Works Department.

All surveyors of the Land Department.

All assistant conservators of forests.

All inspectors (European) of schools.
Entomologists.
Labour inspectors.
Agricultural supervisors.
Sanitary inspectors.
Stock inspectors.

3. Administrative officers when on duty will wear the dress with braid and buttons on the sleeves of the tunic according to rank, as follows:—

Senior commissioners, 1st and 2nd grade and deputy chief native commissioner:

3 rows of braid, half-inch wide with half-inch between each row—the uppermost with circle.

3 buttons on the cuffs.

Administrative officers, 1st grade:

2 rows of braid half-inch wide with half-inch between each row—the uppermost with circle.

2 buttons on the cuffs.

Administrative officers, 2nd grade; cadets:

1 row of braid half-inch wide, with circle.

4. Senior medical officers, medical officers and medical officers of health when on duty in native reserves will wear the dress with two rows of braid, half-inch wide with half-inch between each row, the uppermost with circle, with a piping of very narrow red braid on both edges of the uppermost row of braid and circle.

The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st December, 1926, the survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant shall be paid to the Commissioner of Lands at the Land Department, Nairobi, within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of sale have been complied with be entitled to a grant of the plot, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.
