PROCLAMATION No. 1.

THE MAHOMEDAN MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE  
REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1906.

PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD GRIGG.

L.S.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1906, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation apply the aforesaid Ordinance to any area or to any tribe, sect or community within any area and may by such Proclamation fix the day on which the aforesaid Ordinance shall commence and take effect in such area or with regard to such tribe, sect or community.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 67 of the 10th day of February, 1922, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance, 1912, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Registrar-General of Mahomedan Marriages and Divorces to exercise on the Governor's behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by Sections 4 and 26 of the said Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1906.

And whereas it is desirable that the said Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1902, be applied to all Mahomedans in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya except the Northern Frontier Province and the Turkana District.

Now therefore in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 26 of the said Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1906, and all other powers thereunto enabling, I hereby declare that the said Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1906, shall apply to all Mahomedans in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya except the Northern Frontier Province and the Turkana District.

And further I do hereby declare that all previous Proclamations applying the aforesaid Mahomedan Marriage and Divorce Registration Ordinance, 1906, to various provinces and districts shall be revoked.

## THE NATIVE REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1921.

## RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as the "Native Registration (North Nyeri) Rules, 1926."

2. Every person resident in North Nyeri District employing a native registered under the provisions of the Native Registration Ordinance, 1921, shall render to the Resident Commissioner, North Nyeri, a special return after the 1st day of February and before the 7th day of February, 1926. Such special return shall be made upon a form as set out in the schedule annexed to this Rule and shall include the following information:—

(a) Name of employer (or firm or company), his residential and postal address, his administrative district, the date on which the return is submitted.

(b) The registration number and name of any native in the employer's service on the 31st January, 1926, and the date of engagement of such native.

(c) The registration number and name of any native discharged or having deserted or died during the month of January, 1926, and the date on which such discharge, desertion or death took place.

(d) The registration number and name of any native who has been in the employer's service who having gone on leave or left such employer's service without being signed off and who has not returned to such employer's service within the period of his contract, and who has not been reported by such employer on a previous labour return as having been discharged or as having left such employer's service and the date of such native's departure from such employer's service.

FUEL, ELBURGON.

TENDERS are invited for the supply to the Uganda Railway of eucalyptus wood fuel for locomotives.

#### FIREWOOD AND TIMBER IN THE FOREST RESERVE AT UPLANDS.

TENDERS are invited for the right to cut 70,000 c.ft. of firewood and timber in the Compartments Kabagari Nos. 2 and 3 of the Kikuvu Escarpment Forest Reserve situated about 2 miles by road from Uplands Railway Station.

4. The amount of the advance of each bid will be regulated by the auctioneer and no bid shall be retracted.

5. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10% of his purchase money, and should same be tendered by cheque such cheque must be accompanied by a Banker's guarantee.
