THE FOREST ORDINANCE, 1911.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by Section 4 of the Forest Ordinance, 1911, and the General Revision Ordinance, 1924, Section 27, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Nairobi Arboretum Rules, 1925," and shall apply to the Nairobi Arboretum Forest Reserve.
- 2. For the purpose of these Rules the word "vehicle" shall include any carriage, motor, sidecar, trailer, cart, truck, barrow, rickshaw, tricycle, bicycle, but does not include a bath-chair or perambulator being used for the carriage of an invelid or child.
- 3. The Arboretum shall be open to the public every day from sunrise to half an hour after sunset. Any person found within the grounds at any other time unless under the authority of the Conservator of Forests, shall be guilty of an offence.

- 4. Entrance to or exit from the Arboretum shall only be made by such gates as may be provided for the purposes and no person shall enter or leave the Arboretum except by such gates.
- 5. No vehicle shall be brought into the Arboretum and no cattle, horses, donkeys, sheep or goats shall be brought, or allowed to stray, into the Arboretum unless under the authority of the Conservator of Forests.
- 6. No person shall light any fire in or bring fire into the Arboretum.
- 7. No person shall pick any leaves, flowers, fruits, or seeds, nor break, pull up, injure or deface any trees, shrubs, flowers, grass, turf, fences, seats, notice-boards, or nametickets of trees or shrubs in the Arboretum, unless under the authority of the Conservator of Forests.
- 8. No person shall play any games, climb any trees, shoot with guns or catapults, throw stones or be guilty of disorderly or indecent behaviour in the Arboretum.
- 9. No person shall deposit paper, bottles, or other refuse of any sort in the Arboretum.
- 10. Offences under these Rules shall be cognisable to the Police.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 11

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Baggage Clearing Rules, 1926," and shall apply to the Township of Mombasa.
- 2. "Baggage clearing agent" shall mean any person, not being otherwise licensed for the conveyance of passengers' luggage, who in the way of business handles passengers' baggage for remuneration between a ship in Mombasa Harbour or in Kilindini Harbour and any part of Mombasa Island, or between the Customs House at Mombasa or Kilindini and any part of the said Island.
- 3. No person or firm shall carry on the business of a baggage clearing agent within the Township of Mombasa unless such person or firm has been registered by the Resident Commissioner or by some person authorised by him in that behalf. The fee payable on registration shall be Sh. 25 per annum or part thereof.
- 4. The Resident Commissioner may, in his discretion, refuse to register any person or firm as a baggage clearing agent.
- 5. Every person or firm registered as a baggage clearing agent shall enter into a bond in the sum of Sh. 1,000 with one or more sureties to secure the faithful discharge of his duties.
- 6. Any registered agent may be struck off the register for misconduct in his duties.
- 7. Every employee of a baggage clearing agent engaged for or employed in the handling of baggage in the Township of Mombasa shall be supplied by his employer with a distinguishing badge, which he shall wear and keep visible during the time that he may be so employed.
- 8. Any person engaged by a baggage clearing agent for the handling of baggage who fails to wear a badge during the time he is so employed and any baggage agent who employs a person for the handling of baggage without supplying him with such badge, and any person who wears such badge, not being a baggage agent's employee, shall be guilty of an offence punishable on conviction with imprisonment of either kind for a term not exceeding fourteen days or with a fine not exceeding Sh. 100, or with such fine and imprisonment.
- 9. Only persons who are registered as baggage clearing agents or who are lawful employees of persons or firms so registered may handle passengers' baggage in transit as specified in Rule 2.
- 10. The maximum amounts which baggage clearing agents are authorised to charge shall be as follows:—

Ship to Kilindini Customs and/or Station or rice versa ... 50 Cts. per package.

Ship to anywhere in Mombasa Island outside the Kilindini area ... Sh. 1 per package.

In addition to these fees boat-hire of 25 cents for each package and 40 cents for each passenger may be charged. The agent and his employees do not count as passengers.

Further, an agency fee not exceeding Sh. 20 may be charged, except that if there are only 5 packages or less the agency fee may not exceed Sh. 10.

The passenger is responsible for the wharfage fee, but the agent is responsible for all other incidental charges. No charge is authorised to be made for waiting time.

The above are maximum authorised charges and do not preclude lesser charges by arrangement.

- 11. Nothing in these Regulations shall be construed as conferring a right on any authorised baggage agent to board any ship.
- 12. The Baggage Clearing Rules, 1922 (Government Notice No. 260 of 1922), are hereby cancelled.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1922.

By-Laws.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1922, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, have made the following By-laws.

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as "Nairobi (Jeevanjee Gardens Amendment) By-laws, 1925."
- 2. By-laws 164 to 171 of the Nairobi Township Rules, 1917, are hereby repealed with effect from 1st November, 1925, and the following substituted therefor:—
- 3. The Jeevanjee Garden referred to in this By-law is the area shown within red lines upon the Plan of Nairobi Township deposited in the office of the Town Clerk and signed by him as relative to this By-law.
- 4. The Jeevanjee Garden shall be open to the public every day from 6.30 a.m. to 9.30 p.m. No person not duly authorised shall be in the Garden except between the said hours.
- 5. No vehicles, other than perambulators, shall be allowed entrance to the Jeevanjee Garden; nor persons riding upon horses or other animals or bicycles. No cattle, donkeys, sheep, goats or dogs shall be brought or allowed to stray into the Jeevanjee Garden.

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- 6. No person shall pick any leaves, flowers, fruits, or seeds, nor break, pull up, injure or deface any trees, shrubs, flowers, grass, tuft, fences, seats, notice-boards or name-tickets of trees or shrubs in the Jeevanjee Garden unless under authority of the Town Clerk.
- 7. No person shall play any games, except those specifically allowed on the notice-board, climb any trees, shoot with guns or catapults, throw stones, or be guilty of disorderly or indecent behaviour in the Jeevanjee Garden.
- 8. No person shall deposit paper, bottles, or other refuse of any sort in the Jeevanjee Garden otherwise than in the receptacles provided therefor.
- 9. No person shall deliver any public address in any part of the Jeevanjee Garden:

Provided that the foregoing prohibition shall not apply in any case where, upon an application to the Town Clerk for permission to deliver any public address in the Jeevanjee Garden, upon such occasion, or on such day and at such hour as shall be specified in such application, the Town Clerk may grant such permission in writing, which permission shall not be unreasonably withheld, subject to compliance with such conditions as he may prescribe.

10. No person shall play any musical instrument or ing in any part of the Jeevanjee Garden:

Provided that the foregoing prohibition shall not apply in any case where, upon an application to the Town Clerk for permission to play any musical instrument or to sing in the Jeevanjee Garden, upon such occasion, or on such days and at such hours as may be specified in such application, the Town Clerk may grant such permission in writing, which permission shall not be unreasonably withheld, subject to compliance with such conditions as he may prescribe.

11. Offences against these By-laws shall be cognisable to the Police.

CONTRACTS FOR WORKS DURING 1926.

THE list of contractors who wish to be invited to tender for works during 1926 is now being prepared. When such works are proposed, contracts will, when possible, be arranged for:—

- 1. Erection of new buildings.
- 2. Painting and major works in connection with the maintenance of existing buildings.
- 3. Construction of new roads and bridges and certain classes of road improvement.
 - 4. Maintenance of existing roads.

Lists of contractors for the above classes of work are being revised in the following divisions and subdivisions of this Department:—

Mombasa (including the Coast area).

Nairobi (including Machakos and Kyambu Districts).

Naivasha (including Nakuru, Ravine and Rumuruti Districts).

Kisumu (including Lumbwa, Kericho, and North and South Kavirondo Districts).

Nyeri (including Fort Hall, West, East and North Kenya areas).

Eldoret (including Trans-Nzoia).

Persons desirous of being invited to tender from time to time for the classes of work alluded to, whether their names are at present on the list of contractors or not, are requested to send their names as soon as possible after the appearance of this notice to the Executive Engineer at the P.W.D. Office in the particular division or subdivision in which they are prepared to operate, stating at the same time which of the above classes of work they wish to undertake and the limits of the area within which they are willing to enter into contracts. If

a contractor wishes to tender for work in more than one of the above divisions, he must submit separate applications to the Executive Engineer in charge of each division

Invitations to tender will be sent to contractors registered for the class of work concerned, and notices will be displayed at the offices of Resident or District Commissioners and Executive Engineers. No further public notice of works contemplated, except possibly unusually large building works, will be given in the Press until January, 1927.

It is probable that there will be an extensive programme of new building work this year, and it is necessary that the list of contractors should be as complete as possible.
