2. Sections 2, 10, 22, 44, 63, 75 and 106 of the Principal Ordinance are amended by the deletion of the words "Gaoler," "Gaolers" wherever they occur in the said sections and the substitution therefor of the words "Assistant Superintendent," "Assistant Superintendents."

3. Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and Prison Officers.

(d) any person offering, pretending, or professing to tell fortunes or using any subtle craft, means, or device by palmistry or otherwise to deceive or impose upon any person."

WHEREAS by reason of the imminence of active service against the Mohamed Zubeir it is necessary for the Public Service that the forces engaged on the Mohamed Zubeir Punitive Patrol should be temporarily subject to the Army Act, 1881, as if they were on active service.

Now therefore, I, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 189 (2) of the Army Act, 1881, do hereby declare that the forces engaged on the Mohamed Zubeir Punitive Patrol are on active service for the period of one month from the date of this Proclamation.
