PROCLAMATION No. 75.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157, Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish or otherwise alter the limits of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an area to be free from any diseases; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1, Revised Edition) His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now therefore in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance:—

HIS MAJESTY'S SUPREME COURT OF KENYA.

RULES OF COURT.

Made by His Majesty's Supreme Court of Kenya under the provisions of Article 9 of the Kenya Colony Order in Council, 1921.

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "Rules of Court (Remuneration of Expert Witnesses in Criminal Trials) No. 1 of 1926."
- 2. It shall be lawful for any Court before which a skilled witness has given expert evidence in a criminal case, to order that such witness be paid from Government funds such fee, not exceeding Sh. 60 per diem, as to the Court may seem reasonable:

Provided, however, that the Court may in addition to such fee, grant to the witness an allowance for qualifying to give evidence.

- 3. Where a Court makes an order under these Rules the Court shall so certify on the record of the case and thereafter pay the amount to the expert witness concerned debiting the same to the Judicial Department's "Jurors, Witnesses and Assessors" Vote.
- 4. The fees herein provided for shall be in addition to the reasonable out-of-pocket and travelling expenses provided for in the Remuneration of Witnesses, Jurors and Assessors in Criminal Trials Rules, 1924.
- 5. These Rules shall be deemed to have come into force as from the 1st day of January, 1926.

THE NATIVE REGISTRATION ORDINANCE.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by the Native Registration Ordinance (Chapter 127 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Native Registration Rules, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Native Registration Rules, 1922, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules," and all amendments thereto.
- 2. Rule 6 of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled and the following is substituted therefor:—
 - "Every Renewal Certificate as provided for under section 11 of the Ordinance shall bear the serial number of the lost or mutilated certificate together with all such particulars and endorsements appearing thereon as may be ascertained from the records of the Chief Registrar of Natives, and every such Renewal Certificate shall be endorsed by the Registration Officer with the words 'Renewal free' or 'Renewal on payment' and the

amount charged, as the case may be, and if there shall be more than one lost or mutilated certificate then the renewal certificate shall bear the serial number of the last-issued permanent certificate, or if no permanent certificate shall have been issued, then of the last-issued temporary certificate.

"Every Registration Officer to whom application for a Renewal Certificate shall be made shall issue to the applicant a temporary registration permit in the form set out in the schedule annexed to these Rules, which permit shall be deemed to be valid as a Registration Certificate for such period not exceeding one month as the Registration Officer may decide to be necessary to allow him to ascertain the serial number, particulars and endorsements of the lost or mutilated certificate.

"On the expiration of the period for which the temporary registration permit shall be valid the holder thereof shall appear before the Registration Officer by whom the permit was issued, or before such person as the Registration Officer shall direct, and shall surrender the same in exchange for the Renewal Certificate applied for, or if the Renewal Certificate be not forthcoming, shall ask that the period of validity of the permit shall be extended, and the period of validity shall thereupon be extended for a further period not exceeding one month. Any fees recoverable under Rule 7 shall be paid by the applicant upon receipt of the temporary registration permit."

THE PRISONS ORDINANCE.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 116 (iii) of the Prisons Ordinance (Chapter 37 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Prisons (Amendment) Rules, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Dietary Scale for Prisoners confined in East Africa Protectorate Prisons and General Rules, both respectively dated 24th day of January, 1918 (hereinafter referred to collectively as "the Principal Rules").
- 2. The Principal Rules are hereby amended by deleting the dietary prescribed under the heading "Native," and substituting therefor the following:—
 - "A.—Diet to be issued to all long-term prisoners and civil prisoners rationed by the Prison Authorities:---

Maize (whole), 24 ozs. per diem.

Beans, 6 ozs. per diem.

Potatoes, 8 ozs. per diem.

Salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. per diem.

Meat, 8 ozs. on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

Ghee, 1 oz. on Sunday, Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Lemons, 2 per week, $\frac{1}{2}$ lemon to be issued on Sunday, Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

"B.—Diet to be issued to all short-term prisoners and remand prisoners:—

Maize (whole), 2 lb. per diem.

Beans, 5 ozs. per diem.

Ghee, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. per diem.

Salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. per diem.

Lemons, 2 per week, ½ lemon to be issued Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

"C.—Penal Diet, 1 lb. maize and water ad lib.

NOTE.

- 1. A ration of 8 ozs. fresh fish may be issued in lieu of meat.
- 2. Equivalents of potatoes: Muhogo, bananas or sugar-cane in equal weights.
- 3. If lemons are not procurable an issue of 8 ozs. green vegetables to be made in lieu of half a lemon. If neither lemons nor green vegetables are procurable, the issue of beans shall be germinated beans, *i.e.*, beans which have been allowed to soak from 24 to 48 hours. Germinated beans must not be cooked for a longer time than is necessary to render them soft."

THE EAST AFRICA RAILWAYS ORDINANCE.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 47 of the East Africa Railways Ordinance (Chapter 115 of the Revised Edition), the Kenya and Uganda Railway Administration, with the sanction of the Governor in Council, has made the following Rules:—

- 1 These Rules may be cited as "the Railway General (Amendment) Rules, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Railway General Rules, 1923, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules."
- 2. Rule 12 (g) of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by deletion of the words—

"When an engine has passed inside a signal lowered for it the signal shall immediately be placed to danger. A signal which has been taken 'off' for the passage of a train shall be placed 'on' immediately the engine of the train which it controls has passed it."

And by substitution therefor of the words-

- "When a signal has been lowered for the passing of a train, it must not, except in case of accident or obstruction, be again placed at danger until the last vehicle of the train has passed over the points."
- 3. Rule 113 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by deletion of the words "where there is a single line".
