PROCLAMATION No. 85.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance:—

EAST COAST FEVER.

THE TOWN PLANNING ORDINANCE.

ORDER.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 461.

THE INDIAN EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1884.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Explosives Act, 1884, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and all other powers thereunto enabling him, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "the Explosives (Amendment) Rules, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Explosives (Blasting Powder) Rules, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules").

- 2. The Principal Rules shall be amended by the addition thereto of the following definitions:—
- " Blasting powder shall include the following blasting materials—

Galatinous explosives (such as blasting gelatine, gelignite, gelatine dynamite, etc.);

Non-gelatinous explosives (such as dynamite ligdyn, farmer's dynamite, etc.);

Nitro-cotton:

Detonators;

Fuse igniters;

Gunpowder:

Provided that imported explosives, whether contained in the above list or not, shall be deemed to be so included, if included in and conforming to the last issued List of Authorised Explosives as signed by His Majesty's Chief Inspector of Explosives under the authority of the Home Office and under the provisions of the Explosives Act, 1875, section 106."

GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 462

THE INDIAN PETROLEUM ACT, 1899.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Indian Petroleum Act, 1899, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Petroleum Possession and Transport (Amendment) Rules, 1926," and shall be read as one with the Petroleum Possession and Transport Rules, 1923 (hereinafter called "the Principal Rules") and with all amendments to the Principal Rules.
- 2. Rule 4A of the Petroleum Possession and Transport (Amendment) Rules, 1925, is hereby amended by the addition of the following extra condition:—
 - "(l) If the site of the premises on which an installation is to be placed is temporary, and if for any reason the moving of the tank to another site is likely to be required within a reasonable period such tank may, with the express approval of the District Commissioner in writing (which approval shall also be endorsed on the licence) be installed in a pit without concrete or brick lining, but in such case the frame of the manhole cover shall be securely fixed to an iron or cement concrete box or casing extending to the underground tank and fitting the latter closely but

not necessarily fixed thereto. Such box or casing shall be substantially made, and all joints within 12 inches of the ground surface shall be airtight; if of sheet iron, the thickness shall not be less than one-sixteenth of an inch, and if of concrete, not less than four inches. The pit shall be carefully filled and the ground surface shall be made up with well consolidated murram or other material approved by the District Commissioner, at least six inches thick, and extending over the whole pit, and at least one foot beyond the pit in each direction: Provided that not more than one renewal of any such licence may be given without the approval of the Governor."

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 463.

THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ORDINANCE.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance (Chapter 118 of the Revised Edition), and the Revised Edition of the Laws (Operation) Ordinance, 1926, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Rules (No. 2), 1926," and shall be read as one with the Wireless Telegraph Rules, 1926, hereinafter called "the Principal Rules" and all amendments thereto.
- 2. Foreign men-of-war and service aircraft accompanying them lying in the Port of Mombasa or other port or harbour of the Colony shall conform to the following regulations respecting the use of wireless apparatus:—
 - (i) Transmission on 600 metres is prohibited, except for the purpose of making or answering signals of distress.
 - (ii) No interference with naval, army or air force signalling or with any fixed shore station is permitted.
 - (iii) Transmission must be discontinued on request from-
 - (a) the Postmaster General of the Colony;
 - (b) any British or Dominion naval authority;
 - (c) the Port of Mombasa or other port or harbour authority;
 - (d) any fixed shore station of the Colony.
 - (iv) Protracted signalling, using apparatus transmitting other than pure continuous waves is prohibited.
 - (v) If there is a British or Dominion fleet or warship lying in the harbour, permission to use wireless telegraphy or telephony apparatus must be obtained from the Senior Naval Officer of such fleet or warship.

- 3. All Telegraph Rules previously published, in so far as they are inconsistent with these Rules, are hereby cancelled.

THE COMMISSIONS OF INQUIRY ORDINANCE.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMISSION.

WHEREAS by a Commission under my hand dated the 13th day of July, 1926, Commissioners were appointed for the purpose of making recommendations, inter alia, as to the establishment or extension of local Government in such settled areas of the Colony as the Commissioners may consider to be suitable for the establishment of local Government, and of advising upon certain other matters in relation thereto:

AND WHEREAS on the 20th day of October, 1926, certain persons were appointed to be additional Commissioners for the aforesaid purposes:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said Commissioners should also make recommendations and advise in regard to the matter hereunder mentioned:

 - (iii) The above-mentioned special conditions are to be carried out to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture or such official as he may appoint.
