PROCLAMATION.

EDWARD GRIGG.



BY His Excellency Sir Edward William Macleay Grigg, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor in Council by section 1 of the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925, I, having taken the advice of my Executive Council, do hereby declare that the said Ordinance as amended by the Arms and Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926, shall come into force on the first day of January, 1927.

PROCLAMATION No. 87.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farm to be an infected area for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance:—

Farm L.O. No. 3235, Messrs. R. and H. S. Smith, Subukia, Nakuru District, Trypanosomiasis.

And further I do hereby declare that the following portion of a Proclamation is revoked:—

That portion of Proclamation No. 83, dated the 21st day of October, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 213, Crown Land, Kyambu District, to be an infected area (Rinderpest).

GOVERNMENT COOL STORES, KILINDINI.

IT IS HEREBY notified for public information that it is expected that the Government Cool Stores, Kilindini, will be open on or about 15th December, 1926, to receive produce for storage in accordance with the subjoined Regulations and Schedule of Charges.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. All produce to be stored therein shall be consigned to the Chief Grader and Inspector, Government Cool Stores, Kilindini Pier.
- 2. Excepting in the cases of produce arriving by rail the Cool Stores will be open for the acceptance of goods between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 a.m. only, and in the case of delivery of produce from the Cool Stores during the same period only, excepting produce for shipment, provided that if an owner or his agent wishes to remove or deliver his produce at any other time an additional charge of Sh. 5 shall be made on any occasion that it is found necessary to open the doors of the Cool Stores.
- 3. On receipt of produce an acceptance note will be issued to the owner or his agent, and delivery will not be given except upon an order in writing from the owner or his agent.
- 4. If the owner or his agent requires produce to be weighed ex Cool Stores, i.e., on delivery therefrom a charge of Cts. 10 per package, with a minimum charge of Sh. 1, will be levied.

- 5. Every package of produce shall be labelled or clearly branded by the owner or his agent before delivery to the Cool Stores.
- Application for space in the Stores shall ordinarily be made seven days prior to the delivery of the produce to the Chief Grader and Inspector, Kilindini. Owners or their agents delivering produce to the Cool Stores without previously ascertaining that accommodation is available for their produce will do so at their own risk of being shut out for lack of accommodation.
- 7. Applications for space shall state the quantity and nature of the produce to be stored, and, if possible, the period during which it is intended to keep it in the Stores.
- 8. The produce shall be stored in such apartments in the Cool Stores and at such temperatures as the Director of Agriculture may prescribe.
- 9. The Chief Grader and Inspector shall have the right to inspect and to refuse acceptance of produce where it is believed the produce or its packings are likely to damage or in any way contaminate other produce in store or likely to be put in store. Should produce in store become unfit for food, or likely through its condition to damage or contaminate other produce in store or likely to be put into store, the Chief Grader and Inspector shall have the right to sell, destroy, or otherwise dispose of it without prior reference to the owner or his agent.
- 10. Charges shall be made by the Department of Agriculture as shown in the Schedule. Payment of these charge, shall be made to the Chief Grader and Inspector prior to the removal of produce from the Cool Stores premises.
- 11. The Government shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage that may be suffered in respect of any produce accepted for storage in the Cool Stores.

THE NATIVE AUTHORITY ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 129, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya).

WHEREAS under Section 3 (1) of the Native Authority Ordinance (Chapter 129, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), the Governor has power to appoint any Chief or other native to be the Official Headman of any area and suspend or cancel such appointment at any time.

And whereas under Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1, Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), the Governor by Government Notice No. 406, dated the 9th day of October, 1926, was pleased to delegate the powers conferred upon him under Section 3 (1) of the said Native Authority Ordinance to the person for the time being holding the post of Senior Commissioner in each Province of the Colony to be exercised within his Province.

Witnesseth as follows:-

- (2) The tenant hereby covenants with the Governor as follows:—
 - (a) That he will enter into a bond for one thousand shillings for the due performance of each and every of the covenants herein contained.
 - (b) That he will during the said term pay to the Governor the rent in the manner aforesaid.
 - 'c) That he will not demand, charge or take any tolls, ferriages, freights or payments other than those set out in the schedule hereto without the consent in writing of the Governor.
 - (d) That he will allow all Government servants travelling on duty to cross by the ferries free of any charge on production of a ticket issued by the Port Captain.

- (e) That he will during the said term maintain a proper, regular and efficient service at the said ferry, crossing at intervals of not less than fifteen minutes from 5.30 a.m. to 6 p.m. on every day of the week or at such shorter intervals between the said hours as the Governor may by notice served on the tenant direct.
- (f) That he will not cause or permit to be caused any obstruction whatsoever to the free navigation of the channels by any lighter, steam launch or any other vessel or craft whatsoever.
- (g) That he will keep, and at the determination of the said term deliver up, the said boats and all gear and tackle appertaining thereto in good order and repair to the satisfaction of the Governor or of such officer as the Governor may appoint on that behalf.
- (h) That he will cause to be printed on the sterns of the said boats the number of passengers and animals which may be prescribed by the Governor or by such officer as the Governor may appoint on that behalf as the maximum number which may be carried at any one time, and that he will not carry or permit to be carried at any one time more passengers or animals than are so prescribed.
- (i) That he will at all reasonable times allow the Governor or any officer appointed by the Governor on that behalf to examine the said boats and the gear and tackle appertaining thereto.
- (j) That he will not assign or sublet the said demised premises or any part thereof without the consent in writing of the Governor.
- (k) That he will at the end or sooner determination of the said term peaceably deliver up the said demised premises to the Governor.
- (3) The Governor hereby covenants with the tenant that the tenant paying the rent and observing and performing the covenants hereinbefore reserved and expressed shall peaceably and quietly enjoy the said demised premiss and shall not be disturbed by any act of the Governor or of any person lawfully claiming through or under him.
- (5) If the tenant commits or allows to be committed any breach of the covenants on his part hereinbefore contained or if the rent or any part thereof shall remain unpaid for seven days after the same became due it shall be lawful for the Governor to give the tenant notice in writing determining the term hereby granted and thereupon to resume possession of the said demised premises.
