## MEETING OF LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

I, EDWARD WILLIAM MACLEAY GRIGG, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Distinguished Service Order, upon whom His Majesty has conferred the decoration of the Military Cross, Lieutenant-Colonel in His Majesty's Army (retired), Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, dated the 11th day of September, 1920, do hereby direct that a Session of the Legislative Council be held at the Memorial Hall, Nairobi, on Friday, the 17th day of December, 1926, at 10 a.m.

PROCLAMATION No. 89.

## THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

### PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition) His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now therefore in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance:—

### EAST COAST FEVER.

That portion of Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/R, Messrs. East African Lands & Development Co., Ltd., Gilgil, Naivasha District, bounded by a line

commencing at the junction of the Melewa and Oleolondo Rivers; thence in a due westerly direction to the Gilgil River; thence following the Gilgil River downstream to the northern boundary of main Gilgil-Rumuruti East Road; thence following the northern boundary of the main Gilgil-Rumuruti East Road in a south-westerly direction to its junction with the western boundary of Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/R; thence following the south-western boundary of Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/R to the north-western corner of Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/20; thence following the northern boundary of Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/20 in a north-easterly direction to the Melewa River; thence following the Melewa River upstream to the point of commencement.

Farm L.O. No. 3,232, Mr. J. H. Harcombe Solai, Nakuru District.

And further I do hereby declare that the following portion of a proclamation is revoked:—

That portion of proclamation, dated the 2nd day of September, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 3,777/41/R, Messrs. East African Lands and Development Co., Gilgil, Naivasha District, to be an infected area (East Coast Fever).

JUDGMENT:—In this case four accused have been charged with a breach of Section 5 of Chapter 92, Laws of Kenya. Accused No. 3 has not been served with summons. The Registrar of Business Names asserts that a statement of particulars has twice been filed in his office, of the firm of A. M. Jeevanjee & Co. In both these statements Mr. Alibhoy Mulla Jeevanjee is described as the sole member. The Registrar contends that, in fact, four accused are partners and that Section 5 of Chapter 92 has been contravened. In support of this he puts in the Official Gazette of 7th June, 1926, in which one of the accused names accused 1, 2, 3 and 4 as partners. I cannot see that the prosecution have made out any case either directly or by implication against Accused No. 5 and I accordingly acquit him.

The defence is first that the firm of A. M. Jeevanjee and Co. does not carry on business; and secondly, that it has not been proved that the accused are, in fact, partners. I am at a loss to understand why if the firm does not carry on the business it was ever registered. Not only the firm was registered as a business in 1923, but as late as July of this year it was re-registered through Messrs. Atkinson and Wright on the ground that the signatures to the original statement was irregular. In July, 1926, there was a suggestion that a business was not being carried on. In August, 1918, subsequent to the passing of the Ordinance, under which the accused are charged, I find a letter in the file which describes the firm as shipowners, landed proprietors, stevedores and dubashes. Apart from this internal evidence, I am of opinion that by making statement under Section 5 of the Ordinance, the firm is estopped by representation from denying that a business is in fact carried on.

The second defence is that the prosecution has not proved that the accused were partners in the firm. The prosecution has not been as clear on this point as I should have desired, but the defence is even more obscure. The defence is simple plea of not guilty, coupled with certain legal arguments. The prosecution alleges that the accused are partners and supports this allegation by a notice in the Official Gazette, under the signature of Mr. Tayebali Jeevanjee. This notice is not repudiated by the signatory or by any of the co-accused, his brothers. Stranger still, not one of the accused would make any statement in defence to the effect that he was not a partner though encouraged by me to do so.

Accordingly, the Crown has made the definite assertion as regards Accused 1, 2, 3 and 4, that they are partners, supported by some slight documentary evidence. The Crown case is not strong, but as it is completely unrebutted by the accused, from whom I naturally expected a vigorous denial, I can draw no conclusion other than that Accused 1, 2 and 4, at any rate, were partners in the firm of A. M. Jeevanjee and Co.

The returns submitted under Section 5 of Chapter 92, do not contain the names of Accused 1, 2 and 4 as partners and as I have found as a fact that they were partners, I find Accused 1, 2 and 4 guilty of a breach of Section 5, punishable under Section 9, of Chapter 92. I fine each accused Shs. 40, in view of the fact that the Registrar does not press the charge.

The Registrar with the permission of the Court withdrew the second charge and the accused are accordingly acquitted on this charge.

## NOTICE.

THE grants of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto, will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, be offered for sale at the Department of Lands, Nairobi, commencing at 10 a.m., on Monday, the 20th December, 1926. Plans of the farms may be seen at the Public Map Office, Land Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the Resident Commissioner, Nakuru, or may be had on application to the Land Department on payment of Shs. 3, post free, in respect of each plan required.

The right to withdraw any farm from the auction is reserved to Government.

## CONDITIONS OF SALE.

1. Each farm shall be auctioned separately.
2. These farms are in the highlands and purchase will therefore be confined to Europeans only (or their accredited agents), in conformity with the decision of His Majesty's Government.
3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.
4. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
5. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10 per cent. of his purchase money, and should same be tendered by cheque, such cheque must be suitably endorsed by the purchaser's banker. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
6. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full to the Land Officer on or before the 1st January, 1927, or may be paid in nine equal annual instalments payable on the 1st day of January in each year, the first instalment being payable on the 1st day of January, 1928, and the purchaser shall inform the Land Officer on or before the 1st day of January, 1927, which method of payment he desires to adopt.
7. If the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money by instalments no assignment of the land leased or any part thereof shall be valid until the whole of the balance of the purchase money shall have been paid.
8. The survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the grant and the stamp duty payable in respect of the grant and, if the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money in full, the balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi, on or before the 1st January, 1927, and upon such payments being duly made, the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Land Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a grant of the farm, which grant shall be presented to him duly executed as soon as conveniently may be.
9. If the payments mentioned in condition No. 8 are not made on or before the 1st day of January, 1927, the Land Officer may order that the deposit paid by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the farm.
10. The grant shall be under the provisions of the Registration of Titles Ordinance, 1919, and shall be for 999 years, and shall commence from the 1st day of January, 1927. Rent shall be payable from that date.
11. Farms L.O. Nos. 3,229, 5,670 and 2,684 will be subject to the following special conditions, and the usual development conditions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, will not be imposed:—
