No. 26 OF 1926.

An Ordinance to Provide for the Imposition and Collection of Consumption Taxes on Wines and Spirits.

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Wines and Spirits Consumption Tax Ordinance, 1926.”

Short title.
2. In this Ordinance, the expression—

“ Spirits ” means potable spirits and includes brandy, whisky, rum, gin, geneva, liqueurs, cordials and mixed spirits containing over three per centum of proof spirit ;

“ Proof spirit ” means spirits which at a temperature of 51 degrees of Fahrenheit’s thermometer weigh 12/13 of an equal volume of distilled water.

Interpretation.
3. There shall be charged, levied and paid to the general revenue of the Colony on all wines and spirits released from Customs control for consumption in the Colony a tax at the appropriate rate set forth in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

Tax to be paid on wines and spirits.
4. The Governor in Council may make rules—

(a) for securing the payment of the tax imposed by this Ordinance ;

(b) for enabling refunds to be made in case of exportation of wines and spirits on which the tax has been paid ; and

(c) generally, for carrying into effect the provisions of this Ordinance.

Power to make rules.
5. Any person acting or attempting to act in contravention of this Ordinance or of any rules made thereunder shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds or in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months ; and, if the payment of tax has been avoided by such contravention of the Ordinance or rules, such person shall be liable to an additional penalty not exceeding three times the amount of the tax so avoided and in default of payment to simple imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months.

Penalties.
6. This Ordinance shall commence and come into operation on the 6th day of November, 1926.

THE WINES AND SPIRITS CONSUMPTION TAX
ORDINANCE, 1926.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 4 of the Wines and Spirits Consumption Tax Ordinance, 1926, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as “ the Wines and Spirits Consumption Tax Rules, 1926.”

2. For the purpose of the administration of the Ordinance the provisions of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 87 of the Revised Edition), shall apply to the control of goods leviable with consumption tax and to the assessment, securing payment, remission and refund thereof with the exception that the amount of refund shall not be limited as in subsection (e) of section 157 of such Ordinance.

3. Wines and spirits entered ex ship or ex bonded warehouse for direct consignment to Uganda may be released after payment of Customs Import Duty only provided that bond, either general or particular, be given to cover the amount leviable as consumption tax.

4. Bonds will be discharged on production of evidence of re-exportation to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Customs. If proof of re-exportation be not produced consumption tax will be leviable.

5. Twenty-four reputed half-pints, twelve reputed pints, six reputed quarts and four reputed Imperial quarts shall be deemed to be not less than one gallon.
