PROCLAMATION NO 93

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition) His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now therefore in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farm to be an infected area for the purposes of the said Diseases of Anima's Ordinance:—

RINDERPEST.

Farm L.O. No. 2748, Mr. P. de Bruin, Nanyuki, North Nyeri District.

And further I do hereby declare that the following portions of Proclamations are revoked:—

That portion of Proclamation No. 20, dated the 4th day of March, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 1481, Messrs. Jansen & Roberson, Nandi District, to be an infected area (Contagious Bovine Pleuro-pneumonia).

Those portions of Proclamation No. 79. dated the 7th day of October, 1926, declaring Farms L.O. Nos. 593 and 594, Mr. J. Stanning, Lumbwa, Kisumu-Londiani District, and Farm L.O. No. 590, Mr. H. Watts, Lumbwa, Kisumu-Londiani District, to be infected areas (Rinderpest).

That portion of Proclamation No. 83, dated the 21st day of October, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 4765, Capt. V. Hamilton, Kima, Machakos District, to be an infected area (Rinderpest).
