HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into Legislative Council :—

A Bill to Amend the Marriage Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Marriage (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927,” and shall be read as one with the Marriage Ordinance (Chapter 167 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as “ the Principal Ordinance.”

Short title.

2. Section 33 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

Repeal and re-enactment of section 33 of the Principal Ordinance.

“ 33. The Registrar-General shall cause indexes of all the said certified copies of the Marriage Registers to be made and kept in the Registrar-General's office, and every person shall be entitled to search the said indexes at any reasonable time and, on payment of the fees set out in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be entitled to have a certified copy of any entry in the said certified copies of the Registers; and all certified copies of entries purporting to be signed and certified by the Registrar-General, and every certificate of marriage which shall have been filed in the office of the registrar of any district or a copy thereof purporting to be signed and certified by the registrar of such district for the time being, and every entry in a Marriage Register Book, shall be received as evidence of the marriage to which the same relates without any or other proof of such entry.”

3. Form F in the First Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the Form F in the Schedule hereto is substituted therefor.

## OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to provide for indexes being kept in the office of the Registrar-General of all certified copies of Marriage Registers which are filed with the Registrar-General under the Principal Ordinance. Provision is also made enabling any person to search those indexes and, on payment of the prescribed fee, to obtain from the Registrar-General a certified copy of any entry in the Marriage Registers.

The Bill further provides a new and more complete form of the certificate of marriage which is required to be filed in Marriage Registers. The form at present prescribed is nothing more than a précis of the original certificate, and difficulties have arisen owing to the refusal of Courts in England to accept copies of the certificate in the present form as evidence of a marriage.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by section 5 of the Game Birds Protection Ordinance, 1926, I do hereby declare that it shall be an offence for any person to hunt, kill or capture any species of goose, duck, teal snipe, stork or flamingo without the written authority of the Game Warden within the area comprising Lake Nakuru and the shores thereof to a distance of one mile from the margin of the said lake between the first day of April and the twenty-third day of December, 1927, and subsequent years.

## NOTICE.

*Nyeri Station Road.*

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance, 1920, as amended by Public Travel and Access Roads (Amendment) Ordinance, 1924, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to the Governor that requirements exist for the establishment, alteration or cancellation of a line of public travel, or the conversion of a road of access into a line of public travel, the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, dedicate a line of public travel which shall be clearly described in such order, and from such date of publication such line of public travel shall be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force, and such public road shall be of such width as the Governor shall direct.

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that requirements exist for the establishment of the line of public travel described in the Schedule hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said section, I hereby order that the said line of public travel be dedicated as a public road for the purposes of the said Ordinance and I also direct that such public road shall be 120 feet wide.

7. Subject to the proviso contained in Condition No. 6, if the amounts therein mentioned are not paid to the Commissioner of Lands, at the Land Department, Nairobi, within seven days from the date of sale, the Commissioner of Lands may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a grant of the plot.

8. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantees shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

9. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plan showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the local authority and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner for necessary action.

10. Each grantee will be responsible for the proportionate cost of roads and drains when construction is complete.
