THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

E. B. DENHAM.



BY His Excellency Edward Brandis Denham, Esq., Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander in Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the words "agricultural produce" or "products" include any article whatever produced or derived from farming operations which the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in the Gazette declare to be agricultural produce for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the powers in me vested as aforesaid I do hereby in Executive Council declare "cotton" to be an agricultural produce or product for the purposes of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 92.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT ORDINANCE.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as '' the Grading of Cotton Rules, 1927.''

- 2. No person shall export or cause or permit to be exported or attempt to export from the ports of Mombasa or Kilindini any cotton which is not marked in compliance with the following provisions:—
 - (a) Each bale or package containing cotton shall bear the number or numbers allotted by the Director of Agriculture to the ginnery at which the cotton was ginned, and any bale or package of cotton which is repressed at a ginnery or baling factory other than that at which it was ginned, shall, in addition, bear the registered number or numbers allotted by the Director of Agriculture to such ginnery or baling factory, such number or numbers to be clearly stencilled at one end of the bale or package and distinctly apart from any other marking.
 - (b) Each bale or package shall bear a letter or letters denoting the quality of the cotton contained therein: provided that the letter "X" shall be used to denote first quality only. Any letter denoting quality shall be placed immediately adjacent to the ginnery or baling factory identification number or numbers above prescribed.
 - (c) The length of any letter or figure required by this rule to be placed on any bale shall in no case be less than one and a half inches.
- 3. The Director of Agriculture may exempt from the operation of these Rules cotton which comes from any particular district or area.

BY-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance (Chapter 84 of the Revised Edition), the Nairobi Corporation with the consent of His Excellency the Governor in Council have made the following By-laws:—

- 1. These By-laws may be cited as "the Nairobi Township (Amendment) By-laws, 1927," and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Township By-laws, 1926 (hereinafter called "the Principal By-laws") and all amendments thereto.
- 2. By-law 141 of the Principle By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—
 - "141. The Town Clerk shall have power to expel from and forbid the re-entry to any market of any person who shall threaten or interfere with any other person resorting to such market, and may expel from any public market any vendor, or servant of a vendor, who has been convicted of a breach of these By-laws, and may prevent such person from further carrying on any business in such public market, or occupying any stall therein."
- 3. By-law 178 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—
 - "178. No tractor, trailer, motor lorry or any vehicle which plies for hire and is licensed by the Nairobi Corporation to carry seven or more passengers or freight cart drawn by oxen or mules shall be taken within the City Park unless by authority of the Town Clerk.
 - "The owner and person or persons in charge of any such vehicle acting in contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall each severally be guilty of an offence."
- 4. By-law 236 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—
 - "236. (1) No person shall leave or place or cause or suffer to be left or placed any straw, wood, paper or other things of an inflammable nature, for which he is responsible in such a position as to cause danger from fire to any adjoining property.
 - "(2) No person shall light or cause to be lit any fire within the commercial area in any building or part of a building other than a domestic building unless in a properly constructed fire-place provided with a suitable flue and chimney, the position and construction of which shall have been approved of in writing by the Town Clerk.
 - "Provided that this By-law shall not apply to any electrical fire, stove or other heating or lighting appliance."

- 5. By-law 358 of the Principal By-laws is hereby amended by substituting "Sh. 5" for Sh. 10."
- 6. The Schedule to section 1, Part V, of the Principal By-laws is hereby amended by inserting after the words

.... " Private

the following:-

TRAILERS.

"Trailers, drawn by any machine (excepting vehicles drawn by steam traction engines) with wheels with rubber tyres ... Sh. 60

"Trailers, drawn by any machine (excepting vehicles drawn by steam traction engines), with wheels with tyres not of rubber ... Sh. 100."

- 7. By-law 391 of the Principal By-law is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:
 - " 391. (a) The Nairobi Corporation may set apart places in the township as stands for public vehicles or for any specified class of public vehicles and may by notice published in the Gazette prescribe the direction in which public vehicles may be drawn up on such stands. From the date when any such places shall be so set apart any person or persons in charge of any public vehicle who shall suffer the same, unless actually under hire, or disabled by accident, to stand on any other public place or any public road or street or who shall suffer the same to move into or out of or to stand at a public stand otherwise than facing the prescribed direction, or to back into or out of a public stand shall be guilty of an offence.
 - " (b) The Nairobi Corporation may by notice published in the Gazette designate places in the township where vehicles licensed to carry seven or more passengers may stop to enable passengers to enter or leave such vehicle. After such notice has been published in the Gazette it shall be an offence for the driver, person in charge or owner of any such vehicle to take up or set down passengers at any other place in the township than those places designated as above and published in the Gazette."
- 8. By-law 465 (d) of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:-
 - " (d) To haul, drive or draw, or cause to be hauled, driven or drawn on any street or road within the township any vehicle or implement which has spiked or ribbed wheels or any caterpillar or crawler type track, except with the permission in writing of the Town Clerk."
- 9. By-law 549 of the Principal By-laws is hereby amended by inserting the words " and without carrying the necessary licence "between the words "manner" and "will be liable."
- 10. These By-laws shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1927.
