HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has approved of the following Bill being introduced into Legislative Council :—

A Bill to Amend the Cotton (Tax) Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Cotton (Tax) ^{Short title.} (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927, and shall be read as one with the Cotton (Tax) Ordinance (Chapter 60 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed ^{Tax on cotton.} and the following section is substituted therefor :—

“ 2. (1) There shall be payable in respect of all cotton ginned in any part of the Colony to which this Ordinance applies a tax on the basis of the sliding scale and according to the conditions set out in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

(2) The Governor in Council may from time to time, by order, vary the sliding scale or the conditions set out in the Schedule.”

3. The following shall be inserted as the Schedule to the ^{Schedule.} Principal Ordinance :—

SCHEDULE.

BASIS OF TAXATION.

The tax shall be calculated on the sliding scale below according to the closing price on the Liverpool Cotton Exchange on the 14th, 15th or 16th day of December of the previous year, whichever shall be the last day on which business is done in respect of June American “ Middling ” futures :—

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

Section 2 of the Cotton (Tax) Ordinance provides for the payment of a fixed tax, not exceeding six cents per pound, to be prescribed by the Governor on all cotton ginned in the Colony.

It is considered that a tax on a sliding scale based upon the selling price of cotton is more equitable in its incidence than a fixed tax, and this Amending Bill introduces a tax on the same basis as that recently enacted by the Government of Uganda. It is important that the law in regard to Cotton Tax in Kenya and Uganda should harmonise, at least in those areas which are contiguous.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 112.

THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 93 of the Revised Edition).

PROCEDURE IN CASES OF APPLICATION TO THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL FOR A LICENCE UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE.

1. The accompanying drafts have been prepared to show generally the manner in which the Memorandum and Articles of Association should be framed where it is proposed to apply to the Governor in Council for a licence under Section 26 of the Companies Ordinance.

2. Under this Section any Chamber, Institute, Society, or other association formed for the purpose of promoting commerce, art, science, religion, charity, or any other useful object which does not involve the division of profit, may, if it obtains the licence of the Governor in Council, be incorporated by registration with limited liability, but without the addition of the word "limited" to its name.

3. It is to be understood that the drafts of the Memorandum and Articles of Association are subject to such additions, alterations, and omissions as the circumstances of the association desiring incorporation may render necessary, or the Governor in Council may require.

4. An association desiring to be incorporated in this manner should make a written application through the Colonial Secretary to the Governor in Council for a licence, and, together with such application, should transmit for consideration a draft in duplicate of the proposed Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association, together with a list of the promoters and proposed governing body of the association, and any report or statement of its previous proceedings as an unincorporated body. If the Governor in Council is satisfied that the application may be entertained, notice of such application will be inserted in the Official Gazette for the information of the public, and if after the expiration of a limited time there appears to be no sufficient reason why the licence should not be granted, the Governor in Council will accept the Memorandum and Articles of Association, with such amendment, if any, as may be necessary, and grant a licence.

5. The Governor in Council will require to have the Memorandum and Articles of Association settled by counsel at the expense of the applicants, for which purpose a fee of Shs. 105 must accompany the application. The Governor in Council will not, however, be responsible for the Memorandum or Articles being properly framed as regards the interests of the association. The fees for registration of the association may be ascertained by reference to Table B (II) of the First Schedule to the Companies Ordinance.

DRAFT MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION.

1. The name of the Association is "The....."
2. The registered office of the Association will be situate in.....
3. The objects for which the Association is established are :— (*Here express objects shortly*).

 - (3) The doing all such lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.
4. The income and property of the Association, whencesoever derived, shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association as set forth in this Memorandum of Association; and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly, by way of dividend, bonus, or otherwise howsoever by way of profit, to the members of the Association.

Provided that nothing herein shall prevent the payment, in good faith, of reasonable and proper remuneration to any officer or servant of the Association, or to any member of the Association, in return for any services actually rendered to the Association, nor prevent the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding five per centum per annum on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises or let by any member to the Association, but so that no member of the Council of Management or Governing Body of the Association shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Association, or any office of the Association paid by fees, and that no remuneration or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the Association to any member of such Council or Governing Body except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses and interest at the rate aforesaid on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let to the Association.

5. The fourth paragraph of this Memorandum is a condition on which a licence is granted by the Governor in Council to the Association in pursuance of Section 26 of the Companies Ordinance.

6. The liability of members is limited.

7. Every member of the Association undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Association, in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member, or within one year afterwards, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Association contracted before the time at which he ceases to be a member, and of the costs, charges, and expenses of winding up the same, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories amongst themselves, such amount as may be required, not exceeding (.....pounds.)

8. If, upon the winding up or dissolution of the Association there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Association, but shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar to the objects of the Association, and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property amongst its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Association under or by virtue of Clause 4 hereof, such institution or institutions to be determined by the members of the Association at or before the time of dissolution, or in default thereof by a Judge of the Supreme Court, and if and so far as effect cannot be given to the aforesaid provision then to some charitable object.

9. True accounts shall be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Association, and the matter in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place, and of the property, credits, and liabilities of the Association; and, subject to any reasonable restrictions as to the time and manner of inspecting the same that may be imposed in accordance with the regulations of the Association for the time being, shall be open to the inspection of the members. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Association shall be examined, and the correctness of the balance-sheet ascertained by one or more properly qualified auditor or auditors.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (PORT HEALTH)
REGULATIONS, 1923.

NOTICE.

WHEREAS by Regulation No. 17 of the Public Health (Port Health) Regulations, 1923, the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services is empowered to apply all or any of the requirements of the said Regulation to all vessels at any port of the Colony and Protectorate.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred I hereby declare that the requirements of Sections (a), (b), and (c) of the said Regulation as enumerated below shall from the 1st day of March, 1927, apply to all vessels in the harbours of Kilindini and Mombasa and that the master of any vessel in the ports or harbours of Mombasa or Kilindini is hereby required :—

(a) To close and render impassable to rats and mice all openings or holes in the side of such vessel which is contiguous to any wharf, lighter, or other vessel ;

(b) To affix an effective rat shield or screen and parcelling, to be freshly tarred each day, not less than three feet or more than five feet from the side of such vessel, to every rope or hawser connecting the vessel to any wharf, mooring appurtenance, lighter, or other vessel ;

(c) Between the hours of sunset and sunrise, either to remove every landing stage or gangway between such vessel and the wharf, lighter, or other vessel, or, except when any such appliance is actually in use, to station a watchman at its inboard end to prevent migration of rodents.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE.

By-Laws.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance (Chapter 84 of the Revised Edition), the Nairobi Corporation with the consent of His Excellency the Governor in Council have made the following By-laws :—

1. These By-laws may be cited as " the Nairobi Township (Amendment) By-laws, 1927," and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Township By-laws, 1926 (hereinafter called " the Principal By-laws ") and all amendments thereto.

2. By-law 141 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

" 141. The Town Clerk shall have power to expel from and forbid the re-entry to any market of any person who shall threaten or interfere with any other person resorting to such market, and may expel from any public market any vendor, or servant of a vendor, who has been convicted of a breach of these By-laws, and may prevent such person from further carrying on any business in such public market, or occupying any stall therein."

3. By-law 178 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

" 178. No tractor, trailer, motor lorry or any vehicle which plies for hire and is licensed by the Nairobi Corporation to carry seven or more passengers or freight cart drawn by oxen or mules shall be taken within the City Park unless by authority of the Town Clerk.

" The owner and person or persons in charge of any such vehicle acting in contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall each severally be guilty of an offence."

4. By-law 236 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

" 236. (1) No person shall leave or place or cause or suffer to be left or placed any straw, wood, paper or other things of an inflammable nature, for which he is responsible in such a position as to cause danger from fire to any adjoining property.

" (2) No person shall light or cause to be lit any fire within the commercial area in any building or part of a building other than a domestic building unless in a properly constructed fire-place provided with a suitable flue and chimney, the position and construction of which shall have been approved of in writing by the Town Clerk.

" Provided that this By-law shall not apply to any electrical fire, stove or other heating or lighting appliance."

5. The Schedule to section 1, Part V, of the Principal By-laws is hereby amended by inserting after the words

“ Private Sh. 4.”

the following :—

TRAILERS.

“ Trailers, drawn by any machine (excepting vehicles drawn by steam traction engines) with wheels with rubber tyres ... Sh. 60

“ Trailers, drawn by any machine (excepting vehicles drawn by steam traction engines), with wheels with tyres not of rubber Sh. 100.”

6. By-law 391 of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

“ 391. (a) The Nairobi Corporation may set apart places in the township as stands for public vehicles or for any specified class of public vehicles and may by notice published in the Gazette prescribe the direction in which public vehicles may be drawn up on such stands. From the date when any such places shall be so set apart any person or persons in charge of any public vehicle who shall suffer the same, unless actually under hire, or disabled by accident, to stand on any other public place or any public road or street or who shall suffer the same to move into or out of or to stand at a public stand otherwise than facing the prescribed direction, or to back into or out of a public stand shall be guilty of an offence.

“ (b) The Nairobi Corporation may by notice published in the Gazette designate places in the township where vehicles licensed to carry seven or more passengers may stop to enable passengers to enter or leave such vehicle. After such notice has been published in the Gazette it shall be an offence for the driver, person in charge or owner of any such vehicle to take up or set down passengers at any other place in the township than those places designated as above and published in the Gazette.”

7. By-law 465 (d) of the Principal By-laws is hereby revoked and in lieu thereof shall be read the following :—

“ (d) To haul, drive or draw, or cause to be hauled, driven or drawn on any street or road within the township any vehicle or implement which has spiked or ribbed wheels or any caterpillar or crawler type track, except with the permission in writing of the Town Clerk.”

8. By-law 549 of the Principal By-laws is hereby amended by inserting the words “ and without carrying the necessary licence ” between the words “ manner ” and “ will be liable.”

9. These By-laws shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1927.

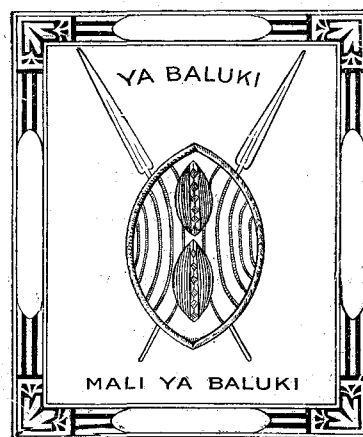

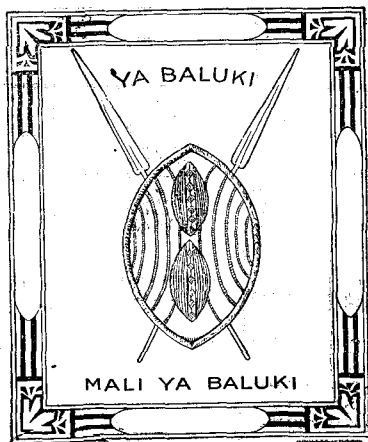

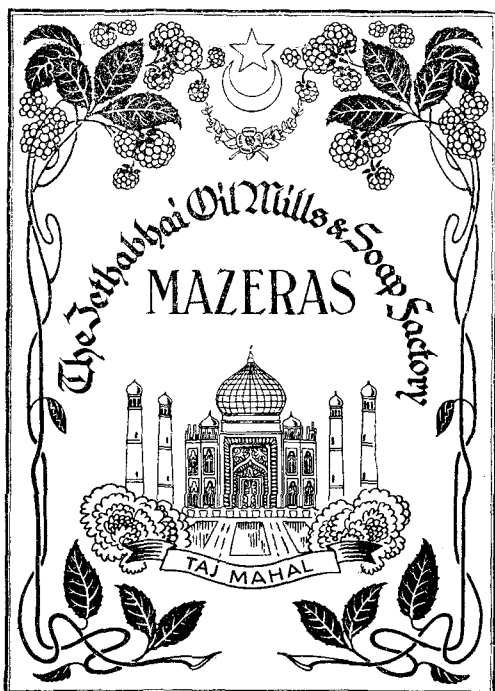
