IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Townships Ordinance (Chapter 82 of the Revised Edition), I do hereby declare the area in the Kisumu-Londiani District

described in the Schedule hereto to be a Township for the purposes of the said Ordinance and to be named "Kibigori"

SCHEDULE.

Commencing at a beacon on the southern 100-foot zone of the Kenya and Uganda Railway at a point due south of the most south-easterly corner of L.O. No. 1588;

thence by that zone easterly to where it intersects the western boundary of Kibigori Station Reserve;

thence by a part of the western boundary and the whole of the southern boundary and part of the eastern boundary of the latter Reserve to where it intersects the southern boundary of the railway zone;

thence in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of 3,500 feet approximately by that zone to a beacon;

thence southerly bearing 180° 58′ 38″ for approximately 1,372 feet to a beacon;

thence south-westerly bearing 254° 13' 10'' for approximately 2,556 feet to a beacon;

thence north-westerly bearing 301° 10′ 20″ for approximately 4,455 feet to a beacon:

thence northerly bearing 0° 58' 58" for approximately 1,500 feet to the point of commencement.

The foregoing boundaries are more particularly delineated, edged red, on Land Survey Boundary Plan No. 35 deposited at the Land Surveys Office, Nairobi, a copy of which is on record at the Senior Commissioner's Office, Nyanza.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish, or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area, to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance:—

RINDERPEST.

That portion of Eldoret Township Reserve commencing at the point mile 124/24 on the Kenya and Uganda Railway line; thence in a southerly direction to the Sosiani River; thence following the Sosiani River to its junction with the western boundary of the Eldoret Township Reserve; thence following the western boundary of the Eldoret Township Reserve in a northerly direction to mile 124/24 on the Kenya and Uganda Railway line, the point of commencement.

Trypanosomiasis

Farm L.O. No. 2323, Messrs. Evans Bros., Lumbwa, Kisumu-Londiani District.

THE ARMS AND AMMUNITION ORDINANCE, 1925.

Rules. is I a second IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 28 of the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased on to make the following Rules:-

- 1. (1) These Rules may be cited as the Arms and Ammunition Rules, 1927."
 - (2) In these Rules, unless a contrary intention appears—
- "the Ordinance" means the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance, 1925, as amended by the Arms and Ammunition (Amendment) Ordinance, 1926;
- "District Commissioner" includes an Assistant District Commissioner and any other person appointed by the Governor to perform any of the duties herein prescribed.

EXPORT LICENCES.

- 2. (1) Licences for the export of firearms or ammunition to a place in a prohibited area or zone shall only be granted by a District Commissioner.
- (2) Such licences shall not be granted without the sanction of the Governor except where the firearms and ammunition appear to be bona fide required for the personal defence of the exporter or for his own use in hunting.
- 3. (1) No licence is required for the export of shot-guns or ammunition for shot-guns to a place not in a prohibited area or zone.
- (2) Licences for the export of other firearms or ammunition to a place not in a prohibited area or zone may be granted as by the Commissioner of Police, any Customs Collector or all District Commissioner.
- (3) Every such licence shall be in the form "A" contained in the Schedule hereto.

IMPORT LICENCES AND PUBLIC WAREHOUSES.

4. (1) Firearms and ammunition bona fide required by an individual for purposes of self defence or for his own use in hunting may on the permit of a Customs Collector be brought into the Colony at any of the ports and places set forth below and be deposited in the public warehouse at such port or place without licence.

For the purposes of the Ordinance and these Rules the Customs warehouses at the following ports and places shall be public warehouses :-

Mombasa.

Malindi,

Kilindini,

Kilifi.

Vanga,

Lamu,

Takaungu,

Kisumu,

sa sobolololo Nairobi.

- (2) The public warehouses set forth in sub-rule (1) shall be under the general control and management of the Commissioner of Customs. Each warehouse shall be in charge of a Customs officer designated by the Commissioner of Customs.
- (3) Firearms and ammunition bona fide required by an individual for purposes of self defence or for his own use in hunting may be brought into the Colony overland from a contiguous territory provided that such firearms and ammunition are deposited in any of the District Commissioners' offices, which offices shall for the purposes of the Ordinance and these Rules be public warehouses, as follows:—

From Tanganyika Territory:-

Kwale,

Voi.

Kajiado,

Narok,

Kisii.

From the Uganda Protectorate:-

Kakamega,

Kitale.

Kacheliba.

From Abyssinia:-

Labur,

Moyale.

From Italian Somaliland:-

Gurreh.

Wajir,

Sankuri.

- (4) No other arms or ammunition will be permitted to be brought into the Colony unless a licence from the Governor to import them has been previously obtained. Such licence shall be in the form "A.A." in the Schedule hereto.
- (5) No person shall import into the Colony any rifle with a bore of .303, unless such rifle has been previously registered under these Rules, without the express sanction of the Governor.
- 6. (1) Subject to any conditions which may be imposed the owner of arms deposited in a public warehouse or his agent or servant shall have access thereto for the purpose of cleaning.
- (2) The following rents shall be paid for the storage of arms and ammunition in a public warehouse:

In respect of the public warehouses set forth in sub-rule (1) of rule 4 hereof the charges for the time being authorised by any Customs Ordinance or Regulations thereunder.

In respect of the public warehouses set forth in sub-rule (3) of rule 4 hereof-

> For every case or box of ammunition per week or part of a week ... 10 cents.

For every firearm, per week or part

of a week 25 cents. . . .

Special charges may be made for packages or cases of abnormal size and for arms of war.

Provided that no rent shall be charged for the first day of deposit, or if such is a Sunday or public holiday, for the second day of deposit.

- (3) A permit for the withdrawal shall not be granted until all charges have been paid and if any such charges are in arrear for a period of six months the arms or ammunition may be sold or destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Commissioner of Customs or District Commissioner, as the case may be, shall direct.
- 7. (1) A person who deposits any arms or ammunition in a public warehouse, whether on first importation or on transfer from another warehouse, shall be given a receipt for the same and shall, within seven days of such deposit, fill in correctly and sign and deliver to the District Commissioner of the district in which the warehouse is situate an application for registration in form "B" in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) The District Commissioner shall then register the arms and ammunition in a book in the form "C" in the Schedule hereto.
- (3) The District Commissioner may extend the time within which application for registration is to be made, and may allow the application to be made by an agent of the owner.
- 8. (1) Every arm which, in the opinion of the District Commissioner of the district in which the warehouse is situate, is not sufficiently marked so as to be easily identified shall, before registration, be stamped with a distinctive letter as mentoned below appropriate to the ports and places of entry and a serial number.

- 9. (1) The form of permit for withdrawal from a public warehouse shall be in the form "D" in the Schedule hereto-
- (2) No permit for withdrawal of arms or ammunition from a public warehouse shall be granted, except for the purpose of transfer to another public warehouse or to a private warehouse, unless an arms licence is produced authorising the applicant for withdrawal to possess such arms and ammunition.
- (3) Permits to withdraw arms or ammunition from a public warehouse shall only be issued by the District Commissioner of the district in which the warehouse is situated.
- (4) No permit for the withdrawal of arms or ammunition appearing to be intended for use for warlike purposes shall be granted without the sanction of the Governor.

between S REGISTRATION OF ARMS ALREADY IN COLONY.

- 10. (1) Every person having any arms or ammunition in his possession at the commencement of the Ordinance shall within three months from the commencement of these Rules produce them to the District Commissioner of the district in which he resides for registration and marking pursuant to section 11 of the Ordinance. The District Commissioner may dispense with the production of any arms or ammunition where he is satisfied that correct and sufficient particulars have been given to him
- of all arms or ammunition so produced or of which the production is dispensed with in a register in the from "E" in the Schedule hereto, and shall, before registration, cause any arm which, in his opinion, is not sufficiently marked so as to be easily identified to be stamped with the letter or letters appropriate in his district as mentioned below and with a serial number:—

ARMS LICENCE.

- 11. (1) Arms licences for firearms and ammunition may be issued by a District Commissioner. Every such licence shall be in the form "F" in the Schedule hereto.
- (2) A District Commissioner shall have power to refuse to issue an arms licence to any person without assigning any reason, and shall, as soon as possible, report every such refusal to the Colonial Secretary or to the central office when so established. Such a refusal shall in the case of a non-native be subject to appeal to the Governor.

- (3) When reasonable cause is shown arms licences may be issued to natives for shot-guns and ammunition for shot-guns. Every application for a licence under this sub-rule must be supported by a certificate of competency in the form "G" in the Schedule hereto rendered by the officer in charge of the district police.
- (4) Every District Commissioner may before issuing an arms licence require that the applicant for such licence shall show cause why a licence should be issued to him, and may require the applicant to obtain a certificate of competency in the form "G" in the Schedule hereto rendered by the officer in charge of the district police.
- (5) Every arms licence shall specify the maximum amount of ammunition which the holder is authorised to have in his possession.
- (6) The fee for an arms licence shall be shillings five which shall cover all the arms and ammunition specified in the licence
- (7) Every arms licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December next following the day of issue.
- (8) A servant accompanying his master who holds an arms licence may carry for his master any firearms or ammunition covered by the arms licence.
- (9) The holder of the arms licence may give a written permit for his servant or carrier to carry any firearm or ammunition covered by the arms licence although not accompanied by the holder of the arms licence. But such permit shall not authorise the servant or carrier to use the firearm.
- A District Commissioner if satisfied that it is necessary for safety that any person proposing to travel in the Colony should be accompanied by armed porters or other armed servants may give leave for firearms and ammunition to be supplied to such number of porters or other servants as the District Commissioner may think necessary for the protection of the traveller and his caravan. In such case the leader of the caravan may be granted by the District Commissioner an arms licence in the form "H " in the Schedule hereto which shall specify the number and description of firearms and ammunition which may be supplied to porters and other ser-Such arms licence shall be sufficient authority for porters or other servants up to the number mentioned therein and while actually on the journey described in the licence to carry the firearms and ammunition specified in the licence. The fee for this licence shall be shillings five. Such a licence may be revoked at any time.
- 13. Any District Commissioner may, if he thinks fit. without assigning any reason, revoke any arms licence held by any person in his district. In the event of such revocation a proportional part of the fee paid shall be refunded. Every such revocation shall be reported as soon as possible to the Colonial Secretary or to the central office when so established and, if the licensee is a non-native, shall be subject to appeal to the Governor.
- 14. (1) If any person in possession of any arms or ammunition does not desire to obtain an arms licence to hold it, or if an arms licence to hold it is refused to him, or if any arms licence is revoked, the owner may deposit the arm and ammunition with any administrative officer in charge of a district or in a public or private warehouse until he is able to sell or export them, but so that every such sale and export shall be subject to the provisions of the Ordinance and these Rules.
- (2) Arms and ammunition so deposited shall be entirely at the risk of the owner.

TRADING AND PRIVATE WAREHOUSE.

- 15. A permit for sale or transfer of arms or ammunition shall be in the form "I" in the Schedule hereto. Such permit shall only be issued by a District Commissioner, and shall not be issued unless the intending purchaser or transferee produces arms licences authorising him to hold such arms or ammunition.
- 16. (1) A licence to keep a private warehouse shall be in the form "J" in the Schedule hereto. Such licence may only be issued by the District Commissioner of a district in which the private warehouse is situated, and may be revoked at any time.
- (2) The fee for a licence to keep a private warehouse shall be shillings twenty.
- (3) The forms of register of deposits in and withdrawals from, and of permit for deposit in or withdrawal from a private warehouse, and of application for such a withdrawal shall be in the forms "K," "L," "M" and "N" in the Schedule hereto.
- (4) No permit for the deposit in a private warehouse of any arms or ammunition appearing to be intended for use for warlike purpose shall be granted without the sanction of the Governor.
- (5) Every police officer of or above the rank of European police constable may at any time for the purpose of examining and checking the stocks of arms and ammunition kept in any licensed warehouse and inspecting the records prescribed to be kept by the licensee without warrant enter the premises of such warehouse and require the licensee to produce his records and stock for examination.
- 17. A licence in respect of an arsenal or establishment for the repair of arms pursuant to section 22 of the Ordinance shall be in the form "O" in the Schedule hereto.

CARRIAGE COASTWISE.

- 18. (1) Licences to carry arms or ammunition coastwise pursuant to section 23 of the Ordinance may be granted by the District Commissioner of the district in which the port of shipment is situated.
- (2) Such licences shall not be issued in respect of any arms or ammunition appearing to be intended for warlike purposes without the sanction of the Governor.
- (3) The District Commissioner at the port to which the carrying vessel is proceeding shall be informed of the shipment by telegraph.
- 19. No fee shall be payable for an arms licence in respect of a revolver imported into the Colony by a military or police officer in the service of the Government as such when such revolver is a part of the regular equipment of such officer.

- 5. At a time not less than fourteen days and not more than twenty-eight days before the expiration of the last registration of a mark, the Registrar shall, if no renewal fee has been received, send a notice to the registered proprietor at his registered address in the Form T.M. No. 22.
- 6. If at the date of the expiration of the last registration of a mark the renewal fee has not been paid, the Registrar shall advertise the fact forthwith in the Gazette, and if within three months of such advertisement the renewal fee upon Form T.M. No. 23 together with an additional fee upon Form T.M. No. 24 is received, he may renew the registration without removing the mark from the register.
- 7. Where after three months from such advertisement such fees have not been paid, the Registrar may remove the mark from the register as of the date of the expiration of the last registration, but may upon payment of the renewal fee upon Form T.M. No. 23, together with the additional fee upon the Form T.M. No. 25, restore the mark to the register if satisfied that it is just so to do, and upon such conditions as he may think fit to impose.
