PROCLAMATION.

E. B. DENHAM.



BY His Excellency Edward Brandis Denham, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commanderin-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, in Executive Council.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the words "Agricultural Produce" or "Products" include any article whatever produced or derived from farming operations which the Governor in Council may from time to time by proclamation in the Gazette declare to be Agricultural Produce for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

NOW, THEREFORE, I do hereby in Executive Council declare "Potatoes" to be an Agricultural Produce or Product for the purposes of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

المصد

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish, or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing

disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area, to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

RINDERPEST.

Farm L.O. No. 1834, Mr. D. McG. Bowker, Kitale, Trans Nzoia District.

Contagious Bovine Pleuro-Pneumonia.

Farm L.O. No. 905/1/1/1, Mr. J. Klynsmith, Eldoret, Uasin Gishu District.

SHEEP-POX.

Farms L.O. Nos. 430, 431, 433, 434, 436, 439 and 1155, The Right Honourable Lord Delamere, Soysambu, Elmenteita, Nakuru District. And further I do hereby declare that the following portions of Proclamations are revoked:—

That portion of Proclamation No. 87, dated the 18th day of November, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 3235, Messrs. R. & H. S. Smith, Subukia, Nakuru District, to be an infected area (Trypanosomiasis).

That portion of Proclamation No. 92, dated the 2nd day of December, 1926, declaring Farm L.O. No. 3231, Mr. W. M. Williamson, Marmanet, Subukia, Nakuru District, to be an infected area (Trypanosomiasis).

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Native Hut and Poll Tax (Remission) Rules, 1927."
- 2. Certificates given by collectors under section 10 of the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance (Chapter 51 of the Revised Edition) shall follow as closely as circumstances may permit the form set out in the Schedule to these Rules.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 234.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT ORDINANCE.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by section 10 of the Agricultural Produce Export Ordinance (Chapter 98 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Agricultural Produce Export (Potatoes) Rules, 1927, and shall take effect from the 1st day of July, 1927.
- 2. In these Rules "Potatoes" shall mean the tubers of Solanum tuberosum.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to export or cause or permit to be exported or attempt to export any potatoes, unless and until such potatoes shall have been inspected and certified as fit for export by the inspector at Kilindini Wharf or Mbaraki Pier or at such other place at the Coast as the Director of Agriculture may from time to time prescribe.
- 4. A certificate, hereinafter called an "Exportation Certificate", shall be issued by the inspector to the owner or shipper of a consignment of potatoes which have been inspected and passed as fit for export.
- 5. Any person intending to export any potatoes shall first give notice of such intention to the inspector. Such notice shall be given at least four days before the date of shipment and shall contain all particulars of the consignment including the name of the consignee, name of ship on which consignment is being shipped, destination, and number and weight of packages.

When required to do so by the inspector, the owner or shipper of a consignment shall have such consignment ready for inspection at either of the places mentioned in Rule 3 hereof at least two days before shipment.

- 6. Inspection shall ordinarily be made within seven days of shipment and, if in the opinion of the inspector such is necessary, re-inspection may be made at any subsequent time before shipment.
 - 7. No potatoes shall be passed as fit for export, of which—
 - (a) more than four per cent. by number of the tubers are unripe or greenish in colour;
 - (b) more than four per cent. by number of the tubers are mechanically injured and/or show signs of decay externally;
 - (c) more than two per cent. by number of the tubers are less than one and three-quarter ounces in weight: Provided that no weight limit shall apply in the case of seed potatoes when it is certified to the satisfaction of the inspector that such potatoes are intended for seed purposes; and provided further that each package of seed potatoes shall be clearly marked "For seed purposes" and the exportation certificate shall be similarly endorsed.

- 8. It shall be lawful for the inspector to prohibit the export of potatoes which do not conform to the provisions of Rule 7: provided that he shall have examined the potatoes contained in not less than five per cent. of the packages forming the consignment.
- 9. Potatoes consigned to ports north or east of Kismayu or south of Dar-es Salaam shall be packed in suitable ventilated barrels, wooden crates or other rigid receptacles to the satisfaction of the inspector.
- 10. Each receptacle containing potatoes for which an exportation certificate has been issued in accordance with these Rules shall be branded in red with the letter K within a ring.
- 11. In the event of a consignment not being passed by the inspector for export the consignment shall be removed by the owner or his agent within three days, but after re-grading by the owner or his agent, it may be re-submitted for inspection.
- 12. There shall be payable to the inspector an inspection fee of twenty cents per cwt., calculated on the net weight of the whole consignment submitted for inspection and such fee shall be payable before the exportation certificate is issued.

A similar fee shall be payable for every subsequent inspection of a consignment which was not passed as fit for export when first submitted for inspection.

- 13. The exportation certificate shall be delivered to the owner or shipper of a consignment of potatoes only on the production of the "Shipping Order" or "Bill of Lading" and after payment of any inspection fees due.
- 14. Government or the inspector shall not be liable for any loss or damage sustained in connection with the forwarding or submitting of potatoes for inspection under these Rules nor shall Government or the inspector undertake any responsibility in respect of any certificate which may be issued under these Rules.

THE STAGE PLAYS AND CINEMATOGRAPH EXHIBITIONS ORDINANCE.

THE PUBLIC TRAVEL AND ACCESS ROADS ORDINANCE, 1920.

AND

THE PUBLIC TRAVEL AND ACCESS ROADS (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE, 1924.

NOTICE.

ELGONVIEW-KAPSOYA ROAD.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Public Travel and Access Roads Ordinance, 1920, as amended by Public Travel and Access Roads (Amendment) Ordinance, 1924, it is enacted that whenever it is made to appear to the Governor that requirements exist for the establishment, alteration or cancellation of a line of public travel, or the conversion of a road of access into a line of public travel, the Governor may, by order published in the Gazette, dedicate a line of public travel which shall be clearly described in such order, and from such date of publication such line of public travel shall be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force, and such public road shall be of such width as the Governor shall direct.

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that requirements exist for the cancellation of the public road described in the Schedule hereto.

AND WHEREAS it has been further made to appear to me that requirements exist for the establishment in substitution therefor of the line of public travel described in the said Schedule hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said section, I hereby order that the said public road and the notice gazetting it be hereby cancelled and I hereby further order that the said line of public travel be dedicated as a public road for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and I also direct that such public road shall be 120 feet wide.

The line of public travel hereby dedicated as a public road is that shown coloured red on the plan marked P.W.D. No. 4083 filed at the Head Office of the Public Works Department, Nairobi, and commencing at a point on the Londiani-Eldoret Road at the south-east corner of Elgon View Estate (Eldoret), thence following in a northerly direction the Road Reserve along the eastern boundary of the said estate, thence crossing the Sosiani River one plot to the west of the said boundary, thence following the Road Reserve in Kapsoya Estate between plots 2,334 and 3, and ending where it joins with Second Avenue on the said Estate.

NYASALAND NATIVES EMPLOYED BY GOVERNMENT.

PAYMENT OF HUT TAX IN NYASALAND.

Under a recent enactment in Nyasaland entitled "the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1926," it is provided (section 6 (a)) that:—

- "Where the Hut Tax is not paid by the thirtieth day of September in the year in which it is due and payable the tax shall be at the rate of nine shillings."
- 2. Prior to this enactment, Hut Tax was levied at all times of the year at the rate of Sh. 6, but now, unless the natives concerned remit it in time to reach the collecting authorities not later than the 30th of September their relatives in Nyasaland will be called on to pay the increased tax and much hardship may thereby ensue.
- 3. In view of the foregoing the Treasurer of Nyasaland is anxious that steps shall be taken to inform Nyasaland natives employed in Kenya of the provisions of the new Ordinance, so that any misunderstanding and consequent hardship may be obviated. I am therefore publishing this notice in order that employers of Nyasaland natives may be made aware of the position and able to explain it to their employees.

THE ROADS PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1924.


