PROCLAMATION No. 28.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition) it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Proclamation declare any area to be an infected area; extend, diminish, or otherwise alter the limit of an area declared to be an infected area; declare an infected area to be free from disease; and/or for the purpose of preventing disease prohibit the removal of animals from one district, place or area, to any other district, place or area.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Jovernor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

CONTAGIOUS BOVINE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.

Farms L.O. Nos. 3924, 3925 and 3929, Messrs.A. W. Hemphill and Partners, Mau, Ravine District.

And further I do hereby declare that the following portions of Proclamations are revoked:—

That portion of Proclamation No. 77, dated the 23rd day of September, 1926, declaring that portion of Farm L.O. No. 140 occupied by Mr. C. B. Enslin, Eldoret, Uasin Gishu District, to be an infected area (Contagious Bovine Pleuro-pneumonia).

That portion of Proclamation No. 13, dated the 25th day of February, 1927, declaring that portion of Eldoret Township Reserve, commencing at the point mile 124/24 on the Kenya and Uganda Railway line; thence in a southerly direction to the Sosiani River; thence following the Sosiani River to its junction with the western boundary of the Eldoret Township Reserve; thence following the western boundary of the Eldoret Township Reserve in a northerly direction to mile 124/24 on the Kenya and Uganda Railway line, the point of commencement, to be an infected area (Rinderpest).

## THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE.

#### RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance (Chapter 157 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "the Diseases of Animals (Amendment) Rules, 1927," and shall be read as one with "the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918," hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Rules".
- 2. The following shall be inserted as Rule 26 of the Principal Rules:—
- "26. (1) Any person bringing cattle, camels, horses, mules, donkeys, sheep or goats from the Northern Frontier Province shall be in posession of a permit in writing from the administrative officer of the district from which the stock are moved and shall conduct such animals without undue delay to the Isiolo Veterinary Station by the route prescribed.

The owner or agent in charge of any cattle shall cause the said cattle to be inspected and actively immunised against rinderpest and vaccinated against pleuro-pneumonia or otherwise dealt with as may be considered necessary by the Veterinary authorities at the Isiolo Veterinary Station. The owner or agent shall pay the prescribed fees for these services. The cattle shall be dipped and branded as required before leaving the Veterinary Station, and payment therefor shall be made at the prescribed rate.

- (2) An auction centre shall be established within the Isiolo Veterinary Station which shall be under the direct control of the veterinary officer or stock inspector in charge of the Veterinary Station, hereinafter called "the officer-in-charge," and subject to such general regulations as are contained herein or may from time to time be prescribed by the Chief Veterinary Officer.
- (3) No animals shall be moved from the Isiolo Veterinary Station until a permit in writing shall have been obtained from the officer-in-charge. Such permit will be granted subject to the following conditions—
  - (a) that the owner—
    - (i) if a non-native, either by himself or by his agent, can satisfy the officer-in-charge that he has available in a non-native area grazing of sufficient capacity to accommodate his stock or can produce a permit that he is entitled to graze a specified number of cattle on a commonage or township grazing area; or
    - (ii) if a native of the Colony acting on his own behalf and not as agent for a non-native, can satisfy the officer-in-charge that he is a native resident in a native reserve and can produce a permit in writing from the administrative officer in charge of such native reserve authorising him to take a specified number of animals into such reserve, and
  - (b) that such animals shall have been inspected and inoculated against such disease or diseases as shall be specified from time to time by the Chief Veterinary Officer and shall have been branded according to his instructions:
  - Provided that no permit shall be issued unless the destination is specified and, in the case of cattle owned by a non-native, such cattle are branded with the registered brand of the owner or lessee of the grazing area at destination.
- (4) Nothing in the preceding sub-rule shall prevent an owner or his agent on his behalf from obtaining a permit from the officer-in-charge to take his cattle or other animals—
  - (a) to a bona fide butcher if the officer-in-charge is satisfied that the cattle or other animals are suitable and intended for slaughter;
  - (b) to a specified auction sale: Provided that if the cattle or other animals or any of them are unsold within forty-eight hours after the termination of such auction sale the owner or his agent shall forthwith return such of the cattle or other animals as remain unsold to the Isiolo Veterinary Station unless he shall have obtained a permit under sub-rule 3 (a) of this rule.
- (5) No person shall keep cattle, camels, horses, mules, sheep or goats at any place along the line of movement from Isiolo as specified on his permit for a longer period than forty-eight hours without the permission in writing from the District Commissioner of the district in which he is situated at the moment.
- (6) Every owner of cattle, camels, horses, mules, donkeys, sheep or goats desirous of taking his stock to the Isiolo Veterinary Station shall abide by the following conditions—
  - (a) he will pay the prescribed fees for inoculation of his animals;

(b) on the fulfilment of the veterinary requirements and when the stock are ready for release, grazing fees shall become payable by him at the following rates—

For horses, cattle, camels, mules and donkeys:

- (i) in respect of the first month or part thereof, per head .... ... 50 cents.
- (ii) in respect of the second month or part thereof, per head ... Sh. 2.
- (iii) in respect of the third month or part thereof, per head ... Sh. 3.
- (iv) thereafter the grazing fee to increase at the rate of Sh. 1 per head per month or part of a month.

Provided that no grazing fees will be levied while stock are undergoing inoculation.

The fees chargeable for sheep and goats shall be twenty per cent. of the above rates respectively, for each period.

- (7) For the purposes of this rule the Isiolo Veterinary Station shall include the area bounded as follows:—
  - On the west by the Ndare River, on the south by the northern boundary of the area surveyed into farms, on the east by the Isiolo River, and on the north by the Uaso Nyiro River."
- 3. The Diseases of Animals (Amendment) Rules (No. 1) of 1922, are hereby revoked.

## DIRECTIONS UNDER RULE 259 OF THE BANKRUPTCY RULES, 1927.

WHEREAS by Rule 259 of the Bankruptcy Rules, 1927, the Supreme Court may by general or special directions determine what acts or duties shall be performed by the Official Receiver in person, and in what cases he may discharge his functions through the agency of his clerks or other persons in his regular employ or under his official control.

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Chief Justice and Judges of the Supreme Court of Kenya, hereby direct as follows, namely:—

We direct that the duties and functions of the Official Receiver in connection with proceedings in bankruptcy instituted in the Supreme Court at Mombasa be performed and exercised by the Assistant Registrar-General as from the 2nd day of May, 1927.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Kenya, in regard to the constitution of the Legislative Council thereof.

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Kenya, or other Officer for the time being administering the Government of Our said Colony.

Recites Letters Patent of 11th September, 1920.

WHEREAS by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland bearing date the eleventh day of September, 1920, We did constitute, order, and declare that there should be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief (therein and hereinafter called the Governor) in and over Our Colony of Kenya (therein and hereinafter called the Colony):

AND WHEREAS We did thereby authorise, empower and command the Governor to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenour of Our said Letters Patent and of any Orders in Council relating to the territories formerly known as the East Africa Protectorate, save in so far as any provision of any such Order in Council might be repugnant to any of the provisions of Our said Letters Patent, and of such Commission as might be issued to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as might from time to time be given to him under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council or by Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and to such laws as were then or should thereafter be in force in the Colony:

Recites Instructions of 11th September, 1920. AND WHEREAS certain Instructions bearing date the eleventh day of September, 1920, were issued under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet for the guidance of the Governor or other Officer administering the Government of the Colony, and providing amongst other things for the constitution of the Legislative Council of the Colony:

Recites Additional Instructions of 25th October, 1923.

AND WHEREAS by certain Additional Instructions bearing date the twenty-fifth day of October, 1923, We did further amend the Fifteenth, Nineteenth and Twentieth Clauses of the said Instructions of the eleventh day of September, 1920, as amended by Our Additional Instructions of the eleventh day of February, 1922:

Recites Additional Instructions of 28th December, 1925.

AND WHEREAS by certain Additional Instructions bearing date the twenty-eight day of December, 1925, We did further amend the Fifteenth Clause of the said Instructions of the eleventh day of September, 1920, as amended by Our Additional Instructions of the eleventh day of February, 1922, Our Additional Instructions of the twenty-fifth day of October, 1923, and Our Additional Instructions of the fifteenth day of July, 1925, and did also amend the Sixteenth Clause of the said Instructions of the eleventh day of September, 1920:

AND WHEREAS We are minded to make other provision in regard to the constitution of the said Legislative Council:

NOW, THEREFORE, We do, by these Our Additional Revokes Instructions under Our Sign Manual and Signet, revoke as Nineteenth and from the date hereof the clause which by Our said Additional Instructions of the twenty-eighth day of December, 1925, was Instructions of substituted for the Fifteenth Clause of Our Instructions of 11th 1920 the eleventh day of September, 1920, as amended by Our said amended. Additional Instructions of the eleventh day of February, 1922, the twenty-fifth day of October, 1923, and the fifteenth day of July, 1925, and the clauses which by Our said Additional Instructions of the twenty-fifth day of October, 1923, were substituted for the Nineteenth and Twentieth Clauses of Our Instructions of the eleventh day of September, 1920, as amended by Our Additional Instructions of the eleventh day of February, 1922, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and instead thereof We do direct and enjoin and declare Our will and pleasure as follows:-

ifteenth. Clauses of 1th September,

The Legislative Council of the Colony shall consist Constitution of of the Governor as President, eleven ex officio Members, Council. Nominated Official Members not exceeding nine in number, eleven European Elected Members, Indian Elected Members not exceeding five in number, one Arab Elected Member, and one Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the African community:

the Legislative

Provided that if after a dissolution of the Council less than five persons are elected to be Indian Elected Members, or if at any time the number of Indian Elected Members is less than five, the vacancy or vacancies so arising may be filled by the appointment in the manner hereinafter provided of Nominated Indian Unofficial Members:

Provided further that the appointment of a Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the African community shall be discontinued in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State when it shall appear to us that such appointment is unnecessary:

Provided further that if one of the Nominated Official Members is not specially appointed to represent the interests of the Arab community there shall be a Nominated Unofficial Member to represent such interests.

The Indian and Arab Elected Members of the Legis- Indian and lative Council shall be such fit persons as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of any law enacted for the purpose by the Legislative Council of the Colony. Nominated Unofficial Member to represent the interests of the African community shall be chosen from among the represent Christian Missionaries in Kenya, and shall be appointed by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State. The Nominated Unofficial Member (if Nominated any) of the Council to represent the interests of the Arab Member. community shall be such Arab or other person representing such interests and not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint under the Public Seal. All such Nominated Unofficial Members shall hold their places in the Council during Our pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, but may re-appointed.

Nominated Member to African community.

Arab Unofficial

Nominated Indian Unofficial Members.

Until the termination of one year from the date of these Our Additional Instructions the Nominated Indian Unofficial Members (if any) shall be such fit persons not holding office in the Public Service of the Colony or of the Protectorate of Kenya as the Governor in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State may from time to time appoint by Instrument under the Public Seal. Such Nominated Indian Unofficial Members shall hold their places in the Council during Our pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the termination of one year from the date of these Our Additional Instructions, or of such less period as may, in accordance with any instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, be provided in the Instrument by which they are appointed, or at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment, whichever is the earlier. After the termination of one year as aforesaid the Nominated Indian Unofficial Members (if any) shall be nominated from among those persons whose names are entered on the register in force for the time being of voters for the election of Indian Elected Members prepared in accordance with the provisions of any law enacted for the purpose by the Legislative Council of the Colony and shall be appointed by the Governor by an Instrument under the Public Seal in pursuance of instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State. Such Nominated Indian Unofficial Members appointed after the termination of one year as aforesaid shall hold their places in the Council during Our pleasure and shall in any case vacate their seats at the next dissolution of the Council after their appointment or at the termination of such period as may, in accordance with any instructions from Us through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, be provided in the Instrument by which they are appointed, whichever is the earlier.

Precedence of Members.

III. The Members of the Legislative Council shall take precedence as We may specially assign and, in default thereof, first the ex officio Members in the order in which their respective offices are mentioned in the Sixteenth Clause of Our Instructions of the eleventh day of September, 1920, as amended by Our Additional Instructions of the twenty-eighth day of December, 1925; secondly, the Nominated Official Members, according to the priority of their respective appointments, or if appointed by the same Instrument, according to the order in which they are named therein; thirdly, the European Elected Members in order of date of election, or if elected at the same general election according to the alphabetical order of their names; fourthly, the Indian Elected Members and the Nominated Indian Unofficial Members (if any) in order of date of election or appointment, or if elected or appointed on the same date, according to the alphabetical order of their names; fifthly, the Arab Elected Member; sixthly, the Nominated Unofficial Member representing the interests of the African community and the Nominated Unofficial Member (if any) representing the interests of the 'Arab community according to the priority of their respective appointments.

Term "the Governor" explained. IV. In these Our Additional Instructions the term "the Governor" shall, unless inconsistent with the context, include every person for the time being administering the Government of the Colony.
