A Bill relating to the Execution of Crown Grants and other Disposition of Lands.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “ the Crown Grants Short title.
(Execution) Ordinance, 1927.”

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Crown
Lands Ordinance or the Registration of Titles Ordinance or
5 any Ordinance amending or in substitution for such Ordinances
or either of them all grants, conveyances, leases, licences,
assignments and all other instruments issued under or relating
to the aforesaid Ordinances which are required to be in writing
and signed by the Governor shall be deemed to be duly and
10 validly executed if they are signed by the Commissioner of
Lands and purport to be so signed by order of the Governor.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

It is proposed by this Bill to relieve the Governor of the duty of personally signing grants and other instruments which are issued under the Crown Lands Ordinance and the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The Bill accordingly provides that all such instruments shall be deemed to be duly and validly executed if they are signed by the Commissioner of Lands and purport to be so signed by order of the Governor.

A Bill to Amend the Public Holidays Ordinance.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the Public Holidays (Amendment) Ordinance, 1927," and shall be read as one with the Public Holidays Ordinance (Chapter 30 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance." 5

Amendment of the Schedule to the Principal Ordinance.

2. The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto:—

"The day following Good Friday."

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to give legislative effect to the resolution recently adopted in Legislative Council to the effect that the Schedule to the Public Holidays Ordinance should be so amended as to include the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

And whereas by Government Notice No. 231, dated the 3rd day of July, 1919, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance (Chapter 1 of the Revised Edition), His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to depute the person for the time being holding the office of Chief Veterinary Officer to exercise on his behalf the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers so conferred and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I hereby declare the following farms to be infected areas for the purposes of the said Diseases of Animals Ordinance.

EAST COAST FEVER.

Farm L.O. No. 5643, Mr. S. L. Jenkins, Oleondo Farm, Gilgil, Naivasha District.

Farm L.O. No. 2674, Capt. C. B. P. Fitzgerald, Ol'Oreshet, Nakuru District.
